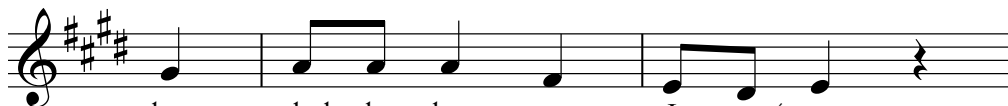

## ORDINATION & INSTALLATION OF DAVID VILCHES TO GOSPEL MINISTRY

### THE COLLECT

Minister: Let us pray: O God, whose Son Jesus is the good shepherd of your people; Grant that when we hear his voice we may know him who calls us each by name, and follow where he leads; who, with you and the Holy Spirit, lives and reigns, one God, for ever and ever.

*People: Amen.*

### PRESENTATION OF THE CANDIDATE

#### QUESTIONS TO THE SESSION

Minister: To you, the Session of All Saints Presbyterian Church, as a member of the South Texas Presbytery, I present David Vilches to be ordained as a minister in Christ's holy catholic Church and installed as an Assistant Pastor. Has he been called in accordance with the standards of the Presbyterian Church in America? And do you believe his manner of life to be suitable to the exercise of this ministry?

Session: We certify to you that he has satisfied the requirements of the standards, and we believe him to be qualified for this office.

Minister: Do you continue to profess your readiness to receive David, whom you have called to this position?

Session: We do.

Minister: Do you promise to receive the word of truth from his mouth with meekness and love?

Session: We do.

Minister: Do you promise to encourage him in his labors, and to assist his endeavors for your instruction and spiritual edification?

Session: We do.

Minister: Do you engage to continue to him while he serves in this capacity, that competent worldly maintenance which you have promised, and to furnish him with whatever you may see needful for the honor of religion and for his comfort among you?

Session: We do.

## QUESTIONS TO THE CANDIDATE

Minister: David, are you persuaded that God has called you to the office of elder?

*Candidate: I am so persuaded.*

Minister: Are you now willing to serve this congregation as an Assistant Pastor, agreeable to your declaration in accepting its call?

*Candidate: I am willing and ready to do so.*

Minister: Let us pray:

O God of unchangeable power and eternal light: Look favorably on your whole Church, that wonderful and sacred mystery; by the effectual working of your providence, carry out in tranquillity the plan of salvation; let the whole world see and know that things which were being cast down are being raised up, and things which had grown old are being made new, and that all things are being brought to their perfection by him through whom all things were made, your Son Jesus Christ our Lord; who lives and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever.

*People: Amen.*

## THE CHARGE AND VOWS

Minister: My brother, the Church is the family of God, the body of Christ, and the temple of the Holy Spirit. All baptized people are called to make Christ known as Savior and Lord, and to share in the renewing of his world. Now you are called to work as a pastor, teacher, and counselor, together with your Session and fellow ministers, and to take your share in the guidance of the church. As a pastor, it will be your task to proclaim by word and deed the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and to fashion your life in accordance with its precepts. You are called to guard the faith, unity, and discipline of the church. You are to love and serve the people among whom you work, caring alike for young and old, strong and weak, rich and poor. You are to preach, to declare God's forgiveness to repentant sinners, to pronounce God's blessing, to share in the administration of Holy Baptism and in the celebration of the mysteries of Christ's Body and Blood, and to perform the other ministrations entrusted to you. In all that you do, you are to nourish Christ's people from the riches of his grace, and strengthen them to glorify God in this life and in the life to come.

Minister: Do you believe the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments, as originally given, to be the inerrant Word of God, the only infallible rule of faith and practice?

*Candidate: I do.*

Minister: Do you sincerely receive and adopt the Confession of Faith and the Catechisms of this Church, as containing the system of doctrine taught in the Holy Scriptures; and do you further promise that if at any time you find yourself out of accord with any of the fundamentals of this system of doctrine, you will on your own initiative, make known to your Presbytery the change which has taken place in your views since the assumption of this ordination vow?

*Candidate: I do.*

Minister: Do you approve of the form of government and discipline of the Presbyterian Church in America, in conformity with the general principles of Biblical polity?

*Candidate: I do.*

Minister: Do you promise subjection to your brethren in the Lord?

*Candidate: I do.*

Minister: Have you been induced, as far as you know your own heart, to seek the office of the holy ministry from love to God and a sincere desire to promote His glory in the Gospel of His Son?

Candidate: *I have.*

Minister: Do you promise to be zealous and faithful in maintaining the truths of the Gospel and the purity and peace and unity of the Church, whatever persecution or opposition may arise unto you on that account?

Candidate: *I do.*

Minister: Do you engage to be faithful and diligent in the exercise of all your duties as a Christian and a minister of the Gospel, whether personal or relational, private or public; and to endeavor by the grace of God to adorn the profession of the Gospel in your manner of life, and to walk with exemplary piety before the flock of which God shall make you overseer?

Candidate: *I do.*

Minister: Will you be faithful in prayer, and in the study of Holy Scripture, that you may have the mind of Christ?

Candidate: *I will.*

Minister: Will you boldly proclaim and interpret the Gospel of Christ, enlightening the minds and stirring up the conscience of your people?

Candidate: *I will.*

Minister: Will you endeavor so to minister the Word of God and the sacraments of the New Covenant, that the reconciling love of Christ may be known and received?

Candidate: *I will.*

Minister: Will you guard the faith, unity, and discipline of the Church of God?

Candidate: *I will.*

Minister: Will you do your best to pattern your life and that of your family in accordance with the teachings of Christ, so that you may be a wholesome example to your people?

Candidate: *I will.*

Minister: Will you be merciful to all, show compassion to the poor and strangers, and defend those who have no helper?

Candidate: *I will.*

Minister: May the Lord who has given you the will to do these things give you the grace and power to perform them.

## THE PRAYER OF ORDINATION AND INSTALLATION

AT THIS POINT, THE CANDIDATE WILL KNEEL, THE ELDERS WILL LAY HANDS UPON HIM.

Minister: God and Father of all, we praise you for your infinite love in calling us to be a holy people in the kingdom of your Son Jesus our Lord, who is the image of your eternal and invisible glory, the firstborn among many brethren, and the head of the Church. We thank you that by his death he has overcome death, and, having ascended into heaven, has poured his gifts abundantly upon your people, making some apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry and the building up of his body.

Minister: We pray to you, Lord Christ, for All Saints Presbyterian Church and the Presbyterian Church in America, that they may be filled with truth and love, and be found without fault at the Day of your Coming.

People: *Lord, hear our prayer.*

Minister: For all members of your Church in their vocation and ministry, that they may serve you in a true and godly life, we pray to you, O Lord.

People: *Lord, hear our prayer.*

Minister: For David, Assistant Pastor of All Saints, we pray to you, O Lord.

People: *Lord, hear our prayer.*

Minister: That he may faithfully fulfill the duties of this ministry, build up your Church, and glorify your Name, we pray to you, O Lord.

People: *Lord, hear our prayer.*

Minister: That by the indwelling of the Holy Spirit he may be sustained and encouraged to persevere to the end, we pray to you, O Lord.

People: *Lord, hear our prayer.*

Minister: For his family, Ruth, Eliana, and Santiago, that they may be adorned with all Christian virtues, we pray to you, O Lord.

People: *Lord, hear our prayer.*

(AT THIS TIME PASTORS WILL OFFER INTERCESSIONS ON BEHALF OF THE CANDIDATE.)

Minister: Therefore, Father, through Jesus Christ your Son, give your Holy Spirit to David; fill him with grace and power, and equip him to minister in your Church. May he exalt you, O Lord, in the midst of your people; offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to you; boldly proclaim the gospel of salvation; and rightly administer the sacraments of the New Covenant. Make him a faithful pastor, a patient teacher, and a wise counselor. Grant that in all things he may serve without reproach, so that your people may be strengthened and your Name glorified in all the world. All this we ask through Jesus Christ our Lord, who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns, one God, for ever and ever.

People: *Amen.*

(HERE, THE CONGREGATION WILL STAND. THE MINISTER WILL PUT A ROBE AND STOLE ON THE NEWLY ORDAINED PASTOR AND PRESENT HIM WITH A BIBLE ON BEHALF OF THE CHURCH.)

Minister: David, receive the Holy Scriptures. Feed the flock of Christ committed to your charge, guard and defend them in his truth, and be a faithful steward of his holy Word and Sacraments.

I now pronounce and declare that Rev. David Vilches has been regularly elected, ordained, and installed as Assistant Pastor of this congregation, agreeable to the Word of God, and according to the Constitution of the Presbyterian Church in America; and that as such he is entitled to all support, encouragement, honor, and obedience in the LORD: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

Celebrant: We praise you, O Lord that you, rich in mercy, and infinite in goodness, made us in your own image, freed us from everlasting death, and provided our redemption in your only and well-beloved Son, whom out of love you gave to be made man, like us in all things but sin, to receive the punishment of our transgression in his body, to satisfy your justice by his death, and through his resurrection to destroy him who was the author of death; and so to bring again to the world the life from which the whole offspring of Adam was exiled.

And so, at the commandment of Jesus Christ our Lord, we present ourselves at this, His table.

For in the night in which he was betrayed, Jesus took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat, this is my Body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." Likewise, after supper, he took the cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink of this, all of you; for this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you, and for many, for the remission of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Therefore, we proclaim the mystery of faith:

People:

*Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.*

Celebrant: Gracious God, pour out your Holy Spirit upon us and upon these your gifts of bread and wine, that the bread we break and the cup we bless may be the communion of the body and blood of Christ. By your Spirit, make us one with Christ, that we may be one with all who share this feast, united in ministry in every place. As this bread is Christ's body for us, send us out to be the body of Christ in the world.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever.

*People: Amen.*

Celebrant: And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say:

*People: Our Father, who art in heaven, Hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil, for Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen.*

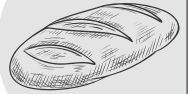


## 1. WAIT FOR AN USHER

Grape juice is located in the cups of the center ring of each wine/juice tray.

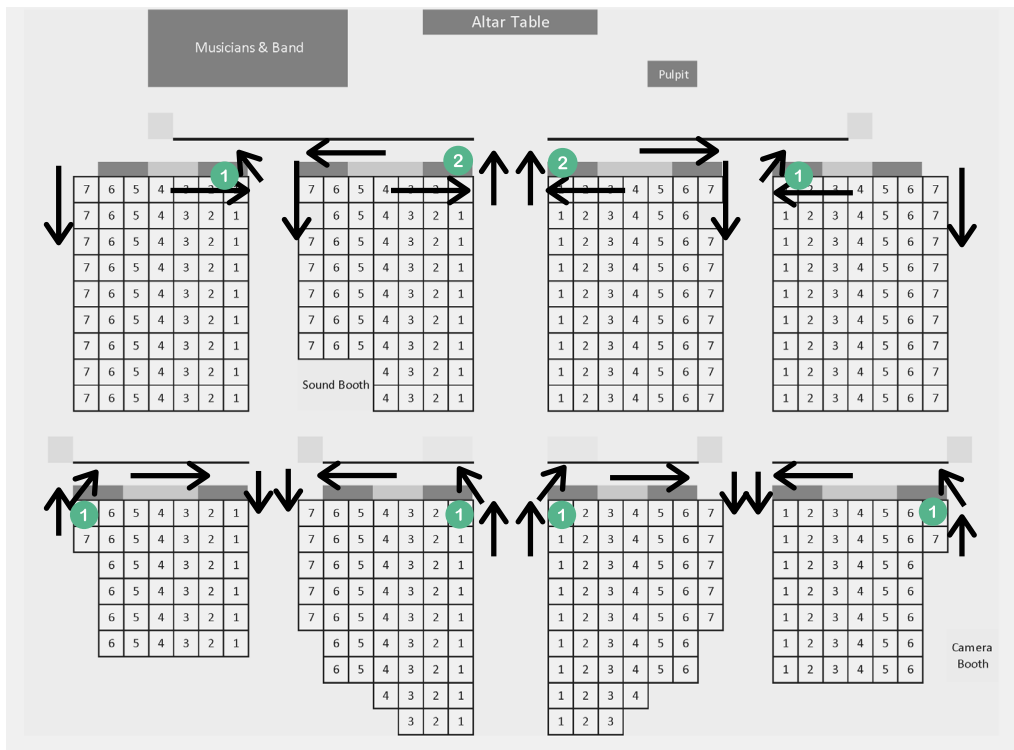
## 4. CHILDREN

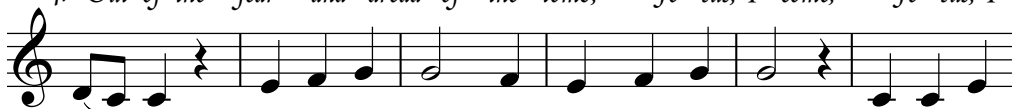

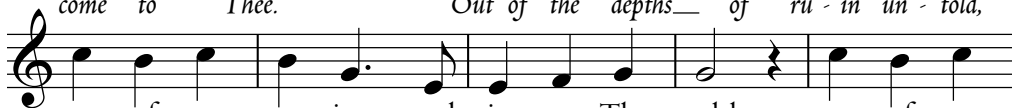

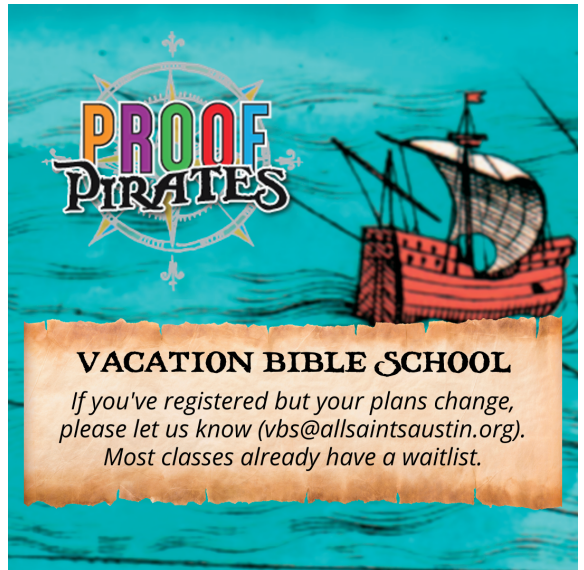
