

#### Dear Friends in Christ;



A Mighty Fortress has been called the Battle Hymn of the Reformation. Martin Luther, inspired by the words of Psalm 46 penned the words of this hymn.

<sup>1</sup> God is our refuge and strength,
A very present help in trouble.

<sup>2</sup> Therefore we will not fear,
Even though the earth be removed,
And though the mountains be carried into the midst of the sea;

<sup>3</sup> Though its waters roar and be troubled,
Though the mountains shake with its swelling....

For over 300 years, Europe had dealt with the recurrences of the bubonic plague. In the 14<sup>th</sup> century, it is believed to have taken the lives of 60% of the European population. In the summer of 1527, this plague came to Wittenberg. Most of the professors of the University fled with their families to escape this horrible plague. Martin Luther remained in Wittenberg because he felt that God had called him to such a time and place to minister to those who were suffering from the plague. Two of Luther's brothers died in the pandemic. Even though Martin Luther's wife was pregnant, he turned their home into a hospital to care for the sick and the dying. Luther, writing to others said, "If you truly love your neighbor, you would self-quarantine to stop the spread of the disease."

Living in this "devil filled world" Martin Luther struggled with depression all of his life. He found great comfort in these words from Psalm 46. He had learned that he could not lift himself out of this pit of despair. "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. Therefore we will not fear..."

Our hope is not in this world, but in the One who created heaven and earth. God is our refuge and strength. He tells us – do not be afraid. Even though everything around us seems to be falling apart.

As Martin Luther wrote —
"Though devils all the world should fill,
All eager to devour us,
We tremble not, we fear no ill;
They shall not overpower us.
This worlds prince may still
Scowl fierce as he will,
He can harm us none.
He's judged; the deed is done;
One little word can fell him.

That little word, is the Word that became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth. Jesus, the Son of God. Fear Not!

During the month of October, Faith is asking for your encouragement, prayers and financial support for our Mission of the Month partner, MOST Ministries. MOST Ministries is a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit organization independent of The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod but operates in such a way to foster the mission and ministry of the church, providing activities in harmony with the Synod and respecting the doctrine and practice of the Synod at all times.

<u>FOCUS</u>: Every MOST Ministries mission experience includes sharing the Gospel through a simple, clear presentation whenever appropriate with community members. In some countries, formal public evangelism is forbidden by government policy which MOST fully adheres to.

OUTREACH: MOST Ministries provides short term mission opportunities to support Christian ministries through the world through witness and service. Mission Teams minister to the physical and spiritual needs of people through projects such as: Agricultural Education, Clean Water Outreach, Construction, Dental Clinics, English Camp, Eyeglass Clinics, Health Education, Medical Clinics, Music and/or Sports Camp, Ministries for Women, Men and Youth. In the past, Faith has collected eyeglasses for MOST Ministries in addition to providing financial gifts.

#### "Serve the Lord with gladness." Psalm 100:2

This verse is the motto for the LWML. Our purpose is to serve the Lord in many different ways. On September 21<sup>st</sup>, we joined with others from our congregation to prepare teacher kits which will be delivered to an Orphan Grain Train location in Texas. These kits will be distributed by them later.

Our monthly collection of mites helps to fund this and other mission grants such as the Portable Laundry Trailer for Forged by Fire. This grant of \$100,700 will provide funds for purchasing an eight-station laundry trailer for use by victims, volunteers and first responders in areas affected by natural and man-made disasters. It will also provide an opportunity for LERT volunteers to share the Gospel with them. Thank you for your donations of \$185.76 in September.

On October 19<sup>th</sup>, we will celebrate LWML Sunday with a special service. We will also provide information about LWML and our mission grants for the 2025-2027 biennium.

Don't forget to visit our booth at the Arts & Crafts Sale at the Recreation Hall November 7-8. We will have lots of goodies available for sale.

#### Faith All Stars


The All Stars are playing T-ball this season. Game continues each Monday in October at 5:30pm on Faith Field (Faith Family Center in case of inclement weather).
