We may or may not feel anything different here, but we believe that whatever it is that we experience when we are at church is the closest thing we have to experiencing an encounter with the living God. Lord's Supper

For Christians, the Lord's Supper is the most sacred thing we do all week. We believe as Presbyterians that though the bread and wine do not become the physical body and blood, nevertheless something mysterious and spiritual happens when we eat and drink by faith, so that we are spiritually nourished and our union with Christ and one another is signified and sealed. For that reason, anyone who is not a Christian and does not see this as sacramental may feel free to abstain, as we do not want to force you to do something with your body that is inconsistent with your heart. However, the Heidelberg Confession says that for those who are displeased with themselves because of their sins, and yet trust that these are forgiven them, the Supper may help remind them that their weakness and sin is covered by the suffering and death of Christ. If you think your child is ready to go through confirmation and receive communion, please contact Blythe.

For anyone that may find it easier to remain seated during communion, single-use communion cups are available on the table in the back of the sanctuary. Please feel free to ask any BPC member for assistance.

Apostles Creed

4) Foster Care and Adoption: Spotlight on Promise686

For a number of years, BPC's Foster Care and Adoption Ministry has partnered with an organization called Promise686. Promise686's mission is to mobilize church communities to care for vulnerable children. They have provided our Foster Care and Adoption Ministry Team with coaching and resources for ministry building and sustaining. We also use the Promise686 care community model to support the fostering and adopting families in our church.

What is a care community for a fostering or adopting family?

Care Communities, or "care teams," are volunteer-led and provide a strong support system for foster & adoptive families. Caring for vulnerable children requires a big investment, and parents need the support of local community. Care Communities create the opportunity to serve at-risk kids and their families in practical, hands-on ways. By supporting foster and adoptive families, we have the opportunity to provide a healthier context for a child's transition into their new home. Ways to serve in a care community can include providing meals, babysitting, mentorship, tutoring, transportation and prayer.

In alignment with Promise686's inspirational verse, *Psalm 68:6: "God sets the lonely in families*," Care Communities provide a tangible way to give fostering and adopting families a larger network of "family" to support the vulnerable children they are caring for.
