From the Mind of Pastor Jeff

Peter began to speak to the people: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. (Acts 10:34-35)

These verses are the beginning Peter's mission of bringing the Good News to Gentiles. Earlier in chapter 10, it says that Peter is at the house of Cornelius, a centurion and Gentile, after both men had received visions from the Lord. Cornelius had been told go send for Peter to come to his house. Peter had been shown that what God has made clean, Peter should not profane (Jewish food laws did not apply).



So, at this point in the story, Peter makes a proclamation that God shows no partiality (which was a given in society at the time). Yet Peter takes it further. He goes on to say that all are acceptable to God. In every nation those who fear God and do what it right are acceptable. That even includes the Gentiles, which is outside of the norm at the time. So, there are no boundaries between Jews and Gentiles, related to food, worship, or behavior. There are no longer boundaries based on social and societal norms.

And Peter went on to preach the truth of the scripture and the reality of Jesus raised from the dead. And the Holy Spirit fell on those who heard, and they (Gentiles!) were baptized in the name of Jesus.


The message of Easter changes everything. This is the message that we are called to receive and to share in our lives as Christian people. First, God shows no partiality, and all are acceptable to him. That includes you and me, and those we often wish to exclude. Through the cross and resurrections, sinners are forgiven and set free. And, second, we are set free to share this message with those around us, in what is an ever increasing unchurched and divided world. The resurrection message in Christ is that this gift is for all people. Social and societal boundaries are crossed, and removed, by the love, grace and forgiveness of God in Jesus Christ.

As we move through the season of Easter this year, may we be reminded of what happened to Peter and Cornelius. May we be brought to a fuller understanding and experience of God's love, grace, and forgiveness for all people. May we be transformed to see that God shows no partiality, and through the death and resurrection of Christ, together, we are all made acceptable to him.


