ICEBREAKER:

• If you could instantly become an expert at 1 thing, what would it be?

OUESTIONS:

These questions are based off the sermon that took place on Sunday. In this time, feel free to revisit any of the scripture that was discussed in the message.

- 1) Have you ever formed a "hurting huddle" with some folks to commiserate with one another? Did you find that it freed you from your issue or did it make it worse?
- 2) Pastor Brian said, "whoever you connect to, will direct you." Where have you experienced this positively in your life? Negatively?
- 3) "The person you see, is the person you will be!" How do you see yourself when you look in the mirror? How can the critical voice turn to a coach? What is the difference between a critic vs. coach?
- 4) Has there ever been a time when God has asked you to do the unthinkable so He can do the improbable? (describe the situation and what led you to take this faith step)
- 5) Go around the group and have everyone share some of the greatest blessings in their life that they need to show gratitude to the Lord for?
- 6) Have you or someone you know shown God thankfulness in, not for, a terrible situation? *(describe the circumstances with the group)*
- 7) Who is someone in your life right now that needs to be seen? How can you acknowledge them this week? (Feel free to swing by the church and grab a #weseeyou card to give them)

PRAYER:

- Make sure that everyone has a chance to share.
- Have someone type your requests up so the group can recall them throughout the week.
- Encourage and welcome all praise reports!
- Do not get overwhelmed about the time of prayer, pray however your group feels comfortable. This can either be one person pray, or you can go in a circle and have each person pray a few sentences! Be sure to change it up so your group grows together.
