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What is Liturgy?

All things should be done decently and in order.

—1 Corinthians 14:40

Liturgy refers to the arrangement of the worship service as directed by the church elders and worship leaders. We invite all to participate through singing and responding at appropriate times.

Palmdale Church follows *the regulative principle of worship*. This historically Reformed approach holds that true worship should include only components expressly prescribed or demonstrated in Scripture and should avoid anything not represented in Scripture. Our formal liturgy provides the structure for intentionality and care necessary to handle our service of worship well and scripturally.

What We Believe

You are to proclaim things consistent with sound teaching.

—Titus 2:1

We believe the 66 books that comprise the Old and New Testaments are the inspired Word of God, the only infallible truth for faith and life. We believe the historic Christian interpretation of the Scriptures directs us in deriving God's intended meaning. The church's authority is established upon and accountable to the Scriptures as God's authoritative Word to his people.

On the basis of the Church and the Scriptures, we affirm the Apostles' Creed as the ecumenical expression of the Christian faith. We also reasonably accept the 2000 Baptist Faith and Message as a contemporary expression of the historic Baptist faith.

Rememberence

READING: Jonah 1

Now the word of the LORD came to Jonah the son of Amittai, saying, “Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and call out against it, for their evil has come up before me.” But Jonah rose to flee to Tarshish from the presence of the LORD. He went down to Joppa and found a ship going to Tarshish. So he paid the fare and went down into it, to go with them to Tarshish, away from the presence of the LORD.

But the LORD hurled a great wind upon the sea, and there was a mighty tempest on the sea, so that the ship threatened to break up. Then the mariners were afraid, and each cried out to his god. And they hurled the cargo that was in the ship into the sea to lighten it for them. But Jonah had gone down into the inner part of the ship and had lain down and was fast asleep. So the captain came and said to him, “What do you mean, you sleeper? Arise, call out to your god! Perhaps the god will give a thought to us, that we may not perish.”

And they said to one another, “Come, let us cast lots, that we may know on whose account this evil has come upon us.” So they cast lots, and the lot fell on Jonah. Then they said to him, “Tell us on whose account this evil has come upon us. What is your occupation? And where do you come from? What is your country? And of what people are you?” And he said to them, “I am a Hebrew, and I fear the LORD, the God of heaven, who made the sea and the dry land.” Then the men were exceedingly afraid and said to him, “What is this that you have done!” For the men knew that he was fleeing from the presence of the LORD, because he had told them.

Then they said to him, “What shall we do to you, that the sea may quiet down for us?” For the sea grew more and more tempestuous. He said to them, “Pick me up and hurl me into the sea; then the sea will quiet down for you, for I know it is because of me that this great tempest has come upon you.” Nevertheless, the men rowed hard to get back to dry land, but they could not, for the sea grew more and more tempestuous against them. Therefore, they called out to the LORD, “O LORD, let us not perish for this man’s life, and lay not on us innocent blood, for you, O LORD, have done as it pleased you.” So they picked up Jonah and hurled him into the sea, and the sea ceased from its raging. Then the men feared the LORD exceedingly, and they offered a sacrifice to the LORD and made vows.

And the LORD appointed a great fish to swallow up Jonah. And Jonah was in the belly of the fish three days and three nights.

You Cannot Run From God

DON’T RUN FROM GOD

If I take the wings of the morning and dwell in the uttermost parts of the sea, even there your hand shall lead me, and your right hand shall hold me.”

Institution of the Lord's Supper

Jesus said to them, "Truly I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life in yourselves. The one who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up on the last day, because my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink. The one who eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me, and I in him. This is the bread that came down from heaven. The one who eats this bread will live forever."

On the night when he was betrayed, as they were eating, the Lord Jesus took bread, blessed and broke it, gave it to the disciples, and said, “Take and eat it; this is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.”

Then he took a cup, and after giving thanks, he said, “Take this and share it among yourselves. Drink from it, all of you. This cup is the blood of the new covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.”

As often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord’s death until he comes.

(Matt 26:26-28, Mark 14:22-24, Luke 22:17-20, John 6:53-58, 1 Cor 11:23-26)

Invitation and Instruction

You are invited to participate in the Lord’s Supper if you acknowledge the truth of Jesus Christ as revealed in the sermon, affirm the truths declared thereafter, have given your life to follow Jesus Christ as King over all, and believe that you will spend eternity with him in the Kingdom of God.

Distribution: Please come forward to receive the elements and return to your seats with them. We will eat and then drink together when instructed.

Distribution of Bread and Wine
