

On September 22, 1959, a devotional article appeared in Our Daily Bread written by Dr. M. R. DeHaan. He wrote about how he yearned for a box of Cracker Jack candied popcorn. His intention was to relate it to the yearning for the Scriptures. But to his surprise, a few weeks later, boxes upon boxes of Cracker Jack popcorn began arriving at his office. His desire for Cracker Jack was satisfied by the loyal readers of his devotional. Letting the practice of regular immersion in Scripture slip away is always easy. That's why we need to yearn for something "sweeter than honey" (Psalm 19:10). The psalmist David encourages us to know that God's words are "perfect, refreshing the soul"; they're "trustworthy" and full of wisdom (v. 7). He explains that "the precepts of the Lord are right, giving joy to the heart" (v. 8).

Dr. DeHaan encouraged readers to make interaction with the Scriptures a habit, something they craved each day, just like sweet popcorn. It's vital for us as well to develop a habit of meditating and reflecting on the Bible, and responding to its truths, in a regular manner. As God helps us, let's be like David, who said, "May these words of my mouth and this meditation of my heart be pleasing in your sight" (v. 14).
