


Psalms 22, 23, & 24

- Psalm 24: "Lift up your heads O gates that the King of Glory may come in"



The Cycle of Lament

Psalms of lament may contain the following elements in varying order:

- ✓ **Address:** an invocation of God's name
- ✓ **Complaint:** a description of the problem often in the form of a question
- ✓ **Request:** an urgent request for God to do something
- ✓ **Motivation:** a rationale for why God should answer the psalmist's prayer
- ✓ **Confidence:** a statement of trust in God's goodness and sovereignty

5 Elements of Lament:

- Address
- Complaint
- Request
- Motivation
- Confidence

Address/Complaint (1-2)

1 My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? [Matthew 27:46; Mark 15:34]
2 O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer, and by night, but I find no rest.

Remembering the past (3-5)

3 Yet you are holy, enthroned on the praises¹ of Israel. [or dwelling in the praises]
4 In you our fathers trusted; they trusted, and you delivered them.
5 To you they cried and were rescued; in you they trusted and were not put to shame.

Complaint (6-8)

6 But I am a worm and not a man, scorned by mankind and despised by the people.
7 All who see me mock me; they make mouths at me; they wag their heads;
8 "He trusts in the LORD; let him deliver him; [Matthew 27:43]
let him rescue him, for he delights in him!"

Remembering the past (9-10)

9 Yet you are he who took me from the womb; you made me trust you at my mother's breasts.
10 On you was I cast from my birth, and from my mother's womb you have been my God.

Request (11)

11 Be not far from me, for trouble is near, and there is none to help.

Address/Complaint (1-2)

12 Many bulls encompass me; strong bulls of Bashan surround me;
13 they open wide their mouths at me, like a ravening and roaring lion.

Request (19-21)

14 I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint; my heart is like wax; it is melted within my breast;
15 my strength is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue sticks to my jaws; you lay me in the dust of death.
16 For dogs encompass me; a company of evildoers encircles me; they have pierced my hands and feet^{1b}.
17 I can count all my bones— they stare and gloat over me;
18 they divide my garments among them, and for my clothing they cast lots.

19 But you, O LORD, do not be far off! O you my help, come quickly to my aid!

Hebrews 2:10-18

¹⁰ For it was fitting that he, for whom and by whom all things exist, in bringing many sons to glory, should make the founder of their salvation **perfect through suffering**. ¹¹ For he who sanctifies and those who are sanctified all have one source. That is why he is not ashamed to call them brothers, ¹² saying,

"I will tell of your name to my brothers;
in the midst of the congregation I will sing your praise."

¹³ And again, "I will put my trust in him."

And again, "Behold, I and the children God has given me."

¹⁴ Since therefore the children share in flesh and blood, **he himself likewise partook of the same things, that through death he might destroy the one who has the power of death**, that is, the devil, ¹⁵ and deliver all those who through fear of death were subject to lifelong slavery. ¹⁶ For surely it is not angels that he helps, but he helps the offspring of Abraham. ¹⁷ Therefore he had to be made like his brothers in every respect, so that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people. ¹⁸ For because he himself has suffered when **tempted**, he is able to help those who are being tempted.

How can God be both good and all-powerful?

1. God **redeems** suffering

- David's suffering
- Jesus' suffering
- Our suffering
- Suffering precedes glory

Psalm 22 and the Question of Theodicy

2. God is **present** in suffering

- A higher order of being means a higher order of suffering
- "Jesus wept"

The problem of suffering:

"I can't believe in a God who allows..."

How other religions and philosophies deal with this question

- Hinduism – recycle it (reincarnation)
- Buddhism – escape from it (Nirvana)
- Islam – accept it (fate)
- Atheism – avoid it (medicate w/pleasure, sex, drugs, utopianism, nihilism)
- Christianity – endure it **with** God, He will **redeem** it
