

The Barmen Declaration was written in 1934 by a group of Christians seeking to stand against Nazi rule. In the confession. believers are called to return to their faith and allegiance to Jesus Christ, and not to be conformed to an oppressive regime. It is one of the confessions in the Presbyterian Book of Confessions.

The offering is closely tied to the church's calling to serve the poor and to reach out to the community. We offer not just a portion of what we have, but also our entire lives in service to God and God's people.

Our postlude Toccata

today was composed by Craig Philips. This piece is a modern interpretation of "Joy to the World" (see Hymn 134). Phillips' treatment takes the hymn through numerous keys with surprising harmonies and an ever-changing time signature, including alarming meters such as five eight and seven eight. We end on this musical note to remind us of the joy that is coming into the world in the birth of Christ. Overall, the piece truly embodies "heaven and nature"

singing!

Mission Highlight

Raleigh Rescue Mission (RRM)

In Wake County, there are over 6,000 homeless individuals, over 5,000 homeless school children, and more than 99,000 persons in poverty at risk of being homeless. In Raleigh and Wake County, homelessness is increasing 8% each year. You may or may not notice the men, women, and children who are struggling with homelessness. They may be sleeping in their car or on a friend's couch. Perhaps they're living temporarily with their parents, or in a motel room. Maybe they've found emergency shelter. Many who are homeless have experienced trauma, domestic violence, family tragedy, job loss, addiction, or health issues.

Located at 314 E. Hargett Street and founded in 1961, Raleigh Rescue Mission (RRM) is a 501c3 non-profit dedicated to serving the homeless in the community through the love of Christ. For those who need a second chance and are willing to do the work it takes to rebuild their lives, RRM is a place with a long-term purpose and steadfast strategy to break the cycle of poverty and homelessness.

Most clients spend an average of one year under RRM's roof in The New Life Plan, which has six distinct Phases, each building upon the previous. Clients receive basic needs such as shelter, food, clothing, hygiene, and healthcare before moving through a series of programs that include counseling, parenting classes, financial coaching, and vocational training, with the goal of finding permanent employment and housing. The William E. Mangum Children's Development Center offers health and resource referrals for children and families.

Over the last 60 years, more than 750,000 men, women, and children have found shelter, hope, and the love of Christ at Raleigh Rescue Mission. FPC's Mission budget provides annual financial support for RMM's programs. To learn more, visit https://www.raleighrescue.org/.
