PRAYERS FOR THE CANDIDATES

Celebrant: Let us now give thanks to God and pray for those who are to receive the Sacrament of Baptism. Almighty and everlasting God, we give you thanks, for in your great mercy you did save Noah and his family in the Ark from perishing by water; and also did safely lead the children of Israel, your people, through the Red Sea; signifying thereby your holy Baptism, and by the Baptism of your well-beloved Son Jesus Christ, did sanctify the River Jordan, and all other waters, to the mysterious washing away of sin; In your infinite love, we pray that you will look mercifully upon these, your covenant children.

People: Sanctify them and wash them with your Holy Spirit.

Celebrant: We pray that they, being delivered from your wrath, may be received into the Ark of Christ's Church, and being steadfast in faith, joyful through hope, and rooted in charity, may so pass through the waves of this troublesome world, that finally they may come to the land of everlasting life, there to reign with You, world without end, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Celebrant: I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Child of the covenant, you are sealed by the Holy Spirit in baptism and marked as Christ's own forever. Amen.

Guide her as she grows in faith. Protect her in all the dangers and temptations of life. And bring her to confess Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior and be his faithful disciple to life's end; in the name of Jesus;

OLD TESTAMENT READING

ESTHER 3:1-6, 6:1-10

After these things King Ahasuerus promoted Haman the Agagite, the son of Hammedatha, and advanced him and set his throne above all the officials who were with him. 2 And all the king's servants who were at the king's gate bowed down and paid homage to Haman, for the king had so commanded concerning him. But Mordecai did not bow down or pay homage. 3 Then the king's servants who were at the king's gate said to Mordecai, "Why do you transgress the king's command?" 4 And when they spoke to him day after day and he would not listen to them, they told Haman, in order to see whether Mordecai's words would stand, for he had told them that he was a Jew. 5 And when Haman saw that Mordecai did not bow down or pay homage to him, Haman was filled with fury. 6 But he disdained to lay hands on Mordecai alone. So, as they had made known to him the people of Mordecai, Haman sought to destroy all the Jews, the people of Mordecai, throughout the whole kingdom of Ahasuerus...

6:1 On that night the king could not sleep. And he gave orders to bring the book of memorable deeds, the chronicles, and they were read before the king. 2 And it was found written how Mordecai had told about Bigthana and Teresh, two of the king's eunuchs, who guarded the threshold, and who had sought to lay hands on King Ahasuerus. 3 And the king said, "What honor or distinction has been bestowed on Mordecai for this?" The king's young men who attended him said, "Nothing has been done for him." 4 And the king said, "Who is in the court?" Now Haman had just entered the outer court of the king's palace to speak to the king about having Mordecai hanged on the gallows that he had prepared for him. 5 And the king's young men told him, "Haman is there, standing in the court." And the king said, "Let him come in." 6 So Haman came in, and the king said to him, "What should be done to the man whom the king delights to honor?" And Haman said to himself, "Whom would the king delight to honor more than me?" 7 And Haman said to the king, "For the man whom the king delights to honor, 8 let royal robes be brought, which the king has worn, and the horse that the king has ridden, and on whose head a royal crown is set. 9 And let the robes and the horse be handed over to one of the king's most noble officials. Let them dress the man whom the king delights to honor, and let them lead him on the horse through the square of the city, proclaiming before him: 'Thus shall it be done to the man whom the king delights to honor.'" 10 Then the king said to Haman, "Hurry; take the robes and the horse, as you have said, and do so to Mordecai the Jew, who sits at the king's gate. Leave out nothing that you have mentioned."

EPISTLE READING

I TIMOTHY 4:6-10

If you put these things before the brothers, you will be a good servant of Christ Jesus, being trained in the words of the faith and of the good doctrine that you have followed. 7 Have nothing to do with irreverent, silly myths. Rather train yourself for godliness; 8 for while bodily training is of some value, godliness is of value in every way, as it holds promise for the present life and also for the life to come. 9 The saying is trustworthy and deserving of full acceptance. 10 For to this end we toil and strive, because we have our hope set on the living God, who is the Savior of all people, especially of those who believe.

We thank you for choosing to add to our number these brothers and sisters in faith. Together, may we live in your Spirit, and so love one another, that we may have the mind of Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom we give honor and glory forever. Amen.

GREAT THANKSGIVING

Celebrant: The Lord be with you.

People: And with your spirit.

Celebrant: Lift up your hearts.

People: We lift them up unto the Lord.

Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give him thanks and praise.

Celebrant: It is very good and right, our duty and privilege to at all times and in all places give thanks unto you O Lord, holy Father, Almighty and Everlasting God. For you are the eternal, immortal, and invisible King, the only true God. You created us and all things out of nothing; and when we had fallen into sin, you raised us up again in Christ, and did not cease to do everything until you had brought us up to heaven, granting us the kingdom that is to come. For this and for all that we know and do not know, we give you thanks. We give you thanks also for this Eucharist offering.

Celebrant: In and through your Son, Jesus Christ, condescend to receive it from our hands, even though angels and archangels and all the company of heaven laud and magnify your glorious name, evermore praising you and singing:

✠ Celebrant: With these angelic powers, O Lord, lover of mankind, we also cry and say: holy are you, Lord, and all-holy, you and your only begotten Son, and your Holy Spirit; and magnificent is your glory; for you so loved the world that you gave your only-begotten Son that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life.

For in the night in which he was betrayed, Jesus took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat, this is my Body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." Likewise, after supper, he took the cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink of this, all of you; for this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you, and for many, for the remission of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Celebrant: Remembering this commandment and all Christ has done for us we present to you our bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to you, which is our reasonable service, and we proclaim together:

People: *Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.*

Celebrant: And we pray, pour out your Holy Spirit upon us and on these your gifts of bread and wine. Make this bread also the precious Body of your Son, and that which is in this cup His precious Blood. Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit; so that they may be unto us nourishment of soul, fellowship with the Spirit, and a foretaste of your kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever.

People: Amen.

Celebrant: And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say:

People: Our Father, who art in heaven, Hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil, for Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen.

Celebrant: Christ our Passover has been sacrificed for us;

People: Therefore, let us keep the feast.

Coming to the Table

Instructions & Explanations



Welcome to the Lord's Table

All Saints welcomes all baptized Christians to participate in the eucharistic meal, whether members at All Saints or another church. Children who have been baptized and admitted to the table by the elders of this church or the leadership of another church are also welcome.

If you're still investigating Christianity or simply choose not to participate, you may either remain in your seat or come forward, cross your arms over your chest, and receive a blessing. Non-communing children are encouraged to come forward to receive a blessing while their parents receive communion.

About the BREAD



Gluten free bread is available upon request in all serving sections. If you are highly gluten intolerant, we recommend communing at the front left serving section which serves only gluten free bread.

About the WINE



The outer circles of each cup tray contain wine. Grape juice is provided in the **inner circle of each tray**.

Where do I go?



Wait for an usher to release your row. Ushers will release each row to go forward to take communion.

If you're unsure where to go, an usher will direct you to the appropriate line.

If I only take the bread or the wine...



There may be times when you are unable to take either the bread or the wine. Perhaps the grape juice runs out in your section. The historic Church recognizes this as "communion in one kind" and it's ok! The Church still considers those who have taken just the bread or just the wine as participating fully in Communion.
