Curator Statement

"No eye has seen, no ear has heard..." says Isaiah, perhaps longingly.

What are we waiting for? We have the privilege of already knowing the story.

Advent: an arrival.

Advent: the season when Christians world-wide await the arrival, the revelation. Advent, the season, opens space for us to tune into our deep longing for God. We get to be still, and ponder in anticipation The One who was, and is, and is to come. Then, at Christmas time, we can celebrate and sing, "Joy to the world, the Lord has come." He has revealed himself to us. We behold the astonishing, near-unbelievable marvel of God coming to us, in the form that we understand, that enables us to understand him more.

The artwork of Jim Janknegt can help us to ponder these things. Enjoy viewing this grouping of art that can remind, illuminate, and show anew the familiar yet cosmic magnificence we find in Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany.

Jim's work is reminiscent of, and can serve as, traditional Christian icons that both show us a specific person and event, while also opening a window to grander reality that is not yet seen with the eye.


Concerning his body of work related to church seasons, Jim writes:

Everyone loves the Christmas story. I painted my first Christmas painting in 1995, the year our daughter was born. I also painted several Annunciation paintings that year. I received several commissions along the way to paint other scenes from the Christmas narrative. At some point my wife and I began to send out Christmas cards with a painting from the Christmas story on the front. As the time approached to begin painting the Christmas painting for this year's card I realized that in one form or another I had visualized the entire Christmas story in paintings.

Some pieces uniquely stand out in this selection of Jim's work. Jesse Tree references God's epic plan, as well as Madonna with Jesse Tree. Although small in reproduction, Glory has the whole sky full of gigantic stunning visages of angels, come to announce the miracle unfolding. We can sense the wildness and profundity of the moment.

For the artist, Nativity 1995 has particular significance, as it is based on the particulars of his own child in the first days of life. At 5' x 7' feet, the painting pushes and pulls us into an anachronistically cinematic view of Mary's vulnerability as she is in bed with the resting Christ child. We then notice, on the right side, a modern version of the wise men and kings finally on the scene. Now, he has been seen, and he has been heard.

With them, let us adore him!
