First window on the South wall



The Cross and the Crown: The Cross represents the Risen Christ, and the crown represents supremacy. This figure symbolizes death and heavenly reward - a symbol of life everlasting.

Agnus Dei: The lamb is a sacrificial animal. The scepter denotes royalty. The banner denotes triumph through the cross. Together these symbols represent Jesus, who was sacrificed, but rose triumphant over death to reign eternally.
