After some fellowship and prayer, read Romans 8:1-8

Begin by discussing how the people in your group are doing spiritually. How are you responding to the horrific event and the wicked act that took place in Utah last week? What are you thinking? What are you praying? Would you say you are more fearful or more emboldened, and why?

Verses 1 and 2 tell us that we are not condemned because we have been set free. Who has been set free? How have they been set free?

What in these verses leads you to give thanks to God for?
How should we then live? Talk with someone who you think is struggling with fear. If they are a Christian, encourage them with the hope that they have in Christ. If they are not a Christian, tell them of their need for Christ and call them to repent and trust in Christ.
