A Different Look at Christmas – Jesus the Head Crusher Dear St. Paul's.

She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them."

I remember the birth of my sons. It was a scary and joyous day; both Isaac and Micah were born a little early by C-section. Were we ready? Would we be good parents? Do we have enough money? Would we be able to navigate in a world full of sickness, death, trouble, pain, and raise these children into a life worth living?

God has been in the business of child birth and parenting ever since the beginning with Adam and Eve. Cain was born and I am sure Adam and Eve wondered would this be the child who would save us from the first sin. God put Satan on notice of Eve's baby, "And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers, he will crush your head, and you will strike his heel." Would Cain crush Satan's head? Answer: Cain killed Abel! Cain's birthday thus is not Christmas.

Have you ever thought of Christmas as the day of the "Head

Crusher's Birth!" Jesus was not just any baby though He was God in the flesh. Humble God wrapped in a body, wrapped in simple clothes, in a manger, in a lowly stable. In order to crush Satan's head Jesus had to be like us in every way, except that Jesus is perfect! He is God, and from the beginning was on a mission to save us!

During Advent this year please enjoy the extra services. We will have devotional services every Wednesday during December.



Eternal Joy

Christmas is a time filled with joy (and stress). How can we access that joy more consistently? We must start by remembering that joy comes from the Lord. "You make known to me the path of life; in your presences there is fullness of joy; at your right hand are pleasures forevermore." Psalm 16:11 And "May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace

believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope." Romans 15:13. Feeling happy and lighthearted is great, but joy is much deeper. Our happiness can be taken away by the circumstances of our lives, but joy is given by God, and no one can take that away from us.

Easier said than done, right? Where does a person start? Let's first define joy. Joy could be defined as the confidence that no matter what circumstances we may face God is in control (remember He makes known the path of our life Psalm 16:11). Jesus is our example when it comes to joy. He left heaven, suffered sorrow, and torture and death. "He was despised and rejected by men, a

man of sorrows and acquainted with grief and as one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and we esteemed Him not." Isaiah 53:3. Yet we know Jesus was filled with joy. "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and sin which clings so closely, and let us run with endurance the

race set before us, looking to Jesus, the founder and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is seated at the right hand of the throne of God." Hebrews 12:1-2. The source of His joy was winning eternal life for you and me.

There is our joy the ultimate victory over sin death and the devil, and eternal life with our joy filled Savior. Moreover, God is here with us every second of everyday.



Beckendorf Ministry

Greetings once again.

Well, we had such high hopes that by this time we would be asking you to rejoice with us because the Khwedam panoramic Bible had been dedicated and the Khwe were enjoying their new Bible. Unfortunately, that was not to be. A week and a half before the dedication (which should have happened this past Wednesday) the keynote speaker, a person from the government, was called away on business and wasn't be able to attend. Having someone representing the government is important in this kind of situation; it gives official recognition to the people and the language and gives the whole event a great deal of status. Because this is so important, it was decided to -once again -- delay the dedication. As of right now the plan is for an early January dedication. Splash and the Bible Society have actually requested that the President of Botswana be

the keynote speaker -- the President has voiced his support of this kind of project, and he and Splash have talked about our project before -- so the new date will depend on the President's schedule. Of course the delay is frustrating and disappointing, but hopefully if a visit by the President can work out it would be a real honor for the Khwe.

In the meantime Tim had a very productive checking session with the Wayeyi translation team last month, and now is working on the Themne (Sierra Leone) back translation of 1 and 2 Kings, getting ready for his next online meeting with them to continue their consultant check on that book. To prepare for this Tim studies the text in Hebrew, looks at their translation, and makes notes in order to ask questions to clarify what is being communicated in Themne. He really enjoys this work, though I suspect he sometimes misses the personal interaction of working with his own team.

Otherwise, the rains have started!! And there is much rejoicing! Not only is everything finally getting moisture after seven months of no rain, but we are also getting a lovely break in the heat -- such a relief! Of course, once we get a few sunny days it will be hot and muggy instead of hot and dry, but at least then we know we will

be getting another cool break with the next rain. Of course, this rain means that everything is bursting into bloom -- which is wonderful, but for allergy sufferers it can be pretty miserable. Unfortunately, Tim is really allergic to something (or a couple of somethings) so he is having some troubles breathing. He does wear a mask outside and has an inhaler if things get really bad, but he is just pretty uncomfortable.
