THE CROSS SPIRITUAL FORMATION



THE TREE SERVICE

The tree in our image is dynamic - it changes with the season. It not only changes color with the church year but there are certain times in which it has more fruit. It also originates from the cross because as we grow up in Christ, we are sent out in service and mission to the world.

All Saints Presbyterian Church is a congregation of the Presbyterian Church in America (PCA). We believe that the Church exists to be the body of Christ to a broken world. Since our beginnings in 2003, we have sought to live out that calling here in the city of Austin. We hope to form our church, both corporately and each person individually, to follow Jesus as King by doing justice, loving mercy, and walking humbly with our God.

Our mission statement, adopted in 2012 and rearticulated on our 18th anniversary, lays out three ways in which our life as Christ's body is shaped - in worship, through spiritual formation, and in service.

- Worship is the center of our church life and the place in which we, first and foremost, respond to God's call to love him with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength.
- Spiritual formation is the work of the Holy Spirit and is rooted in and shaped by the Scriptures. Formation necessarily occurs in the church community as the Word of God is heard, understood, applied, and lived together among individuals and among families.
- We want to humbly and boldly tell the redemptive story of Jesus to the city of Austin while joining others who are telling it throughout our region, nation, and world. Thus, our prayer is for the Lord to use us to plant churches, establish ministries of mercy and justice, partner with foreign missionaries, and send each of our members out into their particular vocations to bring the peace of Christ to our world.

2003 MISSION CHURCH All Saints was formally established in the summer of 2003 as a mission church of the Presbyterian Church in America (P.C.A.). FIRST WORSHIP SERVICE All Saints' first worship service was held on Sunday, September 7, 2003, in a former Episcopal church on Bee Caves Road. 2005 PARTICULAR CHURCH On May 15, 2005, All Saints became a particular church in the PCA. Under the presbytery's oversight, the congregation issued a formal call to Bill Boyd to become its pastor, and installed ruling elders for the first time. Three weeks later, All Saints moved from its original location to St. Gabriel's Catholic School. **NEW PASTOR & PROPERTY** 2012 In the spring of 2012, All Saints called and formally installed Rev. Tim Frickenschmidt as its next Senior Pastor. In December of that year, the congregation voted to purchase property off Southwest Parkway on which to build a permanent church 2015 FIRST CHURCH PLANT The years that followed saw a successful building fundraising campaign and the simultaneous planting of a new church. Grace + Peace, in north-central Austin. 2016 **NEW CHURCH HOME** All Saints held its first worship service in our current building on August 19, 2021 CAPITAL CAMPAIGN All Saints launched a new capital campaign to fund improvements to our current facility, including a playground for church and community use, a sports field, and retirement of past debt to free up funds for additional sites, services, and ministry opportunities.

BUILT UP IN CHRIST

For more than a decade, All Saints gathered for worship in rented spaces. In the Lord's goodness, we were able to purchase property and construct our own facility. We began worshipping in our current location in 2016.


Since moving into the building, our attendance at worship on Sundays has more than doubled. In 2021, we launched a new capital campaign to raise funds for a few immediate improvements to help us accommodate new growth.

Plans for our campus have always included the building of a permanent sanctuary at a later date (thus the name "Interim Sanctuary" on our current worship space). In 2023, it became apparent that it was time for a larger worship space in order to make room not only for our current Sunday worshippers, but also to welcome all those the Lord may bring through our doors in the future.

Our recent capital campaign raised enough funds for us to begin construction on the sanctuary but we remain hopeful that additional funds may be given that would enable us to minimize our reliance on borrowed funds. In today's world, true, deep, and life-giving connection with other people is a rare thing. Even though we live in a society that is increasingly wired and "connected" in one sense of the word, there is a deep hunger and thirst for a community with which to do life together. That is what we hope to allow space for at All Saints. Our primary means of community is worship on Sundays; but in a large church such as ours, it is necessary to organize smaller in order to truly connect and become rooted like the Psalm 1 tree, "planted by streams of water." In these smaller groups, the nourishing waters of the word of God, community with other saints, and lives of service lived together help to sustain and grow the people of God, that as individuals and as a church we might fulfill our calling "to live and to love as Christ's Body in the world."



PARISHES

Parishes are one way in which All Saints organizes smaller in an effort to care well for our members. When someone becomes a member, they receive their parish designation based on where they live. Parish gatherings are a great way to meet your All Saints neighbors and connect with those leaders who live closest to you. Each parish has a leader team of elders, deacons, and deaconesses. As a member, you can expect the following from your parish leaders:

- An individual touch-base twice a year by phone or email.
- An invitation to a parish-wide gathering twice a year.
- Connection point for when a spiritual need or crisis arises.

You can also be on the lookout for an invitation from your Parish Welcome Host to join them for a meal.













All Saints relies 100% on the faithfulness of its members, through their tithes and offerings, to continue the mission to which God has called us. But more importantly, to tithe to the Lord is to honor the Lord in worship. While there are many ways to contribute financially to God's Kingdom, the Church is the primary means by which that kingdom is established on earth. Thus, God calls us first and foremost to be faithful in the regular, ongoing support of one's local church body through tithes and offerings. The call in Scripture to servanthood is not one primarily of service to other people but of service to our Father in heaven, embodied and lived out in our service to one another and the world. Service is the tenth of our spiritual formation practices. When we have poured out our selves through tithing, sacrificial giving, and fasting, we find there is room to be filled to overflowing with the self-sacrificial love of God.

As part of our membership vows, All Saints members promise to "support the Church in its worship and work." To that end, we have identified two serving commitments for which all members are automatically qualified and expected to serve; that of Offertory and Children's Helper on Sundays.

- Offertory All members serve once a year to walk the Sunday offerings down the aisle to the pastor during the service.
- <u>Children's Helper</u> All members who are not already serving with the Children's Ministry serve once every year by assisting a teacher in a supporting role. No advance preparation needed. Class assignments are made Sunday morning.







SERVING IN THE CHURCH

On your new member forms, you have the opportunity to select areas in which you'd like to serve. You may also fill out the service interest form at allsaintsaustin.org/serving.

Descriptions of each area of service can be found below:

- Communion Prep Volunteers arrive before the service to prepare the bread and wine trays for communion and then stay after that service to clean up. This is a vital behind-the-scenes opportunity to serve.
- **Greeters** Greeters welcome people, pass out bulletins, and help direct questions to the staff.
- Lead Ushers Responsibilities include helping people find seats, helping guests find their way on campus, ushering people to the communion lines, and tidying up the sanctuary. Communion ushers are only responsible for ushering the lines during communion.

MUSIC

- Music Team As needs arise, volunteers audition to join the music team, and typically serve 1-2 times a month. The music team rehearses before services on Sundays. To inquire about current needs, contact David Lutes.
- **Choir** Singing with the choir is a beautiful way to exercise creativity and grow musically while fellowshipping with and ministering to others. Some experience preferred, but not required. Rehearsals are Thursdays, 7:00-8:30 PM. For more information, contact Faith Westerman (fwesterman@allsaintsaustin.org).

CHILDREN'S SERVICE TEAMS

- Small Saints Volunteers present a lesson during the sermon for preK-2nd grade.
- Children's Hall Teachers Volunteers present a 10-minute lesson to children ages 2, 3, or 4. Remaining time is spent playing in the classroom and outside.
- **Nursery Shepherds** Volunteers care for our littlest ones ages 0-2. This ranges from reading books and Bible stories to rocking, to playing with toys.
- Hallway Coordinator (HC) Volunteers work with the Children's Staff to run the Children's Hall. The HC serves as the "help desk" by welcoming guests, answering questions, and making sure dropoff/pick-up runs smoothly.
- **Sunday School** All Saints offers a Sunday School time for 3rd-5th graders during the sermon at each worship service. If you'd like to help with this program, contact Michael Clark (mclark@allsaintsaustin.org).



MISSION VS. MISSIONS

As Jesus goes to the cross he prays to God the Father, "as you have sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world." (Jn. 17:18). Jesus invites us to see that 'mission' is a continuation of his mission through us, his body. We are now those who are sent to proclaim and demonstrate the kingdom of God in Christ (Mt. 28:18-20; Acts 1:6-8).

Missions is our particular expression, as All Saints, of the mission of God in Christ. In practice, All Saints Missions equips, supports, and promotes missional opportunities and partnerships. We currently partner with over two dozen Missional Partners, who serve locally, nationally, and globally.






TouchPoint Serving

All Saints relies on over 150 volunteers each Sunday. That means, there are opportunities for every member to serve and utilize their gifts in some capacity. BAPTISM

The sacrament of baptism is the entrance into the Christian life. Whether the candidate is 6 weeks old, 6 years old, or 60 years old, in baptism the Christian dies and is raised to new life in Christ. If you are joining as a new member and you or your children have not yet been baptized, you may ask the pastor or elder conducting your member interview about baptism. When you are ready, you may indicate on your membership forms that you would like to sign up for one of the upcoming baptism dates. In the future, you may also fill out the baptism form allsaintsaustin.org/baptism

FIRST COMMUNION

It is one of the greatest joys of Sunday worship to welcome children to the Lord's Table for the first time. The age for first communion at All Saints is up to the discretion of the parents. If you feel your child is ready to begin communing at All Saints, the next step is to set up a time for him or her to talk with a pastor or an elder. 
