Exciting Southeast Baptist Church, Is!

I heard about a church in Eastern Oklahoma meeting on two campuses. One is in Prior and the other 44 miles away in Tahlequah. The churches at both locations are pastored by, and preached to every Sunday by the same man, Pastor Rob Pierce. The church in both locations shares the same name; "Exciting Southeast Baptist Church.

I saw many stories about their exciting activities and out reach and about their incredible services with many people coming to Christ and getting baptized (In a silver metal stock watering trough). I remember years ago when we had Eastwood Baptist here in Tulsa (still do) and their pastor Tom Eliff began to call the church "Exciting Eastwood". They were! They sent out dozens of buses to bring in hundreds of kids. They had hundreds saved and baptized almost every year, they gave huge monies to the SBC Cooperative program and Pastor Tom was a dynamic preacher. With that church in mind I wanted to see if something similar was going on out in the sticks, out in sparsely populated small town Oklahoma. I promised myself that if I ever got a free Sunday we would go over and visit.

Well, we finally got to go and, it is! It is "Exciting". In fact, unlike Eastwood here, the people there have the legal name of "Exciting Southeast Baptist Church", and they have earned the their name.

The church is on a country roads just out from some huge

power plants and not far from a creek I used to catch sand bass out of every spring with my kids. It is open country all around dotted lightly with houses.

We pulled into the gravel lot past a sign adorned with some huge, colorful banner. We chose the closer Pryor location where services begin at 10:45 am and it only took about 45 minutes to get there. We learned that Pastor Rob preaches at Tahlequah and 9 am and then dries the 44 miles over to the Pryor location to preach there. He has only been pulled over by troopers once!

Inside the doors you could feel the "excitement". Everyone seemed to be anticipating something big about to happen. The folks were full of joy, lots of laughter, lots of children running around, and lots of big smiles. We were greeted warmly by one and all and it seemed nearly everyone took it upon themselves to be greeters. They were good down home folks and friendly as could be. When they learned that I am a preacher I was accorded the highest respect and treated like royalty.

The children sang a special and then the guitar playing music director began to lead the music, backed by several other instrumentalists and four or five people singing back behind all. We had not heard any of these choruses and I think some may have been written by members. It was a well done song service.

Pastor Pierce arrived late as the morning service he had con-

ducted at 9 had spilled over with many at the altar. The Texas flood had occurred the day before and he had preached some powerful stuff on that tragedy which he now preached to us. It was deeply moving. He was wearing faded jeans and a short sleeve shirt but took his cowboy hat off for the service. He was the Rodeo World Champion Calf Roper just a couple of years ago before being called to preach and his easy manner of preaching and casual dress took nothing away from the anointing God has placed on him. He is one powerful preacher! His affection for his people, and they for him, a lot of ranchers, farmers, and small town folk, was quite apparent.

I learned that some drive from Tulsa to be there every week. They have, praise God, Sunday night services! This being the 4th Weekend, that night they were having preaching followed by homemade ice cream, fireworks, and lots of activities for the family.

A couple of men came over to talk, one of them being responsible for the huge banners out front. He has these made and is putting them up everywhere he can. These were truly brothers in the Lord and we hit it off right away. The same with Pastor Rob as he joined us. He is "real". He is genuine. No pretense. Humble. God's hand is on him.


