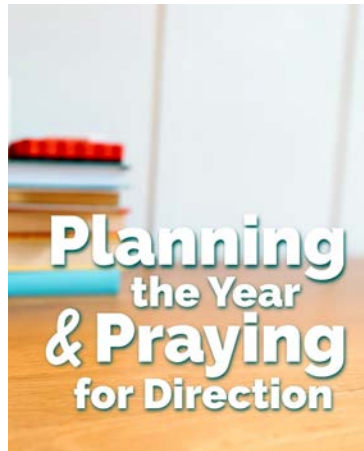

Greetings,

Happy, Happy New Year! We've made it through 2025, and it's had its challenges as well as its victories. We're anticipating more of the same challenges and victories, in the New Year, 2026. God continues to work in all of our ministries as we reach out to our community.

We have been blessed in calling Pastor Ben as our Associate Pastor of Student Ministries and he's hit the ground running. We welcome him and his wife Jerri, and their three children. Please be in prayer for him and his family as they make this transition and for the success and continued growth of our youth ministry. The building process is moving along slowly as we're dealing now with the county for approval of permits to begin work. There have been some minor changes in the site plan but at no additional cost as we're still on budget. Hopefully, we will break ground sometime in early spring. At that point we will be making some additional changes to our parking and activities that take place outside. The parking space will be addressed before the lower lot is disturbed. You will receive more information about that as the process continues. We have several ideas as to how all of that is going to work. The completion date of the building has been updated to early 2027 but that depends upon the permit phase and of course the weather. So, pray for good weather all of next year and especially for no snow.

Our giving to the building stewardship campaign, thus far, has been very good and all are honoring their commitments to it and others who did not make a commitment during that campaign have joined in the giving and we're off to a great start. Now we have to continue on to the finish line. This building will open many, many doors of ministry opportunities for our church to reach out to this community. We will also need additional volunteers for some of these new opportunities so get ready to step up.

Please continue to pray for this process as it takes a lot of my time and many meetings of which I attend. Continue to pray as well for our Long Term and Short Term evaluation Teams as we will be looking at the New Year as well, in moving forward. Our Lord continues to challenge and call us out in many ways, and we don't want to miss any opportunities of ministry He presents to us.

As the President of our country gives his annual State of the Union Address to inform the people of how things are progressing on all fronts, I believe the state of Ramoth Baptist Church in all areas in very good condition – spiritually and financially. We are attempting to follow the direction of the early new church in Acts 2:42-47. As we first grow spiritually, we will grow in all other areas in ministry. All of our ministries are extremely important, and I ask you to pray about where our Lord could use you in one of those ministries. He wants all of us on the playing field and not just sitting in the stands. We have many ongoing ministries that are growing and others that will begin in the New Year and there is always a need for additional help. Our new schedule is working, and new Sunday School classes will start at the beginning of the year. If you have any interest in teaching a new class or in leading a new ministry, please let me and the Sunday School Director know.

As we begin the New Year let's continue to pray for our country, our leaders, our state, our county, and our church. Pray for our ministry to expand where needed under the direction of our Lord Jesus. Pray that we are aware of the needs around us and help us to work to fulfill those needs. Pray for those who will be on mission trips this coming year that we will continue to see great results of those receiving Jesus as their Lord and Savior. Pray for all of our outreach ministries in the community as we speak Jesus in every event in many different ways. Growth in the New Year

As we begin a new year, many people set intentions for self-improvement. While resolutions often focus on physical health or financial goals, Christians recognize an even more profound pursuit: growth in faith. This is not merely a suggestion but a vital aspect of the Christian life, a journey of becoming more like Christ (Romans 8:29).

Our spiritual lives are not meant to remain stagnant. Just as a tree needs nourishment to grow and bear fruit, believers also need to actively pursue deeper roots in their faith. Peter encourages us to "grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ" (2 Peter 3:18). This growth allows us to better understand God's character, to discern His will, and to live in a way that honors Him. It equips us to stand firm against the temptations of sin, which is any thought, word, or deed that goes against God's word (Romans 3:23). Thankfully, for those who repent and turn to Christ, there is grace and forgiveness (1 John 1:9).

Committing to spiritual growth is a worthy New Year's resolution. Here are several practical steps, grounded in scripture, to help you draw closer to God in the coming year:

- 1. Engage with God's Word Daily:** The Bible is God's revealed truth, a lamp to our feet and a light to our path (Psalm 119:105). Make a habit of reading and meditating on Scripture. Consider a Bible reading plan or focus on a specific book of the Bible. Through His Word, God speaks to us, corrects us, and trains us in righteousness (2 Timothy 3:16-17). When you arrive at a scripture that causes you to wonder, pause and dig deeper. Ask questions and enjoy this time of growth.
- 2. Cultivate a Vibrant Prayer Life:** Prayer is our direct line of communication with God. It's how we express our adoration, confess our sins, offer thanks, and bring our requests before Him. Jesus Himself modeled a life of prayer (Luke 5:16). Resolve to spend intentional time in prayer each day, not just talking to God, but also listening for His leading. "Pray without ceasing," Paul instructs us (1 Thessalonians 5:17). Try to start and end each day in prayer.
- 3. Prioritize Christian Community:** God designed us for relationship, not isolation. Gathering with other believers for worship, teaching, and fellowship is crucial for spiritual growth (Hebrews 10:24-25). In Christian community, we encourage one another, bear each other's burdens, and spur each other on toward love and good deeds. Try to be here each time the doors open. Don't miss a Sunday, be involved on Wednesdays, and join a class with others who are also being discipled.
- 4. Live in Obedience to Christ:** True faith is demonstrated by obedience. Jesus said, "If you love me, you will keep my commandments" (John 14:15). As you read God's Word, ask the Holy Spirit to show you areas where you can apply its truths more fully in your life. This includes turning away from sin and striving to live in a way that reflects Christ's character in your daily interactions, your work, and your choices. In other words, reflect Jesus. To walk in His will is to serve Him in obedience.
- 5. Share Your Faith with Others:** Part of growing in faith is sharing the good news of Jesus Christ with those around you. The Great Commission calls all believers to make disciples (Matthew 28:19-20). Look for opportunities to share how God has worked in your life, to explain the hope you have in Christ, and to invite others to know Him personally. Tell your story. As a Christian, you have a salvation experience to share. As you share, your own understanding and conviction will often deepen.

This new year offers a fresh opportunity to prioritize what truly matters: a deepening relationship with Jesus Christ. By committing to these biblical practices, you can confidently anticipate a year of profound spiritual growth, experiencing more of God's grace and drawing ever closer to His heart. Let us grow in our faith this year!

The Refuge Ministry

Happy New Year everyone. The blessings of our Lord have allowed us to see another year. There should be much rejoicing and praising going on. However, the beginning of the new year is not always filled with many glad tidings. Sometimes the uncertainty about what the new year will bring puts pressure on people that they are not ready to assume. That's just one way some people are starting the new year off.

For some, the return to the hectic nature of work, school, and social responsibilities comes as a surprise, after several days or weeks of leisure. The return of the crowded schedule can bring stress, where there were just peace and calm. The return of the chore of managing time and priorities brings with it overcommitments, frustrations, and some disappointment. And for some, this is only the beginning of the trouble.

Yet, others will be dealing with the aftermath of the holiday season. Some will be resorting to diets to address the few extra pounds that came with all the meals, snacks, and yummy delights. Many will be repairing budgets that went bust after gifts were given, trips were traveled, and that one emergency happened that no one wants to talk about. And still there will be countless other ways that people will be bringing in the new year.

There will be new births, and some losses. There will be weddings and separations. There will be new adventures taken and some tough decisions made. Through it all though, there will be one that remains constant, unchanging, unwavering...that is God. He has something that He would have us consider as we start the new year. It is where our relationship with Him is and how much time are we spending in His word?

God might direct your attention to the words of **1 Thessalonians 5:16-18**, "Rejoice always,¹⁷ pray without ceasing,¹⁸ give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."

Or God might have you to consider the words of **Matthew 6:25, 27, 31-34**, "Therefore I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, nor about your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing?²⁷ And which of you by being anxious can add a single hour to his span of life?³¹ Therefore do not be anxious, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?'³² For the Gentiles seek after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them all.³³ But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be added to you.³⁴ "Therefore do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Sufficient for the day is its own trouble."

Or yet still, God might just remind you subtly about the words of **Isaiah 41:9b-10**, "You are my servant, I have chosen you and not cast you off";¹⁰ fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."

Whatever message God decides to send you, just know that He has your best interest in mind. And just like God is there to help in difficult times, He has called us at the Refuge Ministry Center to be here in your time of need. Whether you are dealing with stress, loss, or family matters; we want to come alongside you and direct you to biblical solutions. We wanted to share the devotional that Chris Morales gave at the Ornament exchange in December. Not only is this a beautiful reminder during the Christmas season, but it is also a wonderful way to enter into the New Year. May God continue to bless you and may we give Him praise and thanks for all He's going to do in 2026!

I was driving home from work earlier this week. Like many of us often experience, it had been a busy day. I was tired, and I wanted some peace before arriving home; before feeding animals, starting dinner, and getting ready for the next day. I was also thinking about what God wanted me to say for this devotional. I had been considering a different topic, when...in that moment...I realized how much I needed to be still...so I could hear what God wanted to say to me. Psalm 46:10 kept coming to mind. As I was driving, I prayed for guidance, and then I continued driving in silence.

Psalm 46:10 "Be still and know that I am God." This verse continued playing over and over in my head.

The season that we are in can be quite the juxtaposition. When we should be reflecting on the **Gift** that is Christ the Savior, we are often busied with **buying gifts**, holiday preparations, hosting, cooking, baking, traveling, wrapping... "all the things". But often in life, we can allow "all the things...to keep us busy, preoccupied, and removed from God... and also the peace He offers each of us if we only were to take the time to listen... and acknowledge His authority in our lives.

We need to find the **stillness** and **create quiet moments** in which we can **hear God**. Foster your relationship with Jesus... and **anchor yourself in God**. We do this by recognizing God's divinity, authority, reading his Word, through prayer and **listening**.

God is in control, and **we are not**. So let go! Listen to how freeing that is....LET GO!! You can even physically feel that in your body if you allow yourself. LET GO! Put your trust in Him, in His power, and surrender to His plan for your life.

Be still in God's presence...Stop struggling...and find peace. Acknowledge God's lordship in your life. When we let go... and allow God to work...we experience HIS PEACE.

God invites us to **release our burdens** and **trust** that *He will* take care of the outcome. The latter part of the scripture is **"I will be exalted among the nations; I will be exalted in the earth."**

Exalted- to lift up. Lifting up our Lord and Savior is so empowering. We have a glorious God ...who is elevated above all. Our God is **worthy** of exaltation. I don't know about you... but just saying that gives me **peace!** He is telling us... BE STILL...**KNOW** that I am God. Action words... which should give us security because he is Adonai (Lord/Master), Elohim (Creator God), El Shaddai (God Almighty), and Immanuel (God with us) to name a few. And in Him... our **true identity** can be found... which starts with **intimacy** with Jesus. Putting **faith into action**. **Challenging** your faith and **growing** with an **intentional relationship** with God our Father.

1. Taking care of your family (Part 7). Well, winter weather is upon us again! We get snow, freezing rain, sleet, ice, and frigid temp. While trying to avoid it, you may have to take a trip somewhere in the car during some of the winter nastiness. Consider keeping some of these things in your family cars to deal with any unexpected winter surprises. Having a well-stocked winter emergency kit can make a significant difference in your safety during winter travel.

If you are Stranded

Stay with your vehicle for safety.

Run the engine for heat, but keep the exhaust pipe clear of snow.

Use your emergency kit items (see below) to stay warm & signal for help.

Preparing a winter emergency kit for your car.

Include items like a first aid kit, a shovel, ice scraper, jumper cables, and a tire inflator, a blanket, flashlight, extra batteries, non-perishable snacks, and water.

Assurance – Do You Have It?

How can we be sure of our Salvation and our Eternal destiny?

Why do we doubt? Can we really be sure where we'll spend eternity? What makes us doubt? We were sure when we made the decision to accept Christ and when we stepped down into that baptismal pool. The real question is: *Who* makes us doubt? Satan! Our enemy! He does not want to see anyone come to Christ for their salvation. But, when they do, he will do all he can to cause doubt and disruption in any believer's mind. He will bring up the past. He will point at your life and suggest that isn't worthy of a so-called Christian. He will do all he can to disrupt your worship and relationships that will make you an ineffective witness for Christ. What do we do? How can we be sure? Scripture is our answer. Lean into what God's Word has for your assurance. God has given us the Bible as our Instruction Manual. And, yes, many men don't want to read the instruction manual until we find our own way doesn't work.

What is assurance? It is a positive declaration intended to give confidence or a promise. With God, it is a word of honor, a guarantee he has promised. And He ALWAYS keeps his promise. Having assurance means being certain, with freedom from doubt. So, let's look at some of the Scripture God has provided for our assurance that he will fulfill His promise. I give them here to build your faith and assurance.

Eph 1:7 *In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of His grace*

1 Pet 1:5 *who are protected by the power of God through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time.*

Rom 8:38-39 *For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers,³⁹ nor height, nor depth, nor any other created thing, will be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.*

John 10:27-29 *My sheep hear My voice, and I know them, and they follow Me;²⁸ and I give eternal life to them, and they will never perish; and no one will snatch them out of My hand.²⁹ My Father, who has given them to Me, is greater than all; and no one is able to snatch them out of the Father's hand.*

1 John 5:13 *These things have I written unto you that believe on the name of the Son of God; that ye may know that ye have eternal life, and that ye may believe on the name of the Son of God.*

Phil 1:6 *For I am confident of this very thing, that He who began a good work in you will perfect it until the day of Christ Jesus.*

Now, what do we do with these Scriptures. CLAIM THEM. Establish your Eternity if you haven't already done so. Every day souls leave this earth and enter eternity. There are times in the winter when we wake up and see a cold fog over the ground. As the day warms up, that fog rises and disappears. The Bible describes our lives this way. It says our lives are like a vapor. Compared to eternity, it's hardly a vapor. Our God is outside of time; he can see all of history at once. Our lives are fading just as fast. We only have a short time to anchor our faith in what Christ did on the cross for us. But, we can leave a legacy for those in our family, friends, church and community. When other discern the assurance in your life, you either build theirs or show them how they can have it, too.

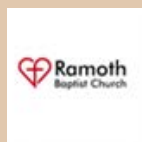
