

Harvest Time

I had the pleasure of speaking to our PrimeTimers during the month of September. Our theme was "Harvest Time" and I used John 4:35 as my central passage.

John 4:35 (ESV) records Jesus' words: "Do you not say, 'There are yet four months, then comes the harvest'? Look, I tell you, lift up your eyes, and see that the fields are white for harvest." This verse is spoken by Jesus during His conversation with the Samaritan woman at the well. It was a pivotal moment in His ministry that reveals both His heart for the lost and the urgency of the gospel mission.

In the context of John 4, Jesus has just revealed Himself as the Messiah to a Samaritan woman, breaking social and religious barriers. As the woman leaves to tell her town about Jesus, the disciples return and are surprised to find Him speaking with her. Jesus uses this moment to teach His disciples about spiritual priorities. While they are concerned with physical food, Jesus points them to a greater spiritual reality: the readiness of people's hearts to receive the gospel.

Often, we find ourselves so focused on our own issues, problems, or worldly desires that we neglect to even notice the state of the "lost" around us. The phrase "lift up your eyes" is a call to spiritual awareness. Jesus urges His followers to look beyond the immediate and the physical, to see the spiritual needs around them.

The "fields" represent people—specifically, the Samaritans who are coming out of the town to meet Jesus because of the woman's testimony (John 4:28-30.) We are surrounded by fields of people searching for the truth. Think of the last couple of weeks and the revival we are seeing after the death of Charlie Kirk. Young people want to know more about faith. They need to hear the gospel. They need to know Truth. They need to trust in Jesus!

The "harvest" is the gathering of souls into God's kingdom. Jesus challenges the common saying about waiting for the harvest, declaring that the time for spiritual harvest is now. The Holy Spirit is at work. He is moving in the hearts of people, and we are needed to bring the harvest.

John 4:35 teaches several key truths. First, the urgency of evangelism: the opportunity to share the gospel is always present, and believers must be ready and willing to act (Matthew 9:37-38). The time is not tomorrow. It is now!

Second, the inclusivity of the gospel: Jesus' interaction with a Samaritan woman shows that God's salvation is for all people, regardless of background (Galatians 3:28). We do not have the luxury or option to share Jesus only with those we like or look or behave like us. The gospel is for everyone!

Third, the necessity of spiritual vision: Christians are called to see people as God sees them—lost and in need of a Savior. We see beautiful people, smart people, and talented people. Jesus sees the heart and the desire to know Him.

For Christians today, John 4:35 is a powerful reminder that the world is full of people ready to hear about Jesus. The fields are still white for harvest. We are called to lift our eyes, see the need, and faithfully proclaim the good news of Christ, trusting that God will bring the increase (1 Corinthians 3:6-7). Remember, we are called to obedience. God does the rest.



I concluded my talk with seven things we need to do to be ready for the harvest.

We must be available.

We must be willing.

We must pray for opportunities.

We must live our life reflecting Christ.

We must share Jesus clearly.

We should trust the Spirit and His work.

We are to disciple the new believer.

Refuge Ministry

Brothers and sisters in Christ, greetings. May the grace, love, and mercy be upon you. There are times in our collective lives when we face uncertainty. When we face adversity. When we face doubt and when we face fear. In those times, the answer is always the same...God. There is no trick to how to face any of those things. There is no special formula you have to take or memorize in order to have those things resolved. The answer is simply to see God, in humility and with a contrite heart. That is, it...sort of. That is, it, if you have a genuine relationship with God.

We find this very situation and answer spelled out for us in the words of **2 Chronicles 7:14** which declares, "if my people who are called by my name humble themselves, and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and heal their land." This often referred to verse, comes up when there are great struggles. It comes up as a plea to return to God's will and ways for man. And while much emphasis is put on the instructions here, there is a tendency to overlook what actions proceeded these instructions and what actions were warned against.

If we look at the passages that come before, we see that in verses 1 through 3, that the Spirit of God, through fire is made present before Solomon and those present. This was in direct response to Solomon's prayer for the people, found in **2 Chronicles 6**. The prayer was that God would make Himself known to the people of Israel, especially if they had fallen into errant behavior. Solomon called for the correction of God to be made clear to the people. Solomon also pleaded that there be a blessing to follow the correction of the Lord. Solomon went about dedicating himself, the people, and the temple to the honor and glory of God.

This is what leads God to declaring the words of chapter 7, verse 14, "if my people who are called by my name humble themselves, and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and heal their land.". It is clear. It is concise. We are to humble ourselves. We are to pray and seek God. We are to turn away from the things that displease God. Then and only then, will God hear us, forgive us, and bless us, as He, God, sees fit to do so. And these things will happen in the good timing of the Lord.

The other piece to this is, follows in verses 19 through 22. The people are warned that if they disobey the commandments and guidance of God that there would be dire consequences. This is a warning to us, just as the words of chapter 7 and verse 14 are a promise. If we go back to the sinful behavior and we do so willingly, God will dismiss us. If we chose to serve little gods or pursue the things of this world instead of Him, He will not bless us. And He will not return His hand a favor to us, until we follow the instructions of 2 Chronicles 7:14.

What are you facing today, that you have not turned to God for help? What actions in your own life, have you not taken responsibility for? What things do you need to turn away from? And how desperately do you need to humble yourself, pray to God, and seek Him with everything that you have? Do you need help finding your way again? If so, know that is why God has placed the church and the Refuge Ministry Center in your life so that we can assist you by coming alongside of you and helping you walk back to God. The Ten Commandments - 10th Commandment - Exodus 20:17

You shall not covet.

"You shall not covet your neighbor's house; you shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his male slave, or his female slave, or his ox, or his donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbor."

The positive side – Be satisfied or Be content with what you have.

Well, here we are at the 10th Commandment. Can you recall them all? Do you need to? I'd say based on what we've learned already, **YES**. Why do we need the 10 Commandments? Let's save that answer for the end. This commandment should be leading us away from coveting and toward contentment.

Greed. This is what we are really dealing with when we look at coveting. Greed isn't good. It is a raw, festering, soul-eating desire for something you don't have but feel you deserve. In reality, it is questioning the wisdom of what God has provided for you or his ability to provide for you. In Ray Comfort's devotional, "Wisdom for Life", there is a poignant piece on greed. It references a movie featuring a speech by Michael Douglas about ethics in the 1987 movie *Wall Street*. He said, "*The point is, ladies and gentlemen, that greed – for the lack of a better word – is good. Greed is right. Greed works. Greed clarifies, cuts through, and captures the essence of the evolutionary spirit. Greed, in all its forms—greed for life, for money, for love, knowledge-has marked the upward surge of mankind."*

Did you catch the evolutionary reference? This is a secular, godless approach to purge our lives of any spiritual or moral purity. It focuses on survival of the fittest. It is evolution at its highest point of disregard for God. Law becomes a changing entity based on what man wants for himself. There is no limit or bounds on what someone can do. There are no boundaries. Law, God's Law, becomes irrelevant. Morality becomes mundane. Greed becomes a goal. Everyone's reality is their own and we sink into moral relativism. The thinking becomes, "What's right for me is determined by me." This thinking pulls us away from God. We no longer depend on Him. It becomes a self-focused purpose that can be insatiable. What's mine is mine. What's yours is mine.

Why would God include coveting in the same list as murder, stealing, and adultery? All sin leads back to covetousness. God knew coveting a neighbor's servant, ox, or wife was a steppingstone to ungratefulness and discontentment – even lying, stealing, murder, and adultery. Focusing on what others have diminishes our ability to appreciate the good things in our lives

Contentment, on the other hand, leads to peace of mind. It brings our focus back to God. It puts our dependance in place. Our Creator knows what we need and when we need it. He is always prepared to be there for us. But we must first turn to Him. He must have preeminence. He has promised watch care for His children. Let your conduct be without covetousness; be content with such things as you have. For He Himself has said, "I will never leave you nor forsake you." Heb 13:5

God wants us to delight in His Word, enjoy his creation, celebrate beauty and love, and rejoice in the harvest. God intended for his people to enjoy their relationship with Him. The law was intended to establish a foundation of the Jewish personal and property rights. It is what our modern legal system is based on today. Christian's today view the 10 Commandments as the foundation of God's moral law. What is the key to following these commandments? God provided the answer when He gave the commandments to the Israelites. You shall walk in all the ways which the Lord your God has commanded you, that you may live and that it may be well with you, and that you may prolong your days in the land which you shall possess. Deut 5:33 The real key comes in a following verse that tells us what our attitude before God ought



to be and how, as a result, we can avoid sin and maintain a right relationship with God. *And* the Lord commanded us to observe all these statutes, to fear the Lord our God, for our good always, that He might preserve us alive, as it is this day. ²⁵ Then it will be righteousness for us, if we are careful to observe all these commandments before the Lord our God, as He has commanded us. Deut 6:24-25

We are <u>to fear the Lord our God</u>. Not the fear that is dread, anxiety, terror, or stress. The word for fear in the Old Testament means "to stand before God with reverence and respect". In the New Testament, the most common meaning for fear means "living with a reverential awe that becomes the controlling motivation of our lives". So, it is out of a deep respect and obedience that we seek to follow the 10 Commandments. We can walk in the commandments as a deterrent to sin.

The bottom line to all the Commandments – Fear God and seek the knowledge God has revealed for us. *The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge; Fools despise wisdom and instruction.* Prov 1:7

The Pursuit of Wisdom Brings Security

Proverbs 2

- ¹My son, if you will receive my words and treasure my commandments within you,
- ²Make your ear attentive to wisdom; Incline your heart to understanding.
- ³ For if you cry out for insight, *And* raise your voice for understanding;
- ⁴ If you seek her as silver And search for her as for hidden treasures;
- ⁵ Then you will understand the fear of the Lord, And discover the knowledge of God.

Back to our question: Why do we need the 10 Commandments?

These 10 Commandments help us set boundaries for our lives and our society. Consider this study. A team of landscape architects, kind of like Noah Blake's yard service, studied the effects of providing a fence around a preschool playground. On playgrounds without fences, children tended to gather close to the school building and their teacher and didn't stray away. But on fenced-in playgrounds, they enjoyed the entire area. The researchers concluded that boundaries can create a greater sense of freedom. This seems counterintuitive to so many of us who think boundaries restrict enjoyment. Yet fences can provide freedom! This same concept applies to the 10 Commandments. Our wise Creator provided fencing for our safety and freedom – if we stay inside the fencing, we can enjoy the life God created for us to enjoy with Him and prosper.

The conclusion, when everything has been heard, is: fear God and keep His commandments, because this applies to every person. For God will bring every act to judgment, everything which is hidden, whether it is good or evil. Eccl 12:13-14

Then Jesus said to those Jews who believed Him, "If you abide in My word, you are My disciples indeed. And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free." John 8:31-32



Before you can harvest

Reading Genesis 1:11 reveals a necessity for the very beginning of growth, seeds. Without seeds, there is no plant or tree. Sowing seeds of faith is often compared to planting seeds. Each time you tell someone about your reason to have hope and joy, you are planting seeds. When you read a Bible verse to a child or share one with a non-believer, you are planting seeds.



Bringing in the Harvest

Jesus spoke parables to the people. In the Parable of the Weeds, the weeds that grew from the enemies seeds were gathered and destroyed at harvest. Then the grain was gathered and stored. In the parable of the Mustard Seed, the tiny little seed grew into a mighty tree. Nourish the seeds so that they may become firmly rooted in faith and rise up to overcome the weeds of the enemy.



Roots

Before planting a crop, farmers need to prepare the field.

(Consider the Parable of the Sower in Matthew 13.) Before seeds can sprout, they need to fall on fertile soil. Roots grow to anchor the plant. A plant without strong roots can easily be plucked out of the ground during a storm or wither from the sun. Our roots need to grow deep and strong to withstand the storms of life.
