What does this mean?

- 1. 19-20. This is not controversial when understood. These verses are saying the same thing as many other passages regarding our mortality: Gn. 3:19, Ps. 90:3, 104:29
- 2. Vs. 21 Now this is not so easy!
- B. The Preacher gives his conclusion in vs. 22.

## Conclusion:

If one puts aside the existence of God and the survival after life as too doubtful... one has to make up one's mind as to the use of life. If death ends all, if I have neither to hope for good nor to fear evil, I must ask myself what I am here for, and how in these circumstances I must conduct myself.
