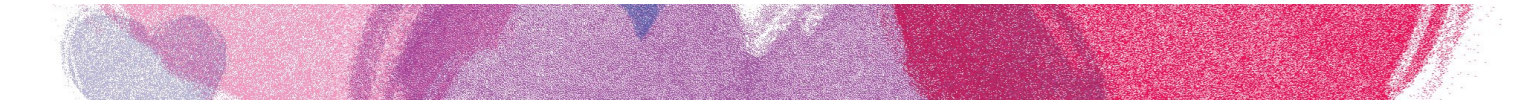

# Senior Pastor

Greetings,

I shared this article with you about a year ago and in preparing the message for this article, I thought I should share it again. This is an article from The Christian Post of a question and answer interview with Dr. Michael L. Brown about his book entitled WHY SO MANY CHRISTIANS HAVE LEFT THE FAITH. The reason I want to share this article again is that it seems to still be true today and many people, as I shared with you in last week’s message, are very critical when it comes to identifying the church or identifying with the church. Criticism comes from that, sad to say, from inside the church as well as from outside the church. If we could only identify with the description of the early New Testament Church in Acts 2:42-47 what a difference the church would be, both inside and outside.

The article begins by stating that in recent years, a large number of believers in the United States and many prominent Christian leaders have left Christianity and no longer have any religious affiliation. From that first statement we see that it’s only gotten worse. Just last week I read another article that was also very disturbing. It stated that “42 percent of the pastors serving today and considering retiring or leaving ministry completely. The reasons were about all the same. And to put those reasons in common good ol’ country boy terms, which that’s what I am, they said they were tired of trying to work with disobedience, critical people who were claiming to be Christians but showed no visible evidence in the way they lived their lives. Dr. Brown in his book addresses this issue by reaching out to many of those who have left and also seeking their reasons for leaving and to show them why they should return. He states that this is something he hasn’t seen before in his 51 years knowing the Lord.

Here is one question that was asked in this interview.

“You listed numerous factors that you believe are creating this falling away in American Christianity. They included the rise of New Atheist writers, the politicizing of the Gospel, public scandals of Church leaders, and so forth. Which of these factors do you believe contributes the most to the falling away of American Christians?”

He follows with this answer. “Honestly, I don’t think there’s any one factor. When I talk to different people who are on the front lines of answering questions that strugglers have and others who are doing youth ministry, each one will tell me something different.

I’ve watched how the objections that became very popular with the New Atheists about 16 or 17 years ago with the rise of Richard Dawkins and Sam Harris and Christopher Hitchens and others, that those trickle their way down to the culture so that there’s more of a skepticism toward the Bible and more of an antagonism toward God. I’ve seen that unmistakably.

I’ve seen the arguments of agnostic scholars like Bart Ehrman and how that’s trickles down to people thinking that the New Testament is not trustworthy. I’ve seen how many – especially younger people – have been driven away from the church, because they have associated the church as an appendage to a particular political party and associated the Gospel with being rightwing or something like that.

I’ve seen how leadership scandals have made people wonder, ‘Who can I really trust?’ I’ve seen how the abundance of iniquity, as Jesus said, ‘because iniquity will abound, the love of many will wax cold.’ I’ve seen how that’s hurt people. Porn being so ubiquitous and how many people have struggled with

it, then fall under guilt, condemnation and fall away.

So, in that sense, it's a bit of a perfect storm. And then also, I list the effects of a compromised Gospel, that our failure to preach a clear call to discipleship and a clear message of the cross for a whole generation has produced a lot of Christians who really aren't Christians at all. They heard a form of the Gospel, which is kind of a positive life coach approach, but haven't really been transformed. So, all these factors coming together have created the situation in which we find ourselves."

This is a great article and paints a pretty bleak picture of Christianity and the Church, but it goes along with what I have shared with you several times before and that is, "God's church is not in trouble. It's man's church that's in trouble." For me, as I prepare each week, I want to make sure that what I give you is the truth of God's Word. It's every believer's responsibility to stand against the false teachings as the Apostle John has told us in 1 John 1-5 and to "speak Jesus." (Read 1 John to get the picture.)

# Refuge Ministry

Brothers and sisters, in the name of Jesus Christ, we greet you once more. We pray that this reading finds you well and blessed by our Lord and Savior. We are moving right along in this new year, and we are wanting to tackle new challenges as we do so. In last month's article we talked about being bold in the things that God has called us to do and in the people that God has called us to be. However, when we choose to be bold, we must also deal with some of the inevitable distractions and detractors that come with living in a fallen world.

One of the greatest distractions that we can face in life as believers are myths or lies about things that we might need. The myths are often rooted in misinformation or are formed by lack of trust. Lies are inventions by those who are afraid of the things that are being offered as solutions or just plain nonsense. In either case, it is always best to evaluate the myths or lies from the perspective of what is real versus what is a perception of reality.

So, today we are going to address three of the top myths/lies related to Christian counseling. We hope that this will be helpful and informative, as we believe it is always necessary to combat falsehoods with truth. This speaks to the heart of why so many do not seek the assistance that is available through Christian counseling. This speaks to why so many continue to struggle in life, lacking the help they so desperately need. Let us now speak truth, hope, and life against these damaging myths and lies. Myth #1. Christian counselors will judge and condemn me for the things that I have done. First things first, God is the only one capable of judging any of us. He is the only one righteous or just enough to do so. Second, judging or condemning you is not the role that a Christian counselor is to take. They instead are to help you see the need for God's assistance to address the issues or struggles that a person is facing. They are also to be encouragers to the person that is going through God's corrective plan for their lives. This is the nature of the Christian counselor's role, and they would be doing a disservice to their calling, if they did anything contrary to this.

Myth #2. Christian counselors cannot or will not understand me and all of my problems. This is an improperly presented statement. Only God knows and fully understands you and all the things that you are going through in life. However, He has gifted and equipped some of His people with an extra degree of sympathy, an extra measure of empathy, and an extra helping of understanding and discernment. God's counselors will readily use these gifts and equipping to ensure that people in need will get the help that they deserve. We should also consider that counselors are people too, who might have been delivered from things that gives them a level of experience and understanding that might be helpful as well. This would serve as a blessing being passed on, so that someone else could be blessed by it.

Myth #3. Christian counselors only want to preach to you, not help you. Preaching is not what a Christian counselor is called to do. Any Christian counselor worth their salt, knows this and does not operate in a preaching manner. Instead, they should be directing you to what God's word says about your specific situation. They should be encouraging you to change with the assistance of God's word. They should be sincere accountability partners, honest and faithful confidants, and trustworthy and dependable helpers. If they are focused on being these things, they surely cannot have time to preach to you. But they can share with you God's truth, with grace and mercy, so that you can find the hope, help, and healing that you need.

Today, we covered the top three myths/lies about Christian counseling. There are plenty more misconceptions, misunderstandings, and misrepresentations of Christian counselors. And hopefully, we will at another time be able to address them. Should any of you, have questions or concerns regarding Christian counseling, we would love to hear from you. We would love to potentially address them in an article if that is God's desire. We want those of you reading, to just know that God is in the midst of this ministry effort.

# Women’s Ministry

### Trusting In Christ

“Trust in Him at all times, you people; pour out your hearts to Him, for God is our refuge.” Psalms 62:8

How do we trust in Christ in the way that Psalms 62:8 states, to “trust in Him at all times?” Well, to be able to trust in someone, we must know that person and know their character, spend time with them and build a relationship together. Relationships take time, effort, and sacrifice and so, we must decide which relationships in our lives we are going to pursue and pour into. According to God’s word and by His actions we know that He wants a deep and personal relationship with us, I mean, He *is* offering us to be with Him for eternity! God sent His One and Only Son to live a perfect and holy life, suffer and die for our sins on the cross and defeat death, rising three days later, so that we may be forgiven, made new and live in eternity with Him. (John 3:16).



God wants to be the most important relationship we pursue in our lives. ## The Lion of Judah

Jesus is often referred to as the **Lion of Judah**. Let's take a look at where this title came from and what it means for us and how the lion is used in Scriptural imagery.

Lion symbolizes royalty, courage, strength, and power. The Biblical lion, mentioned in almost half of the Bible books, is smaller than African lion. In the Old Testament, there are eight Hebrew words for lion for various ages and gender. And, as many words are used for lion, there are many comparisons to a lion throughout Scripture.

The Israelites were very familiar with the imagery of lions in Scripture. This first mention of lion imagery is in **Genesis 49:9**. As the patriarch Jacob ("Israel") is reaching the end of his life, he is passing on his blessing to his 12 sons. Judah was the fourth of his twelve sons. The descendants of these sons formed the twelve tribes of Israel.

**Genesis 49:8-12** <sup>8</sup> *Judah, thou art he whom thy brethren shall praise: thy hand shall be in the neck of thine enemies; thy father's children shall bow down before thee.* <sup>9</sup> *Judah is a lion's whelp: from the prey, my son, thou art gone up: he stooped down, he couched as a lion, and as an old lion; who shall rouse him up?* <sup>10</sup> *The scepter shall not depart from Judah, nor a lawgiver from between his feet, until Shiloh come; and unto him shall the gathering of the people be.* <sup>11</sup> *Binding his foal unto the vine, and his ass's colt unto the choice vine; he washed his garments in wine, and his clothes in the blood of grapes:* <sup>12</sup> *His eyes shall be red with wine, and his teeth white with milk.*

Thus Jacob's blessing became a symbol to the tribe of Judah when he refers to his son Judah as "Young Lion", a whelp.

A reference to the tribe of Judah becomes a reference to the human or natural lineage of Christ through the patriarch Jacob as listed in **Matt 1:1-2** *The book of the generation of Jesus Christ, the son of David, the son of Abraham. Abraham begat Isaac; and Isaac begat Jacob; and Jacob begat Judas and his brethren;*

The Israelites knew lions from the pastoralists – those herding sheep – those out in the pastures protected flocks from lions, shepherds such as David protected flocks.

**1 Sam 17:34,36** *But David said to Saul, "Your servant was tending his father's sheep. When a lion or a bear came and took a sheep from the flock, ... your servant has killed both the lion and the bear;* While lions stalked hills and thickets of Palestine and had lairs in the thickets of the Jordan River, they were no real threat to the general population. But they were fearsome. Their roar can be heard for miles. This added to the fear factor. Thus, lions were often a symbol of dread.

**Psalms 57:4** *My soul is among lions; I must lie among those who devour, Among sons of mankind whose teeth are spears and arrows, And their tongue is a sharp sword.*

But a lion was also used as a symbol of our Enemy, Satan.

**1 Peter 5:8** *Be of sober spirit, be on the alert. Your adversary, the devil, prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour.*

Today, the lion is still traditionally regarded as the symbol of the tribe of Judah (in Hebrew: *Yehuda*). The **Lion of Judah** is still used as a Jewish national and cultural symbol. The municipality's "seal of the city of Jerusalem" incorporates it into their coat of arms. The seal's design consists of a shield with the Lion of Judah flanked on either side by olive branches and superimposed on a stylized background representing the Western Wall. Above the main display is the Hebrew-language word for Jerusalem.

Many Christian organizations and ministries today use the lion of Judah as their emblem or even as their names.

Even in culture, we see the lion used to represent Christ. Aslan, a lion, is a major character in C. S. Lewis's *The Chronicles of Narnia* series. C.S. Lewis often capitalizes the word *lion* in reference to Aslan since he parallels Jesus as the "Lion of Judah" in Christian theology. The word *aslan* means "*lion*" in Turkish.



# Integritas Men's Ministry Continued

In one of his last letters, Lewis wrote, "Since Narnia is a world of Talking Beasts, I thought He [Christ] would become a Talking Beast there, as He became a man here. I pictured Him becoming a lion there because (a) the lion is supposed to be the king of beasts; (b) Christ is called "The Lion of Judah" in the Bible; (c) I'd been having strange dreams about lions when I began writing the work."

Finally, The Lion of Judah is mentioned in the Book of Revelation of the New Testament as a term representing Jesus of Nazareth. Many Christians interpret this as a reference to the Second Coming.

**Rev 5:3-8** *And no one in heaven or on the earth or under the earth was able to open the scroll or to look into it. 4 Then I began to weep greatly because no one was found worthy to open the scroll or to look into it. 5 And one of the elders said to me, "Stop weeping; behold, the Lion that is from the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, has overcome so as to be able to open the scroll and its seven seals." 6 And I saw between the throne (with the four living creatures) and the elders a Lamb standing, as if slaughtered, having seven horns and seven eyes, which are the seven spirits of God sent out into all the earth. 7 And He came and took the scroll out of the right hand of Him who sat on the throne. 8 When He had taken the scroll, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb, each one holding a harp and golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints.*

As history comes to a close, with the second coming of Christ, we see Christ represented as a Lion and a Lamb.

These seem to conflict. Aren't these two animals diametrically opposed? Yes, diametrically is a big word for a Marine but, this really seems to be a perplexing combination. Yet it demonstrates combination of God as a Warrior overcoming His (and our) enemies and God as a Suffering Servant when he died on the cross – our Sacrificial Lamb.

This is strength through obedience and sacrifice. Christ went willingly to the Cross but he still held and holds power beyond measure.

The righteous can be lions. Have you been made righteous in Christ? Are you a lion for Christ? Are you counted among those belonging to Christ, The Lion of Judah?

**The wicked flee when no one is pursuing, But the righteous are bold as a lion. Prov 28:1** We live in a world that is calling "good evil, and evil good" **Isa 5:20** We need to be as bold as our Savior, The Lion of Judah. We need to address evil and turn it around. And by turning it around we go from "evil" to "live". And as Christians we live a new life in Christ for: *"I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me. Gal 2:20.*

Be like *"The lion, which is mighty among animals, And does not retreat from anything," Prov 30:30.* Speak Jesus!

## WHAT WE'RE TEACHING

Sunday School:

### ANSWERS BIBLE CURRICULUM: Unit 4 – Chosen: God's Promises to Abraham and Isaac

In February, we are splitting back up the High School and Middle School classes and starting a rotational teaching team! We will finish Unit 4 of Answers Bible Curriculum and start Unit 5. This month, we will learn about God's testing of Abraham, God's providence in a bride for Isaac, and Esau's sin in despising his birthright. We'll have our Unit 4 Jeopardy Review Game and donuts too! Through our study we'll discover the importance of making sure our values are shaped by faith in God, the connection of Abraham's test and Jesus' sacrifice, and why this all matters for us today!



Youth Group:

### How to Speak Jesus: A Practical Study on How to Share the Good News about Jesus to Others

In January, the youth shared a lot of real and challenging reasons why they don't share Jesus with others. Fear showed up in 79% of the responses with many specifying a fear of what others will think or losing a friend. Other common reasons included "not knowing what to say," "not wanting to come off too strong," and "it being a hard topic to talk about." 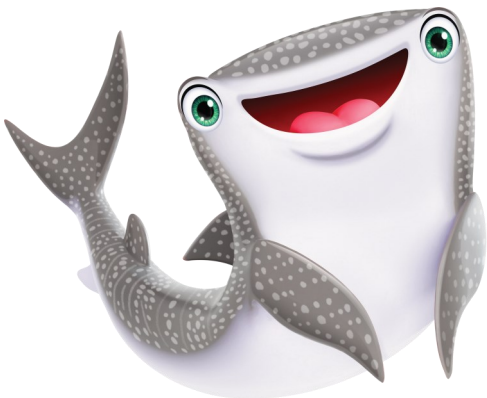
