Small Group Discussion Guide

VOL 4: Part 22: The Olive Tree: Grafted by Grace

BIG Idea: God's kindness in grafting us into His family calls us to humility, perseverance, and hope for restoration for all who will turn to Him.

Application: Stand firm in faith, walking daily in God's kindness, rejecting arrogance, and holding out hope for the restoration of others.

Discussion Questions

Icebreaker: Have you ever been "grafted in" to a new group or community? What was that experience like?

- 1. How does the historical background of Claudius's edict help you understand Paul's tone in Romans 11:11–24? (Claudius had expelled the Jews from Rome, leaving the Gentile Christians to lead the church for several years before Jewish believers then returned to Rome.)
- 2. What does Paul mean when he says Israel's "stumble" is not the end? How does this shape how we see people far from God today?
- 3. How can our lives "provoke" others to want a closer relationship with Christ in a healthy, Godhonoring way?
- 4. Paul warns Gentile believers against arrogance. What might arrogance look like in today's church culture?
- 5. Discuss the balance between God's kindness and sternness in Romans 11:22. Why are both important?
- 6. What do you think it practically means to "continue in God's kindness"?
- 7. What does it look like for you personally to "continue in God's kindness" in your daily walk with Him this week?
- 8. How does the olive tree metaphor help you understand your place in God's story, both personally and as part of the church?
- 9. How can we as a church model humility toward outsiders while holding firmly to biblical truth?
- 10. Who in your life needs to hear the hope that "restoration is always possible with God," and how can you share that hope this week?

Prayer Prompt: Pray for a renewed humility in our hearts, perseverance in our faith, and for God's power to restore those we know who are far from Him.
