1984 Sister Charlotte Rhodes became President, she held that position until 1990. After leaving her post as President, Sister Charlotte Rhodes continued working with the food pantry as a participate, and she continue her working relationship with the Community Basket Distributions.

- Mother and Daughter Luncheon
- Supported our Missionary in Africa Sister Leslie Pelt

2000-2002 Deacon Lillie Douglas was elected President under her leadership the Missionary Board continues to support the Evangelist and Outreach Programs.

2002 -2010 Minister Marie Blue became the Missionary President where she continued, the Prison Ministry, and she led:

- Bible Studies for Juveniles
- Bible studies in nursing facility

2010-2018 Sister Cynthia Rice became Missionary Board President, under her leadership:

- God blessed us with Markland. Formally called Little Angels which serviced children with special needs. The Missionary Board ministered to the children with Christmas in July.
- Wayside/Pads was established The Missionary Board ministered every other month and serve lunch.
- Evangelistic efforts continued as we minister to the homeless at Tent City, working alone with the Sewing Ministry creating blankets for newborns and sick and shut in.

2018-2021 Minister April Brock:

- The Coat Drive and Missionary Training projects stated by Brother Leroy Brock.
- The Missionaries continued serving at a local nursing facility ministering to patients through Bible Studies, and various activities.

2022 Brother French Harper and Troyce Aderogba became the first Co-Chairs to the Missionary Board.
