WHAT YOU DO:

Gather children in the center of the room to play a game - minute to win it game

TRANSITION TO WORSHIP

- ASK: "What is Worship? (Allow time for children to respond) Worship is honoring
 God and showing him how much you love Him. We can do this by: praying to God,
 singing songs, dancing, reading the Bible, learning about God, and believing in God and
 talking about it. There are so many ways we can worship God. Today we are going to
 worship through music and dancing.
- ASK: "Would anyone like to help lead worship?" Encourage children to come up to the front of the worship area and lead the dances to the songs. (Select up to 4 kids to stand at the front of the worship area facing the screen.)
- **Pray over worship** Take a moment to pray for your time together, something like this, "God we are so excited to worship You. Help us not to be distracted but to be joyful to spend time with You. Give us a heart of worship. In Jesus' name, Amen."
- ROUTE 45: (For worship song without dance moves) SAY: In the Bible, Luke 19:37b says, "The whole crowd of disciples began to praise God with joy. In loud voices they praised him for all the miracles they had seen." Let's praise God with our voices, just like your parents are doing in the main service right now. We can sing and raise our voices with joy. You can stand and sing or close your eyes and listen to the words, whatever is comfortable for you. Be respectful of those around you.
- Play Worship videos.
- SAY: "Thank you for leading our worship today! I love seeing everyone show God how
 much they love Him! Now, let's sit down and watch our TRUE Bible story. Make sure
 you're not distracting your neighbor. We can show God we love Him in this moment by
 learning about Him."
- Teach Bible Story. After teaching, start small groups.

TRANSITION TO BIBLE STORY



BIBLE STORY

WHAT YOU DO:

- Tell the students to grab a bible if they didn't bring one and to gather in the middle
- Read the paragraph below and then read the bible story together
- Ask students to raise their hands if they want to read some of the verses out loud
- Leaders read the verses in **blue**. Assign the purple verses to students to read. If no one wants to read, the leaders should read them- Luke 2:1-7, Luke 2:14, John 14:27, John 16:33, Isaiah 26:3, Psalm 34:14

What you say:

Last week we discussed that we are in the "Advent Season". Does anyone remember what Advent means? Advent is a word that means "coming". Every year, christians all around the world celebrate advent. During advent, we take time to reflect on God's promise to send a savior to the world and how important it is that Jesus was born. Last week we started Advent by learning about Hope. After several generations of heartache and trouble, finally there was a promise of a coming Savior who would save the world. This news brought new hope to the world.

This week we are talking about peace. When the people of God were waiting for this coming savior, they did not think that this savior would come as a baby. They thought he was going to be this mighty warrior. Or perhaps a new king that would turn the world back to God and destroy all of the enemies of God. Instead, this savior was a little baby, born in a stable.

The people of God may not have understood this at the time, that baby, baby Jesus was going to bring a new type of peace to the world. Instead of Jesus coming as a warrior or a powerful king who would destroy all those who were against God, He came as someone who served others and taught about a new way to live. A way which brought peace even in chaos. A peace that comes from loving your enemies instead of hurting them and serving others instead of being selfish.

Jesus taught that in order to have true peace in life, you must trust God and obey Him. He taught that peace does not come from defeating your enemies, or getting back at someone who hurts you or treating people poorly if they are different than you. Peace comes from trusting in the Lord and following His ways. Jesus promised that if we trust in Him, He will give us peace even in the middle of our hardest times.

TRANSITION TO SMALL GROUPS

WHAT YOU DO: Split the children into different small groups either by grade or by gender

Discussion Questions

- What does true peace look like?
- When was a time you had true peace
- What do you need to do to have true peace in your own life?
- How can you share that peace with others?

WHAT YOU DO:

- Find the verse in the Bible you can ask children to find the verse or you can show them how to
 look up the book in the table of contents and turn to that page in the Bible. Next point to the first
 number(chapter) and help children find the chapter in the book by looking for the large number.
 Last, show them the second number (verse) and help them look for the smaller numbers to find
 the verse.
- Ask if anyone would like to read the verse for your small group If no one volunteers, you
 read the verse. (Never force a child to read)
- Start the Bible Verse Activity:
 - Show the students how to find the memory verse.
 - Read the verse together

Allow each student to talk about what this verse means.

- Encourage students to try and say the verse without looking.
- Encourage students to race each other to see who can say the verse the fastest or who can find the verse in the bible the fastest.

REFLECT & PRAY





WHAT YOU DO:

- Ask if anyone in your group would like to pray and ask if any of the kids have any prayer requests.
- Close with the prayer below (after allowing any children to pray if they wanted).
- INCLUDE all of the kids' prayer requests.

WHAT YOU SAY:

"Dear God, thank You for sending your Son, Jesus to us. Thank you that we can have new hope in every situation. Help us to share the hope of Jesus with others this week. Amen.

• PLEASE DO NOT DISMISS YOUR SMALL GROUP until all small groups are done







DISMISSAL:

- Please make sure there is an ADULT LEADER at the door for pickup to receive parents. If the door is open, an adult must be standing at the door.
- Adult leader at the door <u>must check</u> that the stickers from the parent match the student's sticker.
