VOL 2: Part 11: Dead to Sin, Alive to God | EASTER SUNDAY

Message Reflection

BIG Idea: Jesus didn't just rise from the dead—He raised *us* to live a new kind of life.

Application: Live as someone who is already free—not trying to earn new life, but walking in the one you've been given.

Discussion Questions

Icebreaker: What's one "dead habit" or funny trend from your past that you're glad is no longer part of your life?

1. What stood out to you most from Sunday's message or Romans 6:1–14?
2. In what ways do people misuse or misunderstand grace today, similar to Paul's audience in verse 1?
3. Paul says we are "dead to sin." What do you think that means practically, not just theologically?
4. How does your baptism personally remind you of your new identity in Christ?
5. Why do you think we still struggle to let go of the "old self," even though it's been crucified with Christ?
6. What's a current area of your life where you need to "consider yourself alive to God"?
7. How does living "under grace" instead of "under law" affect your motivation for obedience?
8. Read John 10:10 and 2 Corinthians 3:17. How do these reinforce Paul's teaching in Romans 6?
9. The message said, "Stop striving to be someone new—start living like someone made new." What does that shift look like in real life?
10. How can this group support one another in walking in resurrection life this week?

Prayer Prompt: Spend time thanking God for the freedom found in Christ. Pray for the courage to walk in that freedom daily and to leave behind anything that no longer belongs to who you are in Jesus.
