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The Rev. Dr. Lang Yang



Rev. Dr. Lang Yang was born in Xiengkhouang, Laos. He came to the United States in 1979, when he was 11 years old. He holds a Doctor of Ministry Degree (D.Min.), a Doctor of Biblical Exposition (D.B.E), a Juris Doctor Degree in Law (J.D.), a Master of Divinity degree in Chaplaincy (M.Div.), a Bachelor of Science Degree in Criminal Justice, an Associate in Applied Science Degree in Criminal Justice, and an Associate of Arts Degree in General Education. In 1996, they relocated from North Carolina to Richville, Michigan, and joined St. Michael's Lutheran Church. Dr. Yang has served as President of Txakee Yang, Inc., Loss Prevention Investigator, and the First Hmong

Law Enforcement Officer in North Carolina, Store Manager, English/Hmong Language Interpreter Specialist, and as an ordained member of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS).

Dr. Yang currently serves as a Chaplain at Winter Haven Hospital, part of BayCare Health System. Dr. Yang has served as Associate Pastor and Minister to the Hmong members at St. Michael's (2004-2022), Our Savior Lutheran Church and School in Lansing, and Hmong Mission Outreach with the Michigan District LCMS, which began in 2004 and continued through 2025. Dr. Yang and his wife, Phoua, became members of Grace Lutheran Church and School in November 2025. Dr. Yang graduated on October 22, 2008, from Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, through the Ethnic Immigrant Institute of Theology (EIIT) alternate route to ordination. Dr. Yang has served as President of the Hmong Mission Society in North America since 2012. He served three terms (6 years) as President of the LCMS Hmong Ministry Conference, Alumni Council for Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, and Committee of the LCMS Hmong Hymnal Project. He served as Counselor for the Hmong Lutheran Women's Mission. He also supports the mission work in Thailand through the Hmong International Mission by teaching pastoral candidates, students, and Hmong Ministry leaders, and engaging in outreach to the Hmong people. Dr. Yang is the first Hmong person in America to be appointed as an Officer to serve as a Chaplain (CPT) with the United States Army Reserve. He is certified to teach Strong Bond – Speed of Trust for Soldiers, Families, and Marriages. He also teaches Ask, Care, Escort – Suicide Intervention (ACE-SI). Dr. Yang is the former Great Lakes Region Chaplain for the Civil Air Patrol, a United States Air Force Auxiliary. He is a qualified Mission Chaplain, Ground Team Member (GTM3), Urban Direction Finding (UDF), and Mission Staff Assistant. He had served as Chaplain for the Tuscola County Sheriff's Department Chaplain Corps and Denmark Township, and interprets Hmong into English for the Michigan Secretary of State. He is a certified instructor teaching First Aid/CPR/AED for the American Red Cross. A Certified Church Planter Trainer with Church Dynamic Planter International (CDPI), he is qualified to train individuals in Church Planting Essentials. He is a Certified Instructor for the International Conference of Police Chaplaincy (ICPC). He can teach the courses anywhere in the world.
