



Prayer Guide

Liberty Church is a spirit-empowered church, marked by the presence of God that exists to help people know Jesus in a real way so they can find freedom and walk in their purpose.

Since the beginning of Liberty Church in 1984, we have been known as a **House of Prayer**, and our hearts have been set to be known as a people of prayer. We invite you to join us as we **pray first** in every situation—before the day begins, before you go to bed, before you eat, travel, or make decisions. Prayer should be our **first response**, not our last resort. Understanding prayer is not enough; it needs to become a joyful part of daily life. This prayer guide is designed to help you experience **daily conversation with God**, using Scripture, reflection, and practical application. As you journey through these 21 days, expect God to **speak, guide, and transform** your heart.

Why 21 Days?

If you sense God has more for your life, 21 Days of Prayer is a great place to start believing Him for all that He has for you. As you practice seeking Him first, He will move on your behalf like never before. You will start to see the power of prayer impact your relationships, work, family, and every area of your life.

During these 21 days, we encourage you to:

- Pray before the day begins
- Pray before you go to bed
- Pray before you go to work or school
- Pray before you send that text
- Pray before you eat, drive, or travel
- Pray when good things happen
- Pray before bad things happen
- In every situation — **PRAY FIRST!**

Because prayer changes everything... welcome to the journey. Let's see what God has for us!

Fasting Guidelines

1. Find a time and place to pray daily

Set an appointment with God. This could be 20 minutes or longer, in a chair, a quiet room, or even on the floor, whatever helps you focus without distractions.

2. Make it a heart thing, not a food thing

Prayer and fasting are about drawing near to God, not just giving up something. Rend your heart, not your garments. **(Joel 2:12-13 NLT)**

3. Decide what type of fast to do

Choose a fast that will deepen your hunger for God and help you focus on Him. Here are some examples:

- **Daniel Fast** – abstain from rich foods, sweets, and meat; focus on fruits, vegetables, and water.
- **Juice or liquid fast** – drink only juices or liquids for a period of time.
- **Specific food or meal fast** – give up one meal or a favorite food each day.
- **Social media or screen fast** – step away from phones, social media, TV, or apps to reclaim time with God.
- **Habit or behavior fast** – give up a habit, activity, or mindset that distracts you from God.

Choose one or combine them; Remember: it's not the absence of food or activity, but the presence of God that transforms.

4. Put to death the flesh

Fasting is also a spiritual discipline: a way to resist sinful impulses and rely fully on the Spirit. **(Romans 8:13 NLT)**

5. Know your objectives and expect results

Pray with clarity and faith. What do you hope to see God do in these 21 days? Expect Him to speak, guide, and transform your life.

(Isaiah 58:8-9 NLT)

Practical Tips for Your 21 Days

1. **Set a specific time and place** for prayer each day.
 2. **Use this guide daily:** Scripture reading → Reflection → Personal Prayer → Corporate Prayer.
 3. **Journal your thoughts** and God's revelations.
 4. **Expect God to speak** and respond in obedience.
 5. **Stay consistent**, even if it's hard; spiritual disciplines deepen your intimacy with God.

- For God to raise your awareness of how He can use you to advance His Kingdom in 2026.

 - **Corporate Prayer Points** – align your prayers with the heart of Liberty Church.

Model Prayer: The Lord’s Prayer

Jesus taught us to pray:

Our Father in Heaven, hallowed be Your Name. Your Kingdom come. Your will be done on earth as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. And do not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one. For Yours is the Kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen.

(Matthew 6:9-13 NLT)

Use this as a framework to guide your conversations with God, connecting relationally and spiritually each day.

WEEK 1: IMMERSE — WALK IN HIS POWER, LIVE BY HIS SPIRIT

 *Theme Focus:*

When you gave your life to Jesus, His Spirit came to live in you. But to *walk* in the Spirit means we intentionally allow Him to lead, empower, and transform us every day. This week, we’ll focus on what it means to be filled, led, and changed by the Holy Spirit, the One who empowers us to live this life of faith.

Day 1: Fresh Fire

Scriptures:

*Do not stifle the Holy Spirit. **1 Thessalonians 5:19 (NLT)***

*But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. And you will be my witnesses... **Acts 1:8 (NLT)***

Reflection:

Sometimes we let the fire of God grow dim through busyness, worry, or distraction. But the Holy Spirit wants to ignite a fresh passion within you... one that fuels your worship, your words, and your witness. Ask Him to rekindle your heart. You're not waiting for power; the power is already living inside you.

Personal Prayer:

Holy Spirit, breathe new life into me today. Rekindle passion for Your presence. Restore the joy of my salvation and set my heart ablaze again.

Corporate Prayer Focus:

Pray for a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit over Liberty Church, that every member would experience His power in a new and personal way.

Day 2: Lead Me, Lord

Scriptures:

*When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all truth.
John 16:13 (NLT)*

*Let the Holy Spirit guide your lives. Then you won't be doing what your sinful nature craves. **Galatians 5:16 (NLT)***

Reflection:

Being led by the Spirit means we don't rely on our feelings or understanding; we follow His gentle voice. Sometimes He'll whisper through Scripture, other times through peace in your heart. As you fast and pray, learn to recognize His voice and trust His direction.

Personal Prayer:

Lord, help me be sensitive to Your voice. Quiet every distraction and lead me in paths of righteousness for Your name's sake.

Corporate Prayer Focus:

Pray for wisdom and clarity for our pastors and leaders as they guide Liberty Church into the next season.

Day 3: Power to Overcome**Scriptures:**

The Spirit who lives in you is greater than the spirit who lives in the world. 1 John 4:4 (NLT)

*Not by might, nor by power, but by my Spirit, says the Lord.
Zechariah 4:6 (NLT)*

Reflection:

The Holy Spirit gives you strength to stand when life gets heavy. You don't fight battles alone; His power within you enables you to overcome temptation, fear, and discouragement. The same Spirit that raised Jesus from the dead lives in you!

Personal Prayer:

Father, thank You that I am not alone in my struggles. Fill me with Your Spirit's power to overcome every obstacle in my path.

Corporate Prayer Focus:

Pray for families in our church who are believing for breakthrough to experience healing, restoration, and hope in every home.

Day 4: Spirit of Truth**Scriptures:**

When the Spirit of truth comes, He will guide you into all truth.

John 16:13 (NLT)

Your word is a lamp to guide my feet and a light for my path.

Psalms 119:105 (NLT)

Reflection:

The world offers opinions; God offers truth. The Holy Spirit helps us discern between the two as He reveals the truth of God's Word and helps us live it out. Ask Him today to expose lies you've believed and replace them with His truth.

Personal Prayer:

Spirit of Truth, help me see things the way You do. Remove confusion, bring clarity, and lead me in wisdom and understanding.

Corporate Prayer Focus:

Pray for students and young adults to be grounded in God's truth and stand strong against cultural confusion.

Day 5: Fruit That Lasts

Scripture:

The Holy Spirit produces this kind of fruit in our lives: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

Galatians 5:22–23 (NLT)

Reflection:

When you're filled with the Holy Spirit, it shows, not through hype, but through fruit. The fruit of the Spirit is the evidence of God's work in you. Let Him cultivate these qualities in your relationships, words, and daily life.

Personal Prayer:

Lord, grow Your fruit in me. Help me respond with kindness, walk in peace, and love others the way You've loved me.

Corporate Prayer Focus:

Pray that Liberty Church would be known for the fruit of the Spirit; a church marked by love, unity, and joy.

Day 6: A New Mindset

Scriptures:

Let the Spirit renew your thoughts and attitudes.

Ephesians 4:23 (NLT)

*So letting your sinful nature control your mind leads to death. But letting the Spirit control your mind leads to life and peace. **Romans 8:6 (NLT)***

Reflection:

Transformation begins in the mind. The Holy Spirit renews your thoughts and shifts your perspective to align with God's truth. As you fast, be intentional about what you feed your mind in media, conversations, and self-talk.

Personal Prayer:

Holy Spirit, renew my mind. Replace worry with peace, doubt with faith, and negativity with Your truth.

Corporate Prayer Focus:

Pray for mental and emotional healing in our church family, for freedom from anxiety, depression, and fear.

Day 7: Live by the Spirit**Scripture:**

*Since we are living by the Spirit, let us follow the Spirit's leading in every part of our lives. **Galatians 5:25 (NLT)***

Reflection:

The goal isn't just to have moments with God, it's to live every moment *with* God. Living by the Spirit means your daily life becomes worship: how you speak, serve, love, and obey. He's not just part of your life; He *is* your life.

Personal Prayer:

Lord, I surrender every part of my life to You. Lead me in every decision, every word, and every step I take. Help me live by Your Spirit today and every day.

Corporate Prayer Focus:

Pray for our Sunday services that hearts would be open, worship would be powerful, and many would experience the presence of God.

WEEK 2: WALK IN HIS POWER (Luke & Acts)

 *Theme Focus:*

When Jesus promised the Holy Spirit, He wasn't offering a symbol or a feeling He was promising power. This week, we will learn to walk in that power, not by might, not by human effort, but by His Spirit.

DAY 8: Power from On High

Scriptures:

I will send the Holy Spirit, just as my Father promised. But stay here in the city until the Holy Spirit comes and fills you with power from heaven.

Luke 24:49 (NLT)

But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. And you will be my witnesses, telling people about me everywhere—in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.

Acts 1:8 (NLT)

*It is not by force nor by strength, but by my Spirit, says the LORD of Heaven's Armies. **Zechariah 4:6 (NLT)***

Reflection:

Jesus told His followers to wait for “power from heaven.” That power wasn't for fame, but for purpose. The Holy Spirit enables ordinary people

to do extraordinary things for God. You don't have to strive for strength, simply receive what He's already made available.

Personal Prayer:

Lord, fill me with Your Spirit today. Help me to walk in Your power, not my own. Use my life to point others to You.

Corporate Prayer Focus:

Pray that Liberty Church would be known as a Spirit-empowered house full of bold witnesses, miracles, and hearts set on mission.

DAY 9: Boldness in the Spirit

Scriptures:

*And now, O Lord, hear their threats, and give us, your servants, great boldness in preaching your word. Stretch out your hand with healing power; may miraculous signs and wonders be done through the name of your holy servant Jesus." After this prayer, the meeting place shook, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit. Then they preached the word of God with boldness. **Acts 4:29–31 (NLT)***

Ask God to give me the right words so I can boldly explain God's mysterious plan that the Good News is for Jews and Gentiles alike. I am in chains now, still preaching this message as God's ambassador. So pray that I will keep on speaking boldly for him, as I should.

Ephesians 6:19–20 (NLT)

*For God has not given us a spirit of fear and timidity, but of power, love, and self-discipline. **2 Timothy 1:7 (NLT)***

Reflection:

When the early church prayed, the room shook and they were filled with boldness. The Spirit doesn't make us timid; He gives us courage to speak the truth in love. When you're filled with the Spirit, fear loses its grip.

Personal Prayer:

Holy Spirit, give me boldness to speak and live my faith with confidence. Let courage rise where fear once lived.

Corporate Prayer Focus:

Pray for Pastor Preston and Paige that God would give them boldness and divine direction to lead our church fearlessly into this new year and next season.

DAY 10: Power for Purpose

Scriptures:

But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you. And you will be my witnesses, telling people about me everywhere—in Jerusalem, throughout Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.

Acts 1:8 (NLT)

One day Jesus called together his twelve disciples and gave them power and authority to cast out all demons and to heal all diseases. Then he sent them out to tell everyone about the Kingdom of God and to heal the sick.

Luke 9:1–2 (NLT)

*I pray that God, the source of hope, will fill you completely with joy and peace because you trust in him. Then you will overflow with confident hope through the power of the Holy Spirit. **Romans 15:13 (NLT)***

Reflection:

Power without purpose leads to pride. But Spirit-filled power always leads to service; to heal, to help, to bring hope. You've been empowered not just to survive, but to serve.

Personal Prayer:

Lord, help me to use the gifts You've given for Your glory. Let my life be a vessel of Your power and compassion.

Corporate Prayer Focus:

Pray that Liberty Church would operate in Spirit-led power; seeing lives transformed, families restored, and the community reached.

DAY 11: The Spirit Who Helps

Scriptures:

*But when the Father sends the Advocate as my representative—that is, the Holy Spirit—he will teach you everything and will remind you of everything I have told you. **John 14:26 (NLT)***

*And the Holy Spirit helps us in our weakness. For example, we don't know what God wants us to pray for. But the Holy Spirit prays for us with groanings that cannot be expressed in words. And the Father who knows all hearts knows what the Spirit is saying, for the Spirit pleads for us believers in harmony with God's own will. **Romans 8:26–27 (NLT)***

*And when you are brought to trial in the synagogues and before rulers and authorities, don't worry about how to defend yourself or what to say, for the Holy Spirit will teach you at that time what needs to be said. **Luke 12:11–12 (NLT)***

Reflection:

The Holy Spirit isn't just your source of power, He's your Helper. When you don't know what to pray, He intercedes. When you don't know what to say, He gives words. You're never left to figure life out alone.

Personal Prayer:

Holy Spirit, thank You for being my Helper. Teach me to rely on You more and on myself less.

Corporate Prayer Focus:

Pray that our Liberty prayer teams, small groups, and leaders would listen closely to the Spirit's voice and minister with wisdom and grace.

DAY 12: Overflowing Life**Scriptures:**

Anyone who is thirsty may come to me! Anyone who believes in me may come and drink! For the Scriptures declare, 'Rivers of living water will flow from his heart.'

John 7:37–38 (NLT)

When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place. And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance.

Acts 2:1–4 (ESV)

Since we are living by the Spirit, let us follow the Spirit's leading in every part of our lives. Galatians 5:25 (NLT)

Reflection:

When the Holy Spirit fills you, His presence overflows in peace, love, and joy. You can't give what you don't have, so stay filled daily. An overflowing life is one that draws others to the source.

Personal Prayer:

Lord, fill me until I overflow with Your Spirit. Let Your joy and love flow through me everywhere I go.

Corporate Prayer Focus:

Pray that Liberty Church would be a fountain of living water in our community refreshing those who are weary and pointing them to Jesus.

DAY 13: Unity in the Spirit

Scriptures:

All the believers devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching, and to fellowship, and to sharing in meals (including the Lord's Supper), and to prayer. A deep sense of awe came over them all, and the apostles performed many miraculous signs and wonders. And all the believers met together in one place and shared everything they had. **Acts 2:42–44 (NLT)**

Make every effort to keep yourselves united in the Spirit, binding yourselves together with peace. For there is one body and one Spirit, just as you have been called to one glorious hope for the future. **Ephesians 4:2–4 (NLT)**

Is there any encouragement from belonging to Christ? Any comfort from his love? Any fellowship together in the Spirit? Are your hearts tender and compassionate? Then make me truly happy by agreeing wholeheartedly with each other, loving one another, and working together with one mind and purpose. **Philippians 2:1–2 (NLT)**

Reflection:

The power of the early church wasn't just in miracles it was in unity. They prayed, ate, and lived together in harmony. The Spirit unites hearts that might otherwise divide.

Personal Prayer:

Holy Spirit, heal division and strengthen our unity. Help me be a peacemaker in every area of my life.

Corporate Prayer Focus:

Pray for Liberty's ministries to serve with one heart and vision walking together in unity and love.

DAY 14: Carriers of His Presence**Scriptures:**

The apostles were performing many miraculous signs and wonders among the people. As a result of the apostles' work, sick people were brought out into the streets on beds and mats so that Peter's shadow might fall across some of them as he went by. Crowds came from the villages around Jerusalem, bringing their sick and those possessed by evil spirits, and they were all healed. Acts 5:12, 15-16 (NLT)

We now have this light shining in our hearts, but we ourselves are like fragile clay jars containing this great treasure. This makes it clear that our great power is from God, not from ourselves. 2 Corinthians 4:7 (NLT)

So if you sinful people know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him. Luke 11:13 (NLT)

Reflection:

You carry the presence of God wherever you go. His Spirit lives inside you, not just to comfort, but to release His power into every environment. Which means when you show up, light enters the darkness.

Personal Prayer:

Lord, make me aware of Your presence in me today. Let Your Spirit shine through my words, my actions, and my attitude.

Corporate Prayer Focus:

Pray that Liberty Church would walk in a tangible awareness of God's presence... that people would encounter Jesus the moment they step onto our campus.

WEEK 3: LIVE BY HIS SPIRIT (Acts)

Theme Focus:

As we conclude 21 Days of Prayer and Fasting, our goal isn't just to experience the Spirit; it's to *live* by the Spirit every day. The early church didn't move unless the Spirit led. They depended on Him for direction, courage, and power. This week, we'll learn what it looks like to make the Holy Spirit our daily companion in every conversation, decision, and moment.

DAY 15: Led by the Spirit

Scriptures:

While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, "Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called

*them.” Then after fasting and praying they laid their hands on them and sent them off. **Acts 13:2–4 (ESV)***

For all who are led by the Spirit of God are children of God.
Romans 8:14 (NLT)

*Since we are living by the Spirit, let us follow the Spirit’s leading in every part of our lives. **Galatians 5:25 (NLT)***

Reflection:

The Holy Spirit is not a distant force, He’s a personal guide. When the church in Antioch prayed and fasted, the Spirit said, “Set apart Barnabas and Saul.” God still speaks that clearly to us today. Living by the Spirit means staying sensitive to His direction, even when the path is uncertain.

Personal Prayer:

Holy Spirit, lead me today. Help me to recognize Your voice and follow without hesitation.

Corporate Prayer Focus:

Pray that Liberty Church would be led by the Spirit in every decision; that our vision, ministry, and outreach would align with His direction.

DAY 16: Spirit of Truth

Scriptures:

*When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. **John 16:13 (ESV)***

Lead me by your truth and teach me, for you are the God who saves me. All day long I put my hope in you. Psalm 25:5 (NLT)

Reflection:

The Spirit leads us into truth not confusion or compromise. In a world filled with noise and deception, He's the One who grounds us in what's real. Truth brings freedom, and freedom brings clarity. When you walk in truth, you walk in peace.

Personal Prayer:

Spirit of Truth, help me to see clearly. Reveal anything in my life that's out of alignment with Your Word.

Corporate Prayer Focus:

Pray for Liberty's leaders, pastors, and teachers to speak truth with boldness and grace rooted in Scripture and guided by the Spirit.

DAY 17: The Spirit of Freedom

Scriptures:

Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. 2 Corinthians 3:17 (NIV)

About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them, and suddenly there was a great earthquake, so that the foundations of the prison were shaken. And immediately all the doors were opened, and everyone's bonds were unfastened. Acts 16:25–26 (ESV)

It was for freedom that Christ set us free; therefore keep standing firm and do not be subject again to a yoke of slavery. Galatians 5:1 (NASB)

Reflection:

Where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. When Paul and Silas worshiped in prison, the chains fell off... not just theirs, but everyone's. The Holy Spirit still sets people free from fear, addiction, and spiritual captivity.

Personal Prayer:

Holy Spirit, bring freedom to every area of my life. Break chains of fear, anxiety, and sin. Let Your liberty reign in me.

Corporate Prayer Focus:

Pray for freedom and deliverance across Liberty Church, that every person would experience breakthrough and lasting transformation through the power of the Holy Spirit.

DAY 18: Spirit-Led Relationships**Scriptures:**

*Therefore I, a prisoner for serving the Lord, beg you to lead a life worthy of your calling, for you have been called by God. Always be humble and gentle. Be patient with each other, making allowance for each other's faults because of your love. Make every effort to keep yourselves united in the Spirit, binding yourselves together with peace. **Ephesians 4:1–3 (NLT)***

Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony.

Colossians 3:12–14 (NLT)

Reflection:

When the Spirit leads your relationships, love replaces suspicion, unity replaces offense, and grace replaces gossip. Barnabas stood beside Paul when others were afraid that's what Spirit-led friendship looks like.

Personal Prayer:

Holy Spirit, teach me how to love like You love. Help me be a bridge-builder and encourager to those around me.

Corporate Prayer Focus:

Pray that Liberty Church would be known for its love; a community where people are seen, valued, and restored through healthy, Spirit-filled relationships.

DAY 19: The Spirit Empowers Our Witness**Scriptures:**

*But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect, **1 Peter 3:15 (NIV)***

*In the same way, let your good deeds shine out for all to see, so that everyone will praise your heavenly Father. **Matthew 5:16 (NLT)***

Reflection:

When the Spirit prompted Philip to approach the Ethiopian, he obeyed and a whole life was changed. Evangelism isn't a program; it's a partnership with the Spirit. He opens doors, prepares hearts, and gives us words that bring life.

Personal Prayer:

Lord, make me sensitive to divine opportunities today. Give me boldness and compassion to share Your love wherever I go.

Corporate Prayer Focus:

Pray that Liberty Church would be a bold witness for Christ, that our city would encounter Jesus through our everyday lives and outreach.

DAY 20: Spirit of Generosity

Scriptures:

*All the believers were united in heart and mind. And they felt that what they owned was not their own, so they shared everything they had. The apostles testified powerfully to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and God's great blessing was upon them all. **Acts 4:32–33 (NLT)***

*You must each decide in your heart how much to give. And don't give reluctantly or in response to pressure. "For God loves a person who gives cheerfully." And God will generously provide all you need. Then you will always have everything you need and plenty left over to share with others. **2 Corinthians 9:7–8 (NLT)***

*The generous will prosper; those who refresh others will themselves be refreshed. **Proverbs 11:25 (NLT)***

Reflection:

The Spirit not only empowers you to give... He gives you joy in doing it. The early believers shared everything, and no one lacked. When the Spirit moves, generosity flows. Giving becomes a reflection of the heart of God.

Personal Prayer:

Holy Spirit, make me generous in spirit, time, and resources. Let my giving reflect Your heart.

Corporate Prayer Focus:

Pray that Liberty Church would be known for radical generosity, meeting needs in our church and community through Spirit-led giving.

DAY 21: Keep in Step with the Spirit

Scriptures:

But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law. Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit. **Galatians 5:22–25 (NIV)**

And now, behold, I am going to Jerusalem, constrained by the Spirit, not knowing what will happen to me there, except that the Holy Spirit testifies to me in every city that imprisonment and afflictions await me.

Acts 20:22–24 (ESV)

Remain in me, and I will remain in you. For a branch cannot produce fruit if it is severed from the vine, and you cannot be fruitful unless you remain in me. “Yes, I am the vine; you are the branches. Those who remain in me, and I in them, will produce much fruit. For apart from me you can do nothing.

John 15:4–5 (NLT)

Reflection:

The goal isn't just to experience the Spirit for 21 days; it's to walk with Him every day. The fruit of the Spirit is evidence that His presence

remains. As you stay connected to Him, His life flows through you naturally.

Personal Prayer:

Holy Spirit, help me walk with You daily. Let my life bear fruit that brings glory to God.

Corporate Prayer Focus:

Pray that Liberty Church would continue walking in the Spirit beyond these 21 days... living in His power, producing His fruit, and carrying His presence everywhere we go.

KEEP WALKING IN HIS POWER & LIVING BY HIS SPIRIT

As we come to the end of 21 Days of Prayer and Fasting, remember this:

This wasn't the finish line — it was the starting line.

Over these three weeks, we have sought God together, humbled ourselves, listened for His voice, and welcomed the work of the Holy Spirit in our lives. But the power, clarity, and renewal you've experienced are not meant to last for just 21 days, they're meant to shape the entire year ahead.

The Holy Spirit who walked with you in prayer on Day 1 is the same Spirit who will walk with you tomorrow, next month, and for the rest of your life. His power is not seasonal. His presence is not limited to a devotional window. His guidance, comfort, strength, and voice are available to you *every single day*.

Just like the early church in Acts, **we don't move forward by talent or strategy alone... we move forward by His Spirit.**

Let this be the year that Liberty Church:

- Walks with deeper dependence on the Holy Spirit
- Serves with greater love and unity
- Speaks with greater boldness
- Worships with greater passion
- Reaches our city with greater compassion

The world needs a Spirit-filled church.

Your family needs a Spirit-filled you.

And God has positioned Liberty Church to shine brightly in this season.

So let's keep pressing in.

Let's keep listening.

Let's keep obeying.

Let's keep walking in His power.

Let's keep living by His Spirit.

Because when the Holy Spirit fills His people, *there is no limit to what God can do through us.*
