Charlie Kirk was assassinated on September 10 as he was speaking on the campus of Utah Valley University in Orem, Utah. His murderer is a very disturbed young man, a Mormon from what appears to have been a nice family. He had become involved romantically with a young man "transitioning" from male to female. His rage towards Charlie apparently stemmed from Charlie's kind, but strong words on the subject of transgenders. There is no such thing.

Charlie was one of our finest Christian preachers and apologists. He was falsely charged with being racist, homophobic, a hater, and a bigot. He was not.


A pastor I know said he was told Charlie said that black people should not be allowed to vote. He fact checked it. Wrong. He said nothing of the sort.

Others claimed he hated various people groups. Go look at how lovingly and kind he spoke to homosexuals, abortionists, and people confused about their gender identity. He represented our Lord with a very gracious spirit. It is powerful to see!

Charlie would set up a tent in a hostile environment, usually on a university campus, and welcome all comers. He would challenge the crowd "Tell me why you disagree with me." He would allow those who vehemently hated him to come to have a microphone to challenge him on any subject. He would offer grace, as one minister put it, by putting down his microphone and allowing his challenger to speak freely. Charlie then would give his proofs and irrefutable facts, always in a kind and affirming way. He would seek to find some common ground as he exhorted all with truth. He repeatedly noted that if we cannot discuss our differences, if we cannot personally engage those with whom we differ, then anger and violence and strife will result.

In all of this he proved to be one of the most effective evangelists and heralds of Christ to ever walk the face of the earth. As our nation is in one of its darkest periods ever, he was a shining light for Christ. We are up to our necks in hate, lies, racism, propaganda, stupidity and ignorance. Our country worships idols and many false gods. Charlie came along as the Daniel of an "excellent spirit" for our generation. In the words of one in the book of Daniel, it was said this of Daniel.

"There is a man in thy kingdom, in whom is the spirit of the holy gods; and in the days of thy father, light and understanding, and wisdom of the gods, was found in him;...Forasmuch as an excellent spirit, and knowledge, and understanding, interpretation of dreams, and showing of hard sentences, and dissolving of doubts, were found in the same Daniel, whom the king named Belteshazzar: now let Daniel be called, and he will show the inter-



pretation." Daniel 5:11-12

Daniel 6:3 repeats that he had "an excellent spirit".

Sadly, he became a litmus test of sorts for the church. Tens of thousands quit their churches on the Monday that followed his death. Why? Because on that Sunday following the death of Christ's martyr, their pastors missed or misjudged the moment entirely and had nothing to say. Nothing. Some of these members posted on social media announcing their departure. Some told me personally.

Charlie's funeral service had hundreds saved in the stadium and thousands around the world. His wife wept and forgave the young man who killed her husband, the father of their two children. It was seen by over a billion people. People mourned his death worldwide with prayer and candlelight vigils every where.

We thank God for his ministry. We are heartbroken at his death. May we have renewed vigor in our service for Christ.
