After some fellowship and prayer, read Romans 6:1-11

How was your Easter celebration? Did you gather with family and friends? Did you have any conversations about Christ and the gospel with anyone this Easter?

Why is Christ's resurrection from the dead the most important event in history?

In his letter to the Romans the Apostle Paul is often addressing the different objections that Jews and Gentiles will have to the gospel. How might a Jew use Romans 5:20-21 to argue against the gospel? How might a Gentile use Romans 5:20-21 as an argument to continue in sin? Discuss Paul's response in Romans 6:1-2.

If a Christian's sins are forgiven because Jesus Christ already atoned for them what does Paul say in this passage should cause a Christian to no longer "live in" sin?
How does Jesus being raised from the dead give the Christian the ability to "walk in newness of life"? In what ways have you experienced this newness of life?
Paul says that because Christ was raised, all who are united to Christ will "certainly" be raised like him (Romans 6:5. Why is Jesus Christ's bodily or physical resurrection from the dead so important to Christianity (see 1 Corinthians 15:13-19)? How is it that Jesus' resurrection guarantees every Christian's resurrection (see 1 Corinthians 15:20-24)?
Discuss the implication of what Paul writes in verse 9 that," Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him." How do the truths in this passage impact and encourage you today? Close in prayer.
How should we then live? Reread Romans 6:1-11 then talk about it with someone who is not a Christian. Ask them what they believe about Christ's resurrection and invite them to corporate worship on Sunday.
