Friends,

Lent has been around before Advent, and I feel like it gets a bad rap. Although maybe it's just been my attitude about it. Growing up I thought the purpose of Lent was to give up something I liked so I could understand Jesus' sacrifice. I had trouble seeing the connection of how giving up sugar related to the crucifixion. Later, my perspective changed to viewing Lent as a time to begin new good habits like reading the Bible more. Today, I now see a different aspect of Lent that I learned through fasting.

Although, I typically fast every day from around 10pm to 8am the following morning; I practice the spiritual discipline of extended fasting throughout the year. What surprised me most was I realized how many decisions I make during the day without thinking about them. First, it was only related to food. How often I open the refrigerator, not hungry, but I just wanted something to eat; and it was never from the vegetable drawer. In just recognizing that behavior I started to think about the other ways I do that every day. Channel surfing is the entertainment equivalent of thinking, "I'm hungry, but I don't know what I want." What started with food expanded into examining other aspects of my life; and I saw that I need to be more intentional and less reactive about my choices. When I spend money is it for something I need or something I want? When I talk about people, is it build them up or make myself feel better?

We will continue our journey through Luke's Gospel during Lent and we will see what an intentional life that is centered on Jesus looks like. He challenges us to examine our motivations and priorities. I believe that fasting helps our insight and it can take various forms: during Lent instead of food what about once a week fasting from having the news on all day or taking a day off from using our phones. I've done that and discovered that the internet continued to exist without my input.

All these things in themselves are not necessarily bad, but like food, the choices we make can nourish us or be the soul equivalent of junk food. I do look forward to Lent. Two of my favorite services are during this season: Ash Wednesday and Maundy Thursday. The full meaning of the hope and joy we experience at Easter is by observing Lent.

Remember to Spring Ahead Saturday, March 8th!





Each year, our local YWCA serve women, men, children, and families who are impacted by intimate partner domestic violence through their free, trauma-informed, confidential programs and services. Unfortunately, families in crisis are often turned away due to the lack of bed space at their current facility. Over the last 5 years, they have turned away 2,000 + families seeking safety due to limited shelter capacity.

In 2022, the YWCA accepted the opportunity to expand into the original, now historic, St. Elizabeth Nursing School building. The building was graciously donated by Hogback Development. The new building will triple their emergency shelter capacity, promote healing and wellness, foster independence, safety and community.

When the YWCA moved into their facility at 818 W. Yakima Ave., Christ Lutheran had our own campaign to help furnish a room. The Social Ministry committee feels that our members can assist the YWCA again with our Lenten offering. During the weeks of Lent, we will be providing more information as to how this new facility will benefit those in our community who so desperately need help.
