Pray that the Lord blesses your community group discussion, then read Psalm 118

What do you find amazing and most wonderful about God's love?

The phrase "steadfast love" in Psalm 118:1-4 and Psalm 118:29 in the ESV is a translation of the Hebrew word *hesed*. What makes hesed such a difficult word to translate? Why is it an important word to understand (see Exodus 34:6-7)?

The psalmist initially calls the people of God to give him thanks because God is good and because God's love endures forever. Share specific ways that the LORD has been good to you?

Do you often give thanks to the LORD for his goodness? Why or why not? What might cause someone to struggle to give God thanks? How can someone grow in thanksgiving?

In verses 5-18, the psalmist shares an example of the LORD's steadfast love. What can you relate to in this section of the psalm?

Verse 15 refers to glad songs of salvation in the tents of the righteous. Commenting on this, Charles Spurgeon writes: "The families of believers are happy, and they should take pains to give their happiness a voice by their family devotion. The dwelling-place of the saved should be the temple of praise." Does your family sing praise to God at home together? Why is this important?

In what way do Psalm 118:22-23 and Psalm 118:26 take a sharp turn right to Christ (for more direction, see Matthew 21:42; Mark 12:10; Luke 20:17; Ephesians 2:19-21; Acts 4:11-12; Matthew 21:9; Mark 11:9-10, and Luke 19:37-40)?

How is Jesus Christ and his ministry the fulfillment of Psalm 118?

How then should we live? This week, spend time reflecting on how God saved you. Consider who you were before the LORD saved you and where you might be today if it were not for God's steadfast love, then give God thanks.
