What do we do when we go to church?

Sermon

Galatians 1: 1-5

1 Paul, an apostle—not from men nor through man, but through Jesus Christ and God the Father, who raised him from the dead— 2 and all the brothers who are with me.

To the churches of Galatia:

3 Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ, **4** who gave himself for our sins to deliver us from the present evil age, according to the will of our God and Father, **5** to whom be the glory forever and ever. Amen.

Galatians 4: 1-7

1 I mean that the heir, as long as he is a child, is no different from a slave, though he is the owner of everything, 2 but he is under guardians and managers until the date set by his father. 3 In the same way we also, when we were children, were enslaved to the elementary principles of the world. 4 But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son, born of woman, born under the law, 5 to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons. 6 And because you are sons, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, "Abba! Father!" 7 So you are no longer a slave, but a son, and if a son, then an heir through God.

Lord's Supper

For Christians, the Lord's Supper is the most sacred thing we do all week. We believe as Presbyterians that though the bread and wine do not become the physical body and blood, nevertheless something mysterious and spiritual happens when we eat and drink by faith, so that we are spiritually nourished and our union with Christ and one another is signified and sealed. For that reason, anyone who is not a Christian and does not see this as sacramental may feel free to abstain, as we do not want to force you to do something with your body that is inconsistent with your heart. However, the Heidelberg Confession says that for those who are displeased with themselves because of their sins, and yet trust that these are forgiven them, the Supper may help remind them that their weakness and sin is covered by the suffering and death of Christ. If you think your child is ready to go through confirmation and receive communion, please contact Blythe.

For anyone that may find it easier to remain seated during communion, single-use communion cups are available on the table in the back of the sanctuary. Please feel free to ask any BPC member for assistance.

Apostles Creed

2) Diaconal Updates

God is at work through many diaconal ministries in our church - keep an eye on this space for both requests and updates/praises.

Presencia: The school supplies bank is STOCKED. This was a simple but meaningful way to show Christ's love with material means. Deep thanks to all who contributed tangibly and with prayers.

Foster Care: The parsonage is occupied! Our foster family has moved in. We have one care team currently serving a fostering family in our church, with two more care teams in the process of forming. Pray these teams bring blessing and that God equips volunteers for each family's needs.

Congregational Care: Pray for Audrey Weeks' continued health; for the Jordan family in Sally's treatment; and for those in our church facing dementia, anxiety, chronic migraines, or grieving miscarriage.

BPC Housing: This summer's 12-week Financial Literacy Workshop was a success, with three participants completing the program. One highlight: this workshop graduated someone who will be living in the duplex this year as well as created a connection yielding gainful employment as well. Not planned by us, but certainly by the Holy Spirit. Prayer Requests: Please pray for the duplex renovations to be completed, the growth of the BPC housing team to support them, and for all participants as they begin putting their financial goals into practice.

3) Staff Reflection: Waiting by Macy Starkes

Something I've come to realize the longer I walk with the Lord is that the Christian life is deeply marked by waiting. As humans, especially in 2025, waiting isn't something we enjoy, nor is it something we're often forced to practice. We can get almost any answer instantly from ChatGPT. We can order nearly anything from Amazon and have it on our doorstep the next day. We can reach anyone in seconds with a text or call. Our world has been designed to erase waiting. But if we believe in a God who calls us to live in the tension of the "already" and the "not yet," then waiting is unavoidable. Our true home is not here, which means part of following Him will always involve waiting. The psalmist in Psalm 130 speaks directly into this reality:

5 I wait for the Lord, my soul waits, and in his word I hope;6 my soul waits for the Lord more than watchmen for the morning, more than watchmen for the morning.

For with the Lord there is steadfast love, and with him is plentiful redemption.

7 O Israel, hope in the Lord!

I'd love to say that when I wait, I always wait expectantly and with hope in what the Lord will do. But more often than not, I wait anxiously, struggling to trust that He is not only working and moving, but that He is also doing it all for my good. A great friend of mine, Kelly King, recently reminded me of what surrender in the waiting can look like. She shared that surrender isn't usually a one-time prayer we pray and move on from, it's often a moment by moment, hour by hour cry to God in the midst of waiting. It's an act of reflection and remembrance that I am not in control and that I cannot see the whole picture. And even though my instinct is to tightly grip every detail of my life, true freedom and peace come when I release that grip and choose to trust in God's goodness despite my circumstances.

May your soul find hope in His word today as you wait.
