

SMALL GROUP GUIDE

The Loving Humility of Christ (John 13:1-17)

Key Takeaways:

- 1. Jesus displayed sacrificial love through His humility in washing the disciples' feet.
- 2. We must accept Christ's humility to be cleansed from sin.
- 3. Christ's humility is an example for us to follow in our own lives.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. What stood out to you most from the message? Why?
- 2. Read John 13:1-5. How does Jesus' act of washing the disciples' feet demonstrate His love? Why do you think this act was so significant?
- 3. Peter initially refused to let Jesus wash his feet. Have you ever struggled to accept help or service from others? Why do you think this can be challenging?
- 4. How does Jesus' statement in verse 8 ("If I do not wash you, you have no share with me") relate to our spiritual cleansing and salvation?
- 5. Discuss the difference between the "bath" of salvation and the ongoing "foot washing" of sanctification. How have you experienced this in your own life?
- 6. Read John 13:12-17. How does Jesus challenge His disciples (and us) to follow His example?
- 7. In what ways do you find it difficult to serve others with humility? What barriers or excuses do you often face?
- 8. How might our relationships and communities change if we consistently practiced Christ-like humility and service?

Practical Applications:

- 1. This week, intentionally look for opportunities to serve others in humble ways. Share your experiences with the group next time.
- 2. Reflect on areas in your life where pride may be hindering your relationships or spiritual growth. Pray for God's help in cultivating humility.
- 3. Practice allowing others to serve you this week. Notice any discomfort and discuss why it might be challenging to receive help.
- 4. Memorize Philippians 2:3-4 as a reminder of Christ-like humility in our daily interactions.
