THE COLORS OF ADVENT

Blue is used during Advent as a symbol of royalty, and of the night sky preceding the dawning of a new day - the anticipation of the impending announcement of Christ the King's coming.

THE CANDLES OF ADVENT

The light reminds us that Jesus is the light of the world who comes into the darkness of our lives to bring newness, life, and hope, calling us to be lights in the world as we reflect God's grace to others (Isa 42:6). The primary reason for lighting one candle on the first Sunday, plus another the second, and so on is to symbolize the various aspects of our waiting experience, especially the darkness of fear and hopelessness receding and the shadows of sin falling away as more and more light is shed into the world.

MATTHEW 1:1, 18-25

The book of the genealogy of Jesus Christ, the son of David, the son of Abraham... 18 Now the birth of Jesus Christ took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been betrothed to Joseph, before they came together she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. 19 And her husband Joseph, being a just man and unwilling to put her to shame, resolved to divorce her quietly. 20 But as he considered these things, behold, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, do not fear to take Mary as your wife, for that which is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. 21 She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." 22 All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had spoken by the prophet:

WHILE THERE ARE MANY WAYS TO CONTRIBUTE FINANCIALLY TO GOD'S KINGDOM, THE CHURCH IS THE PRIMARY MEANS BY WHICH THAT KINGDOM IS ESTABLISHED ON EARTH. THUS, GOD CALLS US FIRST AND FOREMOST TO BE FAITHFUL IN THE REGULAR, ONGOING SUPPORT OF ONE'S LOCAL CHURCH BODY THROUGH TITHES AND OFFERINGS. IF YOU HAVEN'T MADE TITHING A PRACTICE, PLEASE CONSIDER ADOPTING TITHING OR GENEROUS GIVING AS A SPIRITUAL PRACTICE—THAT YOU MIGHT GROW IN FAITH AND THAT TOGETHER WE MIGHT INCREASE ALL SAINTS' CAPACITY TO BE THE BODY OF CHRIST IN AUSTIN FOR THE WORLD.

We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under your Table. But you are the same Lord whose property is always to have mercy. Grant us therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of your dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink his blood, that our sinful bodies may be made clean by his body and our souls washed through his most precious blood that we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us. Amen.*

GREAT THANKSGIVING

Celebrant: The Lord be with you.

People: *And with your spirit.*

Celebrant: Lift up your hearts.

People: *We lift them up unto the Lord.*

Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: *It is right to give him thanks and praise.*

Celebrant: It is very good and right, our duty and privilege, to at all times and in all places give thanks unto you, O Lord, holy Father, through your beloved Son, Jesus Christ, your Word through whom you made all things, and sent to be our Savior, incarnate by the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. Fulfilling your will and gaining for you a holy people, he stretched out his hands as he endured the cross, so as to break the bonds of death and bring forth the resurrection.

Therefore, with angels and archangels and all the company of heaven we laud and magnify your holy name, evermore praising you and singing.

Celebrant: You are indeed Holy, O Lord, the fount of all holiness. Make holy, therefore, these gifts, by sending down your Holy Spirit like rain upon the earth that they may be for us the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.

For in the night in which he was betrayed, Jesus took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, "Take, eat, this is my Body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." Likewise, after supper, he took the cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink of this, all of you; for this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you, and for many, for the remission of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Celebrant: Therefore, we proclaim the mystery of faith:
People: *Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.*

Celebrant: As we celebrate the memorial of his Death and Resurrection, we offer you, O Lord, the Bread of life and the Cup of salvation, giving thanks that in Christ you have accepted us as righteous and welcomed us into your presence to worship you.

And we humbly pray that, partaking of the Body and Blood of Christ, we may be made one by the Holy Spirit, just as you, Father, are one with Christ - he in you, and you in him.

Remember, O Lord, your Church spread throughout the world - your people from every tongue, tribe, and nation - and bring her to the stature of the fullness of Christ.

Remember, O Lord, all your people even as we give thanks for our loved ones who have fallen asleep in the hope of the resurrection.

Remember us, O Lord, that with all the saints who have loved you throughout the ages, we may endure to be coheirs of eternal life.

Celebrant: All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever.

People: *Amen.*

Celebrant: And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say:

People: *Our Father, who art in heaven, Hallowed be Thy Name. Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil, for Thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen.*

Welcome to the Lord's Table

All Saints welcomes all baptized Christians to participate in the eucharistic meal, whether members at All Saints or another church. Children who have been baptized and admitted to the table by the elders of this church or the leadership of another church are also welcome.

If you're still investigating Christianity or simply choose not to participate, you may either remain in your seat or come forward, cross your arms over your chest, and receive a blessing. Non-communing children are encouraged to come forward to receive a blessing while their parents receive communion.

About the BREAD



Gluten free bread is available upon request in all serving sections. If you are highly gluten intolerant, we recommend communing at the front left serving section which serves only gluten free bread.

Where do I go?



Wait for an usher to release your row. Ushers will release each row to go forward to take communion.

If you're unsure where to go, an usher will direct you to the appropriate line.

About the WINE



The outer circles of each cup tray contain wine. Grape juice is provided in the **inner circle of each tray**.

If I only take the bread or the wine...



There may be times when you are unable to take either the bread or the wine. Perhaps the grape juice runs out in your section. The historic Church recognizes this as "communion in one kind" and it's ok! The Church still considers those who have taken just the bread or just the wine as participating fully in Communion.


