SERVICE OF LIGHT

*INVOCATION AND PASCHAL LITANY

(Begin in Narthex - people face the entrance to the sanctuary.)

Leader: In the name of the Father and of the

■ Son and of the Holy Spirit.

People: Amen.

Leader: Beloved in the Lord, on this most holy night, in which our Lord Jesus

passed over from death to life, we are gathered here in vigil and prayer.

This is the Passover of the Lord in which, by hearing His Word, we

share in His victory over death.

Leader: Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and forever.

People: The beginning and the end.

Leader: He is the Alpha and the Omega.

People: Time and eternity are His, as are the glory and dominion, both now

and forever.

Leader: By His wounds we have healing now and forever.

People: May the light of Christ, who is risen in glory from the dead, scatter all

the darkness of our hearts and minds.

Leader: Let us pray.

Almighty and most merciful God, pour out on us Your abundant blessing, that all who in true faith, share this night in the joyful

celebration of the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ from the dead,

may be filled with Your heavenly benediction. Once we were in darkness, but now we are in the Light, who is Christ our Lord.

People: Amen.

(Christ Candle is carried into the sanctuary.)

Leader: The Light of Christ!

People: Thanks be to God.

(The procession proceeds down the aisle.)

Leader: The Light of Christ!

People: Thanks be to God.

(The Christ Candle arrives at the front.)

Leader: The Light of Christ!

People: Thanks be to God.

Leader: Rejoice now, all you heavenly choirs of angels; rejoice now, all creation;

sound forth, trumpet of salvation, and proclaim the triumph of our King. Rejoice too, all the earth, in the radiance of the light now poured upon you and made brilliant by the brightness of the everlasting King; know that the ancient darkness has been banished. Rejoice, O Church of Christ, clothed in the brightness of this light; let all this house of God ring out with rejoicing, with the praises of all God's faithful people.

*SALUTATION AND PROPER PREFACE

Leader: The Lord be with you. **People:** And also with you.

Leader: Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them to the Lord.

Leader: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **People:** It is right to give Him thanks and praise.

Leader: It is truly good, right, and salutary that we should at all times and in all

out of bondage in Egypt and led them through the Red Sea on dry

ground.

Leader: This is the night when all who believe in Christ are delivered from

bondage to sin and are restored to life and immortality.

People: This is the night when Christ, the Life, arose from the dead.

Leader: The seal of the grave is broken and the morning of the new creation

breaks forth out of night. Oh, how wonderful and beyond all telling is Your mercy toward us, O God, that to redeem a slave You gave Your Son.

People: How holy is this night when all wickedness is put to flight and sin is

washed away.

Leader: How holy is this night when innocence is restored to the fallen and joy

is given to those downcast.

People: How blessed is the night when man is reconciled to God in Christ.

Holy Father, accept now the evening sacrifices of our thanksgiving

and praise.

Leader: Let Christ, the true light and morning star, shine in our hearts, He who

gives light to all creation, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy

Spirit, one God, now and forever.

People: Amen.

(Please be seated.)

SERVICE OF READINGS & THE WORD

Leader: In this most holy night our Savior, Christ the Lord, broke the power of

death and by His resurrection brought life and salvation to all creation.

Let us praise the Lord, for He truly keeps His Word. The sun of

righteousness has dawned upon us who have sat in darkness and in the

shadow of death.

THE CREATIONGenesis 1:1-2:2(CSB)

¹In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. ²Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness covered the surface of the watery depths, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the surface of the waters. ³Then God said, "Let there be light," and there was light. ⁴God saw that the light was good, and God separated the light from the darkness. ⁵God called the light "day," and the darkness he called "night." There was an evening, and there was a morning: one day. ⁶Then God said, "Let there be an expanse between the waters, separating water from water." ⁷So God made the expanse and separated the water under the expanse from the water above the expanse. And it was so. ⁸God called the expanse "sky." Evening came and then morning: the second day. ⁹Then God said, "Let the water under the sky be gathered into one place, and let the dry land appear." And it was so. ¹⁰God called the dry land "earth," and the gathering of the water he called "seas." And God saw that it was good. ¹¹Then God said, "Let the earth produce vegetation: seed-bearing plants and fruit trees on the earth bearing fruit with seed in it according to their kinds." And it was so. ¹²The earth produced vegetation: seed-bearing plants according to their kinds and trees bearing fruit

with seed in it according to their kinds. And God saw that it was good. ¹³Evening came and then morning: the third day. ¹⁴Then God said, "Let there be lights in the expanse of the sky to separate the day from the night. They will serve as signs for seasons and for days and years. ¹⁵They will be lights in the expanse of the sky to provide light on the earth." And it was so. ¹⁶God made the two great lights—the greater light to rule over the day and the lesser light to rule over the night—as well as the stars. ¹⁷God placed them in the expanse of the sky to provide light on the earth, ¹⁸to rule the day and the night, and to separate light from darkness. And God saw that it was good. ¹⁹Evening came and then morning: the fourth day.

²⁰Then God said, "Let the water swarm with living creatures, and let birds fly above the earth across the expanse of the sky." ²¹So God created the large seacreatures and every living creature that moves and swarms in the water, according to their kinds. He also created every winged creature according to its kind. And God saw that it was good. ²²God blessed them: "Be fruitful, multiply, and fill the waters of the seas, and let the birds multiply on the earth." ²³Evening came and then morning: the fifth day. ²⁴Then God said, "Let the earth produce living creatures according to their kinds: livestock, creatures that crawl, and the wildlife of the earth according to their kinds." And it was so. 25 So God made the wildlife of the earth according to their kinds, the livestock according to their kinds, and all the creatures that crawl on the ground according to their kinds. And God saw that it was good. ²⁶Then God said, "Let us make man in our image, according to our likeness. They will rule the fish of the sea, the birds of the sky, the livestock, the whole earth, and the creatures that crawl on the earth." ²⁷So God created man in his own image; he created him in the image of God; he created them male and female. ²⁸God blessed them, and God said to them, "Be fruitful, multiply, fill the earth, and subdue it. Rule the fish of the sea, the birds of the sky, and every creature that crawls on the earth." ²⁹God also said, "Look, I have given you every seed-bearing plant on the surface of the entire earth and every tree whose fruit contains seed. This will be food for you, ³⁰ for all the wildlife of the earth, for every bird of the sky, and for every creature that crawls on the earth—everything having the breath of life in it—I have given every green plant for food." And it was so. ³¹God saw all that he had made, and it was very good indeed. Evening came and then morning: the sixth day. ¹So the heavens and the earth and everything in them were completed. ²On the seventh day God had completed his work that he had done, and he rested on the seventh day from all his work that he had done.


CROSSING THE RED SEA

Exodus 14:10-15:6 (CSB)

¹⁰As Pharaoh approached, the Israelites looked up and there were the Egyptians coming after them! The Israelites were terrified and cried out to the LORD for help. ¹¹They said to Moses, "Is it because there are no graves in Egypt that you have taken us away to die in the wilderness? What have you done to us by bringing us out of Egypt? 12 Isn't this what we told you in Egypt: Leave us alone so that we may serve the Egyptians? It would have been better for us to serve the Egyptians than to die in the wilderness." ¹³But Moses said to the people, "Don't be afraid. Stand firm and see the LORD's salvation that he will accomplish for you today; for the Egyptians you see today, you will never see again. ¹⁴The LORD will fight for you, and you must be quiet." 15 The LORD said to Moses, "Why are you crying out to me? Tell the Israelites to break camp. ¹⁶As for you, lift up your staff, stretch out your hand over the sea, and divide it so that the Israelites can go through the sea on dry ground. ¹⁷As for me, I am going to harden the hearts of the Egyptians so that they will go in after them, and I will receive glory by means of Pharaoh, all his army, and his chariots and horsemen. ¹⁸The Egyptians will know that I am the LORD when I receive glory through Pharaoh, his chariots, and his horsemen." ¹⁹Then the angel of God, who was going in front of the Israelite forces, moved and went behind them. The pillar of cloud moved from in front of them and stood behind them. ²⁰It came between the Egyptian and Israelite forces. There was cloud and darkness, it lit up the night, and neither group came near the other all night long. ²¹Then Moses stretched out his hand over the sea. The LORD drove the sea back with a powerful east wind all that night and turned the sea into dry land. So the waters were divided, ²² and the Israelites went through the sea on dry ground, with the waters like a wall to them on their right and their left.

²³The Egyptians set out in pursuit—all Pharaoh's horses, his chariots, and his horsemen—and went into the sea after them. ²⁴During the morning watch, the LORD looked down at the Egyptian forces from the pillar of fire and cloud, and threw the Egyptian forces into confusion. ²⁵He caused their chariot wheels to swerve, and made them drive with difficulty. "Let's get away from Israel," the Egyptians said, "because the LORD is fighting for them against Egypt!" ²⁶Then the LORD said to Moses, "Stretch out your hand over the sea so that the water may come back on the Egyptians, on their chariots and horsemen." ²⁷So Moses stretched out his hand over the sea, and at daybreak the sea returned to its normal

depth. While the Egyptians were trying to escape from it, the LORD threw them into the sea. ²⁸The water came back and covered the chariots and horsemen, plus the entire army of Pharaoh that had gone after them into the sea. Not even one of them survived. ²⁹But the Israelites had walked through the sea on dry ground, with the waters like a wall to them on their right and their left. ³⁰That day the LORD saved Israel from the power of the Egyptians, and Israel saw the Egyptians dead on the seashore. ³¹When Israel saw the great power that the LORD used against the Egyptians, the people feared the LORD and believed in him and in his servant Moses. ¹Then Moses and the Israelites sang this song to the LORD. They said:

DANIEL IN THE LION'S DEN

Daniel 6:1-27 (CSB)

¹Darius decided to appoint 120 satraps over the kingdom, stationed throughout the realm, ² and over them three administrators, including Daniel. These satraps would be accountable to them so that the king would not be defrauded. ³Daniel distinguished himself above the administrators and satraps because he had an extraordinary spirit, so the king planned to set him over the whole realm. ⁴The administrators and satraps, therefore, kept trying to find a charge against Daniel regarding the kingdom. But they could find no charge or corruption, for he was trustworthy, and no negligence or corruption was found in him. ⁵Then these men said, "We will never find any charge against this Daniel unless we find something against him concerning the law of his God." ⁶So the administrators and satraps went together to the king and said to him, "May King Darius live forever. All the administrators of the kingdom—the prefects, satraps, advisers, and governors have agreed that the king should establish an ordinance and enforce an edict that, for thirty days, anyone who petitions any god or man except you, the king, will be thrown into the lions' den. ⁸Therefore, Your Majesty, establish the edict and sign the document so that, as a law of the Medes and Persians, it is irrevocable and cannot be changed." ⁹So King Darius signed the written edict. ¹⁰When Daniel learned that the document had been signed, he went into his house. The windows in its upstairs room opened toward Jerusalem, and three times a day he got down on his knees, prayed, and gave thanks to his God, just as he had done before. ¹¹Then these men went as a group and found Daniel petitioning and imploring his God. ¹²So they approached the king and asked about his edict: "Didn't you sign an edict that for thirty days any person who petitions any god or man except you, the king, will be thrown into the lions' den?" The king answered, "As a law of the Medes and Persians, the order stands and is irrevocable." ¹³Then they replied to the king, "Daniel, one of the Judean exiles, has ignored you, the king, and the edict you signed, for he prays three times a day."

¹⁴As soon as the king heard this, he was very displeased; he set his mind on rescuing Daniel and made every effort until sundown to deliver him. ¹⁵Then these men went together to the king and said to him, "You know, Your Majesty, that it is a law of the Medes and Persians that no edict or ordinance the king establishes can be changed." ¹⁶So the king gave the order, and they brought Daniel and threw him into the lions' den. The king said to Daniel, "May your God, whom you

continually serve, rescue you!" ¹⁷A stone was brought and placed over the mouth of the den. The king sealed it with his own signet ring and with the signet rings of his nobles, so that nothing in regard to Daniel could be changed. ¹⁸Then the king went to his palace and spent the night fasting. No diversions were brought to him, and he could not sleep. ¹⁹At the first light of dawn the king got up and hurried to the lions' den. ²⁰When he reached the den, he cried out in anguish to Daniel. "Daniel, servant of the living God," the king said, "has your God, whom you continually serve, been able to rescue you from the lions?" ²¹Then Daniel spoke with the king: "May the king live forever. ²²My God sent his angel and shut the lions' mouths; and they haven't harmed me, for I was found innocent before him. And also before you, Your Majesty, I have not done harm." 23 The king was overjoyed and gave orders to take Daniel out of the den. When Daniel was brought up from the den, he was found to be unharmed, for he trusted in his God. ²⁴The king then gave the command, and those men who had maliciously accused Daniel, were brought and thrown into the lions' den—they, their children, and their wives. They had not reached the bottom of the den before the lions overpowered them and crushed all their bones. ²⁵Then King Darius wrote to those of every people, nation, and language who live on the whole earth: "May your prosperity abound. ²⁶I issue a decree that in all my royal dominion, people must tremble in fear before the God of Daniel: For he is the living God, and he endures forever; his kingdom will never be destroyed, and his dominion has no end. ²⁷He rescues and delivers; he performs signs and wonders in the heavens and on the earth, for he has rescued Daniel from the power of the lions."

Let us pray. O God, Your Son protected faithful Daniel in the lions' den. Leader:

Grant us protection in our time of testing that we would boldly confess

and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

People: Amen.

RESURRECTION MORNING

Mark 16:1-8

The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark the sixteenth chapter. Leader:

Glory to You O Lord. People:

When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they could go and anoint him. ²Very early in the morning, on the first day of the week, they went to the tomb at sunrise. ³They were saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone from the entrance to the tomb for us?" ⁴Looking up, they noticed that the stone—which was very large—had been rolled away. ⁵When they entered the tomb, they saw a young man dressed in a white robe sitting on the right side; they were alarmed. ⁶"Don't be alarmed," he told them. "You are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has risen! He is not here. See the place where they put him. ⁷But go, tell his disciples and Peter, 'He is going ahead of you to Galilee; you will see him there just as he told you.' ⁸They went out and ran from the tomb, because trembling and astonishment overwhelmed them. And they said nothing to anyone, since they were afraid.

People: Praise to You O Christ!

MEDITATION

SERVICE OF BAPTISMAL REMEMBRANCE

Leader: On this holiest of nights, the whole Church of our Lord Jesus Christ

recalls His death and burial, rejoicing with great joy in the Gospel of His glorious and mighty resurrection from the dead. The apostle Paul says:

Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? We were buried therefore with

Him by baptism into death, in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life. For if we have been united with Him in a death like His, we shall certainly be united with Him in a resurrection like His. We know that our old self was crucified with Him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. For one who has died has been set free from sin. Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with Him. We know that Christ being raised from the dead will never die again; death no longer has dominion over Him. For the death He died He died to sin, once for all, but the life He lives He lives to God. So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

Leader:

Let us pray. Almighty and eternal God, according to Your strict judgment You condemned the unbelieving world through the flood, yet according to Your great mercy You preserved believing Noah and his family, eight souls in all. You drowned hard-hearted Pharaoh and all his host in the Red Sea, yet led Your people Israel through the water on dry ground, foreshadowing this washing of Your Holy Baptism. Through the Baptism in the Jordan of Your beloved Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, You sanctified and instituted all waters to be a blessed flood and a lavish washing away of sin.

We pray that You would behold us all according to Your boundless mercy and bless us with true faith by the Holy Spirit, that through this saving flood all sin in us, which has been inherited from Adam and which we ourselves have committed since, would be drowned and die. Grant that we be kept safe and secure in the holy ark of the Christian Church, being separated from the multitude of unbelievers and serving Your name at all times with a fervent spirit and a joyful hope, so that, with all believers in Your promise, we would be declared worthy of eternal life; through Jesus Christ, our Lord.

People: Amen.

Leader: Do you renounce the devil and all his works and all his ways?

People: Yes, I renounce him.

Leader: Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth? **People:** Yes, I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

People: Yes, I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was

conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; He descended into hell; the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence He will come to judge the living and the dead.

Leader: Do you believe in the Holy Spirit?

People: Yes, I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Christian Church, the

communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the

body, and the life everlasting.

Leader: The almighty God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has given

you the new birth through water and of the Spirit and has forgiven you

all your sins, strengthen you with His grace to life + everlasting.


