THE SEASON OF LENT originated as a time of preparation for Easter, spanning 40 days (not including Sundays) from Ash Wednesday to Holy Saturday. The focus of Lent is repentance - a turning of our hearts, minds, and actions from ourselves to God. The Sundays in Lent are *in* the season but not *of* it, and are celebrated as "feast" days, traditionally days on which Lenten fasts are broken as we gather together for worship and to celebrate Christ's resurrection.

THE COLOR OF LENT: Purple, the color of Lent, signifies penitence and humility, and is meant to remind us of humanity's suffering under sin and of Christ's suffering on the cross - the color of a bruise. Purple is also the color of royalty and anticipates the coming glory of Christ's resurrection on Easter.





OLD TESTAMENT READING

GENESIS 6:5-14, 7:15-17

The LORD saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intention of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually. 6 And the LORD regretted that he had made man on the earth, and it grieved him to his heart. 7 So the LORD said, "I will blot out man whom I have created from the face of the land, man and animals and creeping things and birds of the heavens, for I am sorry that I have made them." 8 But Noah found favor in the eyes of the LORD.

Since announcing the \$2 million matching challenge, we've seen a number of new or increased pledges. Thank you!





(PLEASE KNEEL OR BE SEATED)

Celebrant: All glory be to you, O Lord our God, for you created heaven and earth, and made us in your own image; and, of your tender mercy, you gave your only Son Jesus Christ to take our nature upon him, and to suffer death upon the cross for our redemption.

He made there a full and perfect sacrifice for the whole world; and did institute, and in his holy Gospel command us to continue, a perpetual memory of his precious death and sacrifice, until his coming again.

1. WAIT FOR AN USHER

An usher will release each row. If you're not sure where to go, your usher will direct you.

3. WINE & JUICE

Grape juice is located in the cups of the <u>center ring</u> of each wine/juice tray.

4. CHILDREN


Children who have been interviewed at All Saints or by the ruling body of another church are welcome to partake of communion. Younger children may also come forward with parents to receive a blessing.
