Lesson 3: God Saves Noah and His Family

Genesis 9:12-13

[12] And God said, "This is the sign of the covenant that I make between me and you and every living creature that is with you, for all future generations: [13] I have set my bow in the cloud, and it shall be a sign of the covenant between me and the earth.

Covenant: an agreement, usually formal, between two or more persons to do or not do something specified.

Titus 3:5

God saved us,

not because of works done by us in righteousness,

but according to His own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit.

Righteousness: the quality or state of being just or rightful

Regeneration: spiritual renewal or revival

Lesson 4: God Blesses Abraham with Faith

Genesis 15:6

He (Abram) believed the LORD, and He (the Lord) counted it to him as righteousness.

Romans 4:23-25

But the words "it was counted to him" were not written for his sake alone, but for ours also. It will be counted to us who believe in him who raised from the dead Jesus our Lord, who was delivered up for our trespasses and raised for our justification.

Justification: an acceptable reason for doing something: something that justifies an act or way of behaving. The act, process, or state of being justified by God

Trespass: a violation of moral or social ethics

Lesson 5: God Blesses Jacob

Ephesians 4:31-32

Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice.

Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.

Clamor: noisy shouting, a loud continuous noise

Malice: the desire to do harm, evil intent

Lesson 6: God Cares for Joseph

Psalm 23:1, 6

The LORD is my shepherd; I shall not want.

Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the LORD forever.

Lesson 7: God Calls Moses

Colossians 3:16-17

Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God.

Covenant: an agreement, usually formal, between two or more persons to do or not do something specified

Deliverance: an act or instance of delivering. salvation. liberation.

And I will be their God, and they shall be my people.

³⁴And no longer shall each one teach his neighbor and each his brother, saying,

'Know the LORD,' for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, declares the LORD.

For I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more."

Covenant: an agreement, usually formal, between two or more persons to do or not do something specified

Anoint: To rub or sprinkle on; apply an unguent, ointment. To consecrate or make sacred in a ceremony that includes the token applying of oil

Lesson 20: Jesus Teaches Nicodemus

John 3:5-6

⁵Jesus answered,

"Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God.

⁶That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit.

John 3:16

For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son,

that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life.

Memory Work for #21 Lesson 21: Jesus Teaches in Parables

1 John 1:8-9

⁸If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us.

⁹If we confess our sins,

Iniquity: wicked act or thing

Transgression: an act of transgressing; violation of a law, command,

etc.; sin.

Matthew 16:16-18

¹⁶ Simon Peter replied,

"You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

¹⁷ And Jesus answered him,

"Blessed are you, Simon Bar-Jonah!

For flesh and blood has not revealed this to you, but my Father who is in heaven.

¹⁸ And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it.

Simon Bar-Jonah: Aramaic for "Simon son of Jonah"

Prevail: to succeed; become dominant; win out.

Memory Work for #23 Lesson 23: Jesus Raises Lazarus

John 11:25-26

[25] Jesus said, "I am the resurrection and the life. Whoever believes in me, though he die, yet shall he live, [26] and everyone who lives and believes in me shall never die.

Romans 6:23

[23] For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Resurrection: the act of rising from the dead

Eternal: without beginning or end; lasting forever; always existing

Matthew 21:9-11

[9] And the crowds that went before Jesus and that followed Him were shouting, "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the highest!"

this?"

[11] And the crowds said "This is the proph

[27] And He took a cup, and when he had given thanks he gave it to them, saying, "Drink of it, all of you,

[28] for this is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Lesson 27: Jesus is Condemned and Crucified

Romans 5:8-9

- [8] but God shows His love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.
- [9] Since, therefore, we have now been justified by His blood, much more shall we be saved by Him from the wrath of God.

Lesson 28: Jesus Rises from the Dead

Matthew 28:5-7

^[5] But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. ^[6] He is not here, for He has risen, as He said. Come, see the place where he lay. ^[7] Then go quickly and tell His disciples that He has risen from the dead, and behold, He is going before you to Galilee; there you will see Him. See, I have told you."

Lesson 29: Jesus Ascends into Heaven

Acts 1:8-9

[8] But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth."

[9] And when He had said these things, as they were looking on, He was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight.

Lesson 30: Jesus Sends the Holy Spirit

Acts 2:32-33

[32] This Jesus God raised up, and of that we all are witnesses. [33] Being therefore exalted at the right hand of God, and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, He has poured out this that you yourselves are seeing and hearing.
