## The Gospel of God

1. Paul separated unto it
2. Promised afore by God's prophets
3. In holy scripture
4. Concerns God's Son our Lord
  1. Flesh – made of the seed of David
  2. “spirit of holiness” – Son of God with power (resurrection)

# ROMANS | Paul's Apostleship

## Paul's Apostleship

1. Received by the risen Lord Jesus Christ (Acts 9)
2. For obedience to the faith among all nations
3. For His name

# ROMANS | The Gospel of Christ

## The Gospel of Christ

1. Power of God unto salvation
2. Therein is the righteousness of God revealed
3. Wrath of God revealed from heaven against
  1. All ungodliness of men
  2. All unrighteousness of men
4. For His name

## Man's Historical Departure from God

1. History of Adam
2. Creation to Paul
3. Man, the Gentile (without law)
4. Man, the Jew (with law)

2. From heaven
3. Revealed

## Man's Unrighteousness

1. Creation – idolatry
2. Gave up to uncleanness
3. Gave up to vile affections
4. Gave over to reprobate mind

Goodness

## Man's Unrighteousness

4. Inexcusable
5. Judge to condemn
6. Truth of such things
7. No escape of the judgment of God

## God's Goodness

1. Goodness
2. Forbearance
3. Longsuffering
4. Leads to repentance

# ROMANS | The Judgment of God

## The Judgment of God

1. According to truth
2. According to deeds
  1. Patient continuance in well doing – eternal life
  2. Contentious, do not obey truth – wrath
3. No respect of persons
4. By Jesus Christ

# ROMANS | The Knowledge of Sin & Proof of Guilt

## The Knowledge of Sin

1. Those without law are a law unto themselves (excuse or accuse)
2. Those with law need to do the law (break the law)
  1. Knowledge of Sin
3. All under sin
4. Mouth stopped
5. Guilty before God

# ROMANS | The Righteousness of God

## The Righteousness of God – (God's Provision)

1. Revealed
2. Without law
3. Witness by the law & the prophets
4. By faith of Jesus Christ
5. Unto all
6. Upon all them that believe
  1. For all have sinned
  2. For all come short of the glory of God

# ROMANS | Redemption in Christ Jesus

## Redemption in Christ Jesus

### 1. Justification

1. Freely by grace (no deeds of the law)
2. Through the redemption in Christ

### 2. All Time

1. God set forth
2. Propitiation
3. Faith in His blood
4. To declare
  1. His righteousness for remission of sins past (forbearance)
  2. At this time His righteousness

## Grace & Faith

1. No boasting (excluded)
2. Law of works
3. Law of faith
4. Conclusion
  1. By faith
  2. Through faith
5. Establish the law

# ROMANS | Grace & Faith - Examples

## Grace & Faith

1. Abraham (Romans 4:1-6, 9-22)
  1. Faith counted for righteousness
  2. Before the law
  3. In uncircumcision
  4. Circumcision (sign of righteousness in uncircumcision)
  5. The father of circumcision
2. David (Romans 4:7-8)
  1. Same blessedness as Abraham

# ROMANS | Grace & Faith - Examples

## Grace & Faith

### 2. David (Romans 4:7-8)

1. Same blessedness as Abraham
2. Under the law
3. God imputes righteousness without works

### 3. Conclusion – The Gospel of God & Christ

1. Things written for our sake
2. Believe on God that raised Christ from the dead
3. Christ was delivered for offences & raised for justification
4. Believe and righteousness imputed

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# ROMANS | INTRODUCTION | LESSON 5

## Objective

- To examine redemption benefits for those justified by faith, the much more love of God, the one-man Adam and the one-man Christ. (Romans 5)

# ROMANS | Redemption & Justification Benefits

## Justification

### 1. Definition

- The process of imputing the righteousness of God in Christ to the one whose heart believes in Christ's death for their sins, His burial, and resurrection which results in a righteous standing in God's sight instead of the previous under sin, guilty before God standing.

# ROMANS | Redemption & Justification Benefits

## Justification

### 2. Benefits

1. We have peace with God
2. We have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand
3. Rejoice in hope of the glory of God
4. Glory in tribulations
  1. Tribulation – patience
  2. Patience – experience
  3. Experience – hope
  4. Hope maketh not ashamed

# ROMANS | The Much More Love of God

1. Shed abroad in our hearts
2. By the Holy Ghost (given unto us)

When & While We Were	The Love of God
When without strength	Christ died for the ungodly
While ye sinners	Christ died for us
	Much more then, being justified, we shall be saved from wrath through Him
When we were enemies	We were reconciled to God
	Much more, being reconciled, we shall be saved by His life

# ROMANS | The Much More Love of God

ADAM	CHRIST
Sin, transgression, offence, death	Grace, free gift, righteousness, life
All have sinned, many be dead	Grace and gift abounded unto many
Judgment to condemnation	Free gift of many offences unto justification
The reign of death	Receive abundant grace & gift of righteousness shall reign in life
Offence by one judgment came upon all men to condemnation	Righteousness of one the free gift came upon all men unto justification of life
Disobedience – many made sinners	Obedience – shall many be made righteous
Law – sin abounded	Grace did much more abound

# ROMANS | Baptism (the operation of God)

## Baptism

1. Washing of the pure water of the Word in the heart
2. Makes one holy
3. Not water baptism
4. By the Spirit into Christ's death, burial, resurrection
5. Dead to sin and alive to God

# ROMANS | Dead to Sin and Alive unto God

## Dead to Sin

1. No longer live in sin (live in and walk in)
2. Old man crucified
  1. Sin's mastership over the body
  2. No longer have to serve sin

## Alive unto God

1. Free from sin
2. Walk in newness of life

# ROMANS | Fruit unto Holiness

## Fruit unto Holiness

### 1. No longer servants of uncleanness

1. Let not sin reign in mortal body (obey its lusts)
2. Yield not members as instruments of unrighteousness
3. Not under the law
4. Iniquity unto iniquity
5. Now ashamed
6. End = death

# ROMANS | Fruit unto Holiness

## Fruit unto Holiness

### 2. Servants of righteousness

1. Yield unto God as those alive from the dead
2. Yield members as instruments of righteousness unto God
3. Under grace
4. Obey from the heart
5. Yield members servants to righteousness unto holiness
6. Free from sin, servants to God
7. Fruit unto holiness
8. End = everlasting life

# ROMANS | Dead to the Law

## Dead to the Law

1. Marriage under the law – sin and death
2. Dead to law by body of Christ
3. Married to another – Christ raised from the dead
4. Bring forth fruit unto God
5. Serve in newness of spirit

# ROMANS | Dead to the Law

## The Law & Sin in the Body

1. The law is not sin – the knowledge of sin
2. Sin takes occasion by the commandment – works all manner of sin
3. Alive without the law – commandment came, sin revives, and you die
4. Sin by the commandment deceives and slays
5. The law is holy, just, and good
6. The law not made death – make sin appear sin – exceeding sinful

# ROMANS | Dead to the Law

## The Law & Sin in the Body

7. The law is spiritual – man is carnal
8. Duality by spiritual baptism yet in this mortal body

Sin Dwelling in us (“I”)	New Man (“I”)
“that which I do”	“I allow not”
“that do I not”	“what I would”
“that do I”	“but what I hate”
“sin that dwelleth in me” “I know that in me (dwelleth no good thing)”	“I consent unto the law – good”
“but how to perform good I find not”	“for to will is present with me”
“I do not”	“for the good that I would”
“that I do”	“but the evil which I would not”

# ROMANS | Serving God with Our “spirit”

## Serving God with Our “spirit”

1. A law found – “when I would do good, evil is present with me”
2. I delight in the law of God after the inward man.
3. Another law in members warring against the law of my mind (O wretched man)
  1. Bringing me into captivity to the law of sin
  2. Law of sin is in our members
4. With the mind I myself serve the law of God
5. With the flesh the law of sin

# ROMANS | INTRODUCTION | LESSON 7

## Objective

- To examine walking after the flesh or Spirit, suffering with Christ, glorified with Christ, the Spirit's help, God's purpose, and nothing can separate from God's love in Christ. (Romans 8)

# ROMANS | Walking After the Flesh or Spirit

## Walking After the Flesh or Spirit

1. No condemnation – walking after the Spirit
  1. The law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus hath made us free from the law of sin and death.
2. The law weak through the flesh could not do
  1. Christ condemned sin in the flesh
  2. That the righteousness of the law be fulfilled in us (walk after the Spirit)
3. How to “walk”?
  1. The use of the “mind”
  2. What you “mind” determines your “walk”

# ROMANS | Walking After the Flesh or Spirit

“after the flesh”	“after the Spirit”
“do mind the things of the flesh”	“do mind the things of the Spirit”
“carnally minded”	“spiritually minded”
“death”	“life and peace”
“carnal mind is enmity against God”	“spiritual mind is peace with God”
“carnal mind not subject to the law of God” – nor can be	“Spirit of God dwell in you”
“cannot please God”	“Spirit is life because of righteousness”
“live after the flesh, ye shall die”	“shall quicken your mortal bodies” – ye shall live
	“mortify the deeds of the body, through the Spirit
	“led by the Spirit of God” – “sons of God”
“spirit of bondage to fear”	“not received the spirit of bondage to fear”

# ROMANS | Suffering with Christ

## Suffering with Christ

1. “sons of God”
2. Spirit bears witness with our spirit
  1. We are the children of God
  2. Heirs of God, joint-heirs with Christ
3. Suffer with Him – Glorified together
  1. We are not yet glorified together with Christ
  2. We suffer with Him until glory
  3. We will encounter suffering in our walk

# ROMANS | Suffering with Christ – Glorified Together

## Suffering with Christ

1. The sufferings of this present time
  1. The vanity, bondage of corruption, groaning, travailing, and pain of creation
2. Glorified Together
  1. Glory revealed in us
  2. Glorious liberty of the children of God
  3. The whole of creation earnestly expects and waits
  4. The hope of the Creator
  5. The redemption of our body

# ROMANS | The Spirit's Help

## The Spirit's Help

1. The firstfruits of the Spirit
  1. Groan within ourselves
  2. The redemption of our body
2. Saved by hope
  1. With patience wait for it
3. Helps our infirmities
  1. Spirit makes intercession – we know not what to pray
  2. The mind of the Spirit – the will of God

# ROMANS | God's Purpose

## God's Purpose

1. All things work together for God
  1. To them that love God
  2. To them who are the called according to His purpose
2. Foreknowledge
3. Predestination – to be conformed to the image of Christ
4. Called
5. Justified
6. Glorified

# ROMANS |

Nothing Can Separate from God's Love

## Nothing Can Separate from God's Love

1. God is for us
2. God with Christ will freely give us all things
3. God's elect – God's response of justification
4. Christ's intercession – Christ's response of condemnation
5. No one nor anything can separate us from the love of God
6. More than conquerors through Christ (persuaded)

# ROMANS | Israel and Israel

## Israel and Israel

1. The Effect of the Word of God – Mercy, no works, compassion
  1. Not All Israel is of Israel – seed & children
  2. Children of the flesh – children of promise
  3. Counted for the seed – in Isaac
  4. Sarah – shall have a son
  5. Rebecca – children not of works, but of him that calleth

# ROMANS | Israel and Israel

## Israel and Israel

### 2. The Hardening of God

1. Shew power in thee
2. Whom He will
  1. Fault
  2. Resist will

# ROMANS | God's Much Longsuffering

## God's Much Longsuffering

### 1. God's Willingness – Wrath

1. Willing to shew His wrath
2. Make His power known

### 2. God's Endurance

1. With much longsuffering
2. Make known the riches of His glory

# ROMANS | God's Much Longsuffering

## God's Much Longsuffering

### 3. Vessels

1. Vessels of wrath fitted to destruction
2. Vessels of mercy
3. Jews and Gentiles

### 4. Israel – which followed after the law of right.

1. Hath not attained
2. Sought it not by faith – but by works
3. Stumbled at Jesus Christ

# ROMANS | The End of The Law for Righteousness

## The End of The Law for Righteousness

1. Israel not saved
2. Zeal of God – not according to knowledge
3. Ignorant of God's righteousness
4. Go about to establish own righteousness
5. Have not submitted to the righteousness of God
6. Christ – the end of the law for righteousness
  1. Everyone that believes
  2. No difference between Jew and Greek

# ROMANS | Israel's Rejection of Christ

## Israel's Rejection of Christ

1. Believe to call
2. Hear to believe
3. Preacher to hear
4. Sent to preach
5. Israel has heard but rejection
6. Provoked to jealousy by “a foolish nation”
7. Israel disobedient and gainsaying people

- To examine the remnant of Israel, Israel's stumbling & fall, Paul's provocation ministry, Israel's future, the natural and wild olive tree and branches, this mystery and prophecy, the counsel of God. (Romans 11)

# ROMANS | The Remnant of Israel

## Israel's Fall

1. A remnant according to the election of grace
  1. Grace – no more works
  2. Works – no more grace
2. Israel hath not obtained
3. Election hath obtained
4. Rest blinded – Isa. 29:10
  1. Table made a snare – Ps. 69:22-23

# ROMANS | Israel's Stumbling & Fall

## Israel's Stumbling & Fall

1. Stumbled to fall?
2. Through fall salvation is come unto the Gentiles
  1. Provoke Israel to jealousy
3. Israel's fall = the riches of the world
4. Israel's diminishing = the riches of the Gentiles
5. Israel's fulness = much more

# ROMANS | Paul's Provocation Ministry

## Paul's Provocation Ministry

1. Paul, the apostle of the Gentiles
2. Provoke to emulation them which are my flesh
  1. Verse 11 – salvation to Gentiles to provoke Israel to jealousy
3. Might save some of them
4. Casting away of Israel be the reconciling of the world
5. Receiving of Israel shall be life from the dead

# ROMANS | Natural & Wild Olive Trees & Branches

## Natural & Wild Olive Trees & Branches

1. Olive Tree – symbol of the channel of God's blessing in the earth (peace)
2. Wild Olive Tree – the world that which was given over but now reconciled
3. Firstfruit holy – the lump is also holy
4. Root holy – so are the branches
5. Some branches broken off – unbelieving Israel
6. Wild olive tree grafted in among them
  1. Partake of the root and fatness of the olive tree
7. Boast not against the branches

# ROMANS | Natural & Wild Olive Trees & Branches

## Natural & Wild Olive Trees & Branches

8. The branches broken off because of unbelief within the olive tree. (Severity)
9. Wild olive tree grafted in because of faith within the wild olive tree. (Goodness)
10. Take heed
  1. God spared not the natural branches - severity
  2. God will not spare the wild
  3. Continue in His goodness
  4. Natural branches grafted into their own olive tree

# ROMANS | This Mystery & Prophecy

## This Mystery

1. Be not ignorant
2. Be not wise in own conceits
3. Blindness in part is happened to Israel
4. Until the fulness of the Gentiles be come in

## Prophecy

1. All Israel shall be saved (Isa. 59:20-21)
2. Deliverer out of Sion – covenant to take away sins
3. The gifts and calling of God are without repentance

# ROMANS | The Counsel of God

## The Counsel of God

1. In times past the Gentiles believed not God
  1. Yet have now obtained mercy through Israel's unbelief
2. Even so has Israel not believed God
  1. That through your mercy they also may obtain mercy
3. For God concluded all in unbelief – to have mercy upon all

# ROMANS | The Counsel of God

## The Counsel of God

4. The depth of the riches of the wisdom and knowledge of God.
  1. Unsearchable are His judgments
  2. Ways past finding out
  3. Who hath known the mind of the Lord
  4. Who hath been His counsellor
  5. Who hath first given to him – to be recompensed to him again
  6. For of Him, through Him, and to Him – are all things
  7. To whom be glory for ever.

1. Good
2. Acceptable

## Let Love Be

1. Think Soberly
2. Live Like a Body
3. Labor Charitably
4. Kindly Affectioned
5. Bless and Curse Not
6. Condescend to Men of Low Estate
7. Recompense to No Man Evil for Evil

  2. Evil of those that avenge themselves – the sword revenges

# ROMANS | Love to Your Neighbor

## Love to Your Neighbor

1. Owe no man anything, but to love
2. All commandments are comprehended in love
  1. Love neighbor as thyself
3. Love worketh no ill to his neighbor

## Love Fulfills the Law

1. The law and the prophets hang upon two commandments
2. Walking after the Spirit in love fulfills the law

# ROMANS | Day At Hand

## Day At Hand

1. Know the time
2. High time to awake out of sleep
3. Salvation nearer than when we believed
4. The night far spent

# ROMANS | The Works of Darkness & Armour of Light

## The Works of Darkness

1. Cast off the works of darkness (night, sleep)
  1. Rioting and drunkenness (lust of the flesh)
  2. Chambering and wantonness (lust of the eyes)
  3. Stife and envying (pride of life)

## The Armour of Light

1. Put on the armour of light
2. Put on the Lord Jesus Christ
3. Make no provision for the flesh

# ROMANS | The Weaker & Stronger Brothers

The Weaker Brother – conscience limited before God

1. Limited in eating
2. Esteems one day above another

The Stronger Brother – conscience free before God

1. Free to eat all things
2. Esteems every day alike

# ROMANS | Instructions & Charity Among Brothers

## The Weaker Brother – conscience limited before God

1. Don't judge the stronger brother
2. God hath received him with his eating

## The Stronger Brother – conscience free before God

1. Don't despise the weaker brother

# ROMANS | Instructions & Charity Among Brothers

## Instructions & Charity Among Brothers

1. God hath received him
2. Another man's servant (not his master)
3. God is able to make him stand
4. Be fully persuaded in own mind
5. Lives unto the Lord – gives God thanks
6. Christ will judge
7. We will give account of oneself
8. Put no stumblingblock in brothers way
9. Walk charitably

# ROMANS | Instructions & Charity Among Brothers

## Instructions & Charity Among Brothers

10. Destroy not with meat whom Christ died
11. Let not good be evil spoken of
12. Kingdom of God not in meat or drink
  1. In righteousness, peace, and joy in Holy Ghost
13. Serve Christ in these things
  1. Acceptable to God
  2. Approved of men
14. Evil for that man who eateth with offence
15. Have faith to thyself before God – happy
16. He that doubts eat with offence, doesn't believe, sin

1. Grace given to Paul of God
2. Minister of Jesus Christ to the Gentiles
3. Ministering the gospel of God
4. That the offering up of the Gentiles – acceptable
  1. Sanctified by the Holy Ghost – (v. 19)
5. Glory in those things that pertain to God
6. Christ wrought in Paul to make Gentiles obedient
  1. By word
  2. By deed
  3. Through mighty signs and wonders

1. From Jerusalem and round about unto Illyricum
2. Fully preached the gospel of Christ
3. Strived to preach the gospel where Christ wasn't named

6. Take journey into Spain – first Jerusalem
7. Come in the fulness of the blessing of the gospel
