I felt different about Lent this year. There are a couple reasons for that, however, I know in part it was due to intentionally following the path Jesus took to Easter. As I prepared sermons reflecting on the Kingdom of God; it opened my eyes to see how it's happening right now and all around us. The eternal life that Jesus wants for us for we can those experiences now. And a good reminder that salvation is both an event and a process.

Thank you to everyone who helped us have the proper mind-set to observe Lent: to everyone on the Altar Guild, those who fed us at the Tuesday evening suppers, our musicians and worship leaders. Sharing Lent like this made Easter Sunday even more joyful.

There's a quote by Rudyard Kipling (The Jungle Book, Rikki-Tikki-Tavi) that I should probably have in my office, "an ounce of Mother is worth a pound of clergy." I am unable to come up with a counter argument to that and it sounds about right; maybe a little generous towards the clergy. It doesn't matter my age or accomplishments; even today if I go clothes shopping with my Mom I still feel like I'm 10 years old. It's all right though (besides getting free clothes) because it reminds me that I will forever be my Mother's son. And I thank God for that arrangement. It is not surprising that Jesus had a mom. In the New Testament, the Greek word that is closest to the type of love God has towards us; is the love that a mother has towards her children. It's the type of love that stays up with us all night when we were sick; it's the love that puts a picture on the fridge even though it looks nothing like our cat; it's the love that embraces us when our hearts are broken. Jesus knows our human experience of love.

Whether your mother is still with you or not take a moment to thank God for her on May 11th. And for some of you, it may not have been your mother, but another woman God provided to be that person. Especially thank God for giving you her. To all Mothers thank you, for taking care of us.

In the last two months, we have planted the seeds of God's love in the lives of Uma, Odin, and Delainey. At their baptisms, we were charged with the promise to support and pray for one another in our life with Christ. Now we are asked to become the hands that plant, the heart that waters, the soul that watches in wonder as heaven works through our unseen faithfulness. So, we join their parents, grandparents, and great-grandparents to water and nourish that seed.

Isn't nice to know that God isn't asking us to produce results - not to carry that pressure—to know that we are only being asked to make space for God to work?

Thank You for inviting me to simply be faithful. Help me plant with love, water with grace, and trust You with the rest. Quiet my fears. Steady my heart. And when I can't see the fruit yet, help me believe You're still at work. In Jesus' name. Amen.
