Welcome to worship! We are so glad you are here. A couple of things to keep in mind:


*An asterisk denotes standing, in body or spirit.

Mission Highlight

The Green Chair Project

Real estate home stagers Jackie Craig and Beth Smoot found that homeowners had too much stuff in their homes—stuff that no one wanted to waste, but was no longer needed. Jackie and Beth were also aware of the thousands of families struggling to move out of homelessness who could not afford furniture and basic household items without assistance. With this in mind, the pair founded The Green Chair Project in 2010 to collect and reuse essential furnishings, benefiting their Wake County neighbors in need. The Green Chair Project is a non-profit organization that collects donated furnishings for individuals transitioning from homelessness, crisis, or disaster. For a small fee, clients working with case managers from over 100 partner agencies can select furniture, linens, cookware, and accessories to outfit their new homes. The Green Chair experience promotes the idea of choice and empowers clients as they begin to rebuild. There are 95,200 Wake County households living below the federal poverty line, who cannot afford essential household needs, such as furnishings for their homes or beds for their children. Since its founding in 2010, The Green Chair Project has helped over 10,000 families start anew. By partnering with referring human services agencies, The Green Chair Project strengthens relationships with its partner agencies, builds new relationships with other prospective agencies, and works with their clients during their personalized shopping experience. The Green Chair Project partners with the Wake County Public School System through the "Sweeter Dreams" program, in which children are referred by school social workers and provided with twin bed frames, box springs, mattresses, sheets, pillows, and blankets. 1 in 30 Wake County Public School Children are sleeping on floors or sharing crowded beds with others and not getting the sleep they need to learn online or at school. In 2024, over 1,700 children received a bed of their own. To date, over 8,000 children have received new beds! The Green Chair Project is on a mission to provide a bed for EVERY child in need! In 2024, 1,142 tons of furniture and household items were donated to The Green Chair Project, reused, and diverted from landfills. Please consider donating your no longer needed household items and furniture. You can help a family in need and the environment simultaneously. The Green Chair Project is working toward a future where every child has a bed and every home is stocked with essentials.

FPC's Mission budget provides funding for the organization's operational needs, and in past years, we've sent volunteers on our FPC Serves Day of Service. In our January 2021 Month of Service, we assembled cleaning buckets for households they serve. In 2023, the FPC Foundation awarded The Green Chair Project a grant for the "Sweeter Dreams' program.

Today in worship, we welcome Rae Marie Czuhai, the CEO of The Green Chair Project.
