Psalms of the Summer | Psalms 46

- 1. How does the concept of God as our 'refuge and strength' apply to modern-day challenges we face? In what ways have you experienced God as your refuge in times of trouble?
- 2. The psalm speaks of not fearing even when the earth gives way. How can we cultivate this level of trust in God amidst global crises or personal calamities?
- 3. What does it mean to you personally to 'be still and know that I am God'? How can we practice this stillness in our busy, often chaotic lives?
- 4. The sermon mentions fear as one of the first responses to sin entering the world. How does the message of Psalm 46 address our deepest fears?
- 5. How does the image of God as the 'Lord of Hosts' or commander of angel armies impact your view of His power and protection?
- 6. In what ways does the gospel connection to Jesus as 'Emmanuel God with us' deepen the meaning of Psalm 46 for Christians today?
- 7. The psalm describes God making wars cease and weapons destroyed. How might this relate to inner conflicts we face, and God's role in bringing peace to our hearts?
- 8. How does the concept of surrendering to God's sovereignty challenge or comfort you in your current life circumstances?
- 9. The sermon mentions unconditional joy because God is with us. How can we maintain joy even when external circumstances are difficult?
- 10. In what ways does the image of a river 'whose streams make glad the city of God' speak to you about the refreshment and life God offers His people?
