Love God, Love People, Change Our World

Greetings,

Food for though, so to speak! I read an interesting little book recently that I want to share a brief paraphrase of the book with you as it deals with everyday life changing situations. And, it deals with change. Once people have embraced a worldview, regardless of what it is, they usually have a challenging time letting it go. The reasons for such are both common and understandable. First, changing worldviews can cause considerable embarrassment for you. Why? Because it involves admitting, even if it's only to yourself, that you may have been wrong. Second, it can be extremely unpopular with others when you appear to change your mind about something. This could possibly bring to you both ridicule and exclusion from people that know you and from places you least expect (from the world and from other believers).

Many times that's one of the reasons atheists are so difficult to reach for the Lord. They have proudly and boldly rejected Jesus and the church, sometimes for many years, and have been very open and boastful about their disbelief. For the vocal atheists to make a realization that if God really does exist, they've been wrong, and in this transition from atheist to Christian, that they will now have personal accountability. This is stated by many who say, more than anything else, this is why so many prefer atheism, no matter how compelling the case against it. There's no one to hold you accountable and many people just do not want to be held accountable for their beliefs or actions.

I'm sure you have witnessed to those who deny that Jesus Christ died for sinners and that we're all sinners and that His death and our acceptance of Him as Lord and Savior frees us from eternal death to eternal life. Let me share a few things about God that might help you witness to such a person, and they might just be a total surprise to them.

Here's just a few things the bible say about God: (1) God is transcendent (supernatural), declaring that not even the heavens can contain Him. (2) God is exceedingly powerful. (3) God is intentional, acting with purpose. (4) God is personal, having a mind that thinks. (5) God is righteous (moral) in all His ways. (6) God keeps His promises. And on and on that list could go.

One thing that many have difficult with is the statement that God is righteous. This not only makes God the most logical source for our objective morality, but it also makes Him the perfect judge of all unrighteousness. God is all knowing and the Psalmist says that He even knows the secret sins of our heart. And this leads us to a really sobering realization. This is a quote from one that I don't know who wrote it: "If our moral standards come from our Creator who is both morally perfect and perfectly just, and if some of our actions are intentionally immoral, our Creator not only has the right to cast righteous judgment on our moral shortcomings, He would disqualify Himself as being perfectly moral if He didn't." For God to overlook a moral trespass (sin) would mean He has a moral flaw, which is decisions and accepting or rejecting changes in our lives, so that we are not caught up in the world or our own personal desires when change comes about in our lives. It could just be the change that God knows we need in our life.

Iesus Came to Save the World

In John 3:16 we are told "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." This is the "why" of Jesus' mission. God loves us! His purpose is revealed in John 3:17. "For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him."

First, *John 3:17* reveals God's purpose in sending Jesus. Contrary to the expectation that the Messiah would come to judge or punish, Jesus' first coming was motivated by love and a desire to save. The word "condemn" means to declare guilty or to pass sentence. Jesus did not come to bring immediate judgment, but to offer salvation to a world already under the curse of sin (*Romans 3:23; 5:12*). This demonstrates God's mercy and patience, giving people the opportunity to repent and believe (*2 Peter 3:9*).

This idea is missed by so many. The lost are afraid of condemnation. They are afraid of the judgement. They are so afraid that many will lash out at the believer before the "saved" can pass judgement on the "lost." Jesus came first to offer salvation.

This idea was illustrated well during COVID. People were so afraid of being condemned for not following the prescribed cautions to keep from getting COVID that when they got sick, they did so in private and told few, if any, that they had COVID. They were more afraid of the judgement for getting sick than they were of the illness.

Second, the verse emphasizes the universal scope of Christ's mission: "the world might be saved through him." Salvation is not limited by ethnicity, nationality, or background. Jesus is the Savior for all who believe, fulfilling God's promise to bless all nations through Abraham's offspring (*Genesis 12:3; Galatians 3:8*).

No one is left out. It doesn't matter who you are, what you've done, or where you've been. It doesn't matter where you live or where you grew up. It doesn't matter who your parents were or what your social status is. Jesus offers salvation to everyone.

Finally, *John 3:17* highlights the exclusivity of salvation through Christ. The phrase "through him" makes it clear that Jesus is the only way to be reconciled to God (John 14:6; Acts 4:12). While God's love is extended to all, only those who trust in Christ receive forgiveness and eternal life.

There is no other way. There is no need for scolding, yelling, or judgement. There is just a hard and simple truth. Jesus is the only way. No other way works. It doesn't matter how "good" you are. It doesn't matter how much "good" you do. It doesn't matter how many people you love or care for. Without Jesus, there is no way to the Father.

To sum it up, *John 3:17* beautifully encapsulates the gospel: God's loving initiative, the offer of salvation to all, and the necessity of faith in Jesus. It calls every person to respond to God's grace, turning from sin and trusting in Christ alone for salvation (*Ephesians 2:8-9*).

Do you get it? Are you afraid of the judgement? Don't be. Everyone here is a sinner who has been forgiven. The consequence of sin is death, but the benefit of following Jesus is life. Everyone makes a choice. In the end there is judgement or forgiveness. Which one would you like to take with you when you meet Jesus. I chose forgiveness.





Refuge Ministry

Brothers and sisters in Christ, we greet in you love and peace. As we said in last month's article, we are entering into a terribly busy time of year. It's not just a busier time with school restarting, activities beginning, and major events happening. It's a busier time because it is now that the seasons begin to change, moods shift, and there are thoughts about how the year will end. While we are not quite there, yet. There are a number of things that our minds shift to, and they require our attention.

We think about the lengthy list of things that we set out to accomplish at the beginning of the year. How well have we done in our efforts? Did we hit the mark or are we a long way off? Did we ponder holiday arrangements, to include whose parents we will visit and for how long? Or is it that we are thinking about who will be coming to our homes? Then there are the concerns about the weather and all the things that go along with it.

However, what are any of these thoughts really about? Are all of our thoughts, in the coming days, about our plans, our goals, our desires? As we entertain those thoughts, let us ponder a few more. Has God approved those plans? Are they in alignment with the thoughts and plans, He has for us. What about those goals, do they serve to bring honor and glory to God? Or are they self-serving and leading towards our worldly fulfilment? What then about those desires, are they rooted in the desires of the Lord or are they desires that grow from dark places?

This line of inquiry was designed to cause us to pause for a moment as we enter into this much busier time. That pause is for us to reconsider our motivations and the things that we are driven to do. What should we be thinking about first? **Matthew 6:34-35** would be a suitable place to start. It reads, "But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you.³⁴ Therefore do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble." Seeking God's kingdom before the world is always a grand place to start and it assures that we are in alignment with God.

Where should we go from there, you ask? Simple, read the instructions that we are given in **Psalms 16:2-4**. It speaks to us like so, "All the ways of a man are pure in his own eyes, but the Lord weighs the spirit. Commit your work to the Lord, and your plans will be established. The Lord has made everything for its purpose, even the wicked for the day of trouble. Take what you have deemed worthy of doing and present to God for approval and if not approved, acknowledge that God is sovereign and knows what is best for us. In this you will avoid the wick days of unnecessary trouble.

And then we should follow things up with what? Glad you asked, we will find the answer in **Proverbs 3:5-6**. This guidance is as follows, for all of us, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight." This makes it clear that we should be trusting God in all things. And more importantly when we do trust God will take care of the rest. This is incredibly reassuring when there are too many things going on and we are getting overwhelmed.

We presented these thoughts and answers, because when things get too busy we often forget where to look for help. Sometimes we think our issues are too trivial for God. Other times we think that we have everything under control. Even still, in other moments we think that if we compartmentalize things, they will just go away. But in any of these situations, the answer is not what we can do in our own power, but what can God do in all of His power and authority? If you are ever struggling and looking for answers, encouragement or support, we are here. We are readily available, Monday through Thursday, from 9 am until 5 pm, and then on Fridays 9 am to noon. In His Presence (Part 2)

Last month we learned the importance of heart-driven obedience so that we are not like the horse or mule that must have a bit and bridle, or it will not obey (Psalm 32:8-9). We also recalled the life of David and how he understood the importance of acknowledging his sin and receiving God's forgiveness. Here is Part 2 of In His Presence:

"Because she is well-trained."

The words Ellie spoke about her horse, Whisper, played again in my mind as I thought about what God desires for His children. I wanted to be *well-trained* in my relationship with God and to please Him through my actions. First, I needed to obey the first and greatest commandment (Matthew 22:36-38). Loving Christ with my whole heart, soul and mind meant that I would also need to become intentional with the following:



- 1. Daily spend time with Him by reading His Word and praying (through personal Quiet Time).
- 2. Meditate on Scripture.
- 3. Pay attention to the Holy Spirit's guidance, promptings, convictions, nudges, etc. and obey right away.
- 4. Confess and repent of sin and ask Him to renew a right spirit within me.
- 5. Accept His forgiveness, discipline, and correction as part of my life-long training.

These practices became my daily training with the Master. This is what it meant to abide in Christ, and the training did not cease.

In seeking to love Christ with my whole heart, soul, and mind, I also desire to share these practices with others so that they too can walk in obedience to God's commands and live abundantly. I want others to experience His kindness that leads to repentance (Romans 2:4), knowing that He is faithful and just to forgive and to cleanse from all unrighteousness (1 John 1:9).



Forgiveness is a gift from a compassionate and loving Father. He desires to forgive us, but when we refuse to listen, it can hinder our prayers and prevent us from hearing Him. Also, the consequences may have lasting effects. "What we refuse to learn through instruction, God may teach us through struggle," says author and Bible teacher, Wayne Stiles. "God's Word is our teacher-a great teacher- but struggle is a substitute teacher."

God's Word clearly states to not be like the horse or mule who must be controlled by the bit and bridle. He desires a teachable spirit, and obedience is the mark of every transformed believer. When we spend time in His presence and heed His commands, we become more than well-trained followers of Jesus. We become willing vessels ready to be used for His kingdom and for His glory.

Ellie returned to the barn for her lesson on Whisper. This time her horse did not need to be led to the round pen to release energy. Tacked with saddle, bit, and bridle, she was ready. Whisper's calm demeanor

revealed that she had been regularly training with the instructor.

I listened carefully when Mr. Bill said that his chief goal in training a horse is to develop a positive relationship so that there is no need for the whip AT ALL! Instead, his goal is to instruct using only his body, his hand movements, and really, just *his very presence*.

"Hmm." I pondered. "His very presence."

Prayer: Gracious Heavenly Father, You are my Counselor who instructs me in the way I should go. You love me with everlasting love. You call me your child, and you impart wisdom and understanding. Forgive me when I have chosen my own desires over your will and when I have not kept your commands. You tell me in your Word how to live for you and you promise to help me live for you. Help me to yield to you. Help me to confess my sin to you as you convict my heart. Help me change so that I can be used by you. Give ME **heart-driven obedience** and help me become a woman after your heart. Amen.

<u>The Ten Commandments - 9th Commandment - Exodus 20:16</u> *You shall not lie.*

The positive side - Tell the Truth or Let your word be honorable

In America today, two out of three people believe that nothing is wrong with telling a lie. Their thought is, "It really doesn't hurt anybody." This runs along the same line that people regard sin, or, with many today, disregard sin. Doing wrong is a sin; not doing right is a sin as well. Again the 9th Commandment, is like two sides to the same coin. Remember, we can always see that there are two views of every commandment. What we see as the negative – *Don't Lie*, also has a positive side – *Tell the truth*. So, just as it is a sin to tell an outright lie, it is also a sin to know the truth and not tell it. Not speaking a truth you know when you know it should be told – is it a lie. It all comes back to being honest with the truth to start with.

Wait a minute, what about "White Lies"? Are White lies Okay? Aren't they protecting someone or just not hurting their feelings? The problem here is that "Little White Lies" tend to grow up, and when they do, they cause havoc and pain in our lives. Then, we must either tell more lies - or bigger lies - or more bigger lies to cover our other lies. Plus, we must remember the lies we've told and who we told them to. Besides being so dishonest, that's a whole lot of work with a pile of anxiety added to it wondering if you'll be found out. And, it's all about your reputation, your name and perhaps the reputation of someone else.

There are opinions, ideas and impressions attached to your name. The NKJV has 1013 uses of "name". Scripture says that "A **good name** is to be chosen rather than great riches, Loving favor rather than silver and gold." Prov 22:1 And then there's the two paths for a name - The memory of the righteous is blessed, But the **name** of the wicked will rot. Prov 10:7

Now we arrive at a question many of us have heard and perhaps have either forgotten or do not know where it came from. So, most of you probably wouldn't guess that I was an English major. (I'm still larnin' to speak it I recon'.) However, I do remember a little Shakespeare. Romeo & Juliet, to be specific. Jacob Nimeth, remember what Juliet said of Romeo? In the famous speech of Act II, Scene II of the play, the line is said by Juliet in reference to Romeo's house: Montague. The line implies that his name (and thus his family's feud with Juliet's family) means nothing and because the name means nothing to her, they should be together. The line by Juliet reads: "What's in a name? That which we call a rose By any other name would smell as sweet;" The idiom, 'What's in a name?' is one that dates back to the 16th and 17th centuries. The era Shakespeare was writing. (If you've ever said it, I bet you didn't know you were quoting Shakespeare!) The question itself is reflecting on someone's title, rank, family designation or station. The deeper view of the question is whether a name is one that is deserved or can be trusted. Is it a meaningful name or does it have no value? What is the implication of that name? What gives it value? Can the name and what it stands for be trusted? While Juliet was saying that her name had nothing to do with who she was, it was the beauty and aroma or fragrance of a rose are the same no matter what name you assign it.

Then the question becomes, what name should we be running to? *The name of the Lord is a strong tower; The righteous run to it and are safe.* Prov 18:10 Our Lord and Savior, Jesus is the one we should be running toward. When we become a New Creation in Christ, we take on a new name. We are adopted into God's family. We actually take on a fragrance, too. *For we are to God the fragrance of Christ among those who are being saved and among those who are perishing.* 2 Cor 2:15. Are you being the fragrance of Christ before others? Do people see Christ in your daily life. Men, are you reflecting Christ to your family as you lead them. We should be truthful in a world that is questioning truth. Point them to Jesus. Point them to The Truth in Scripture where He said, "I am the Way, the Truth and the Life. No one comes to the Father but thru me." John 14:7 Spread His fragrance. Give Glory to His Name!



Cave of Wonders

Dear Church Family,

For the fourth year in a row, I had the opportunity to spend my summer as the Children's Ministry Intern. It may have only been ten short weeks, but those ten weeks held so many amazing things. Over those ten weeks, I helped plan and implement Vacation Bible School, helped with some housekeeping in the Children's Ministry, and had the opportunity to review the new children's church curriculum. My summer began by jumping straight into the planning for Vacation Bible School. Many people have heard me say this before, but VBS is my favorite week of the year. I love watching our church come together over two amazing, chaotic, wonderful weeks. First, volunteers of all ages came together to transform the church building into a new setting for VBS. VBS is about so much more than decorations, but I love the way our volunteers manage to create the sensation of a new environment and give the kids the impression that they are starting an adventure somewhere new. We had so many helpers working to decorate the church building, from some of the kids who would attend VBS the next week to our senior saints. I am so thankful for all the time and effort everyone put in to bringing our theme to life.

The second week, we had volunteers from sixth grade to senior saints working together to lead the kids through VBS and into a closer relationship with God. Each of our volunteers was so amazing to sacrifice their time and energy to helping this week. Some people took the week off to serve. Others took half-days to serve in the morning before going to work in the afternoon. Still others worked all day before arriving at the church by six to serve at our first-ever evening VBS. Everyone made sacrifices in order to be there that week, and I am so grateful for everyone who did – we couldn't have done it without them.

This year, we traveled to the northernmost parts of the United States – to Alaska – where we all learned to "trust Jesus in a wild world." VBS reminded us again and again that Jesus is our True North, the one thing that we can always rely on to show us the way. It is so amazing to see the kids spending the week learning about God, and I was overjoyed to see so many kids identify Jesus as their True North and ask Him into their hearts.

Our new children's church curriculum started on the second Sunday in August. Our first monthly memory verse was Psalm 119:89-90: "Forever, O Lord, Your Word is firmly fixed in the heavens. Your faithfulness endures to all generations. You have established the earth, and it stands fast." This verse tied in so well to our VBS theme. "The Word became flesh and dwelt among us..." (John 1:14) and the "... Word is firmly fixed in the heavens" (Psalm 119:89). Jesus is our North Star, guiding us ever onward in the way that we should go. We can trust Jesus because He is trustworthy, because His "faithfulness endures to all generations" (Psalm 119:90).

It isn't just the children who got something out of VBS. Every year, VBS has something to teach me, too. I've been struggling with figuring out my path in life recently, and while I still don't know exactly where God is leading me, VBS was a great reminder that all I have to do is trust Jesus, and the new memory verse just reinforced that. I don't need to see the path or know the destination. All I have to do is follow my True North and He will lead me where He wants me to go.

It was so wonderful working as the children's ministry intern. Thank you to Dr. Richard and Jenny Forrester for allowing me to take up this role again. I'll still be around as a volunteer for now, until God leads me further on the path He has decided for me.




