The Lord's Supper, A Loving Fellowship

Jesus sits down with his closest friends for one last meal. For the Jews (which Jesus and His friends were), eating together was a sacred event. In fact, Jeremias points out five implications of Jewish/Christian meals:

- 1) Jewish meals demonstrated deep affinity (agape love) between the participants. It was a declaration of kinship.
- 2) Jewish meals were sacred events because God's presence was invoked through the blessing. They were not merely thanking God for the food; they were inviting him to be present at the table.
- 3) Table fellowship with Jesus most often indicated that you were part of his new family. Furthermore, the least and the lost were uniquely welcomed to eat with him.
- 4) Meals with Jesus were celebration feasts. They declared the inauguration of the kingdom – redemption and forgiveness.
- 5) After Jesus' ascension, the communal meals of the church remembered Jesus. As a result these meals were used as opportunities for benevolence.

All of this is the backdrop of Jesus' last supper.
