Small Group Discussion Guide

VOL 4: Part 30: Stop Judging: The Weak and The Strong

BIG Idea: Because God alone is Judge, we must stop judging one another and start accepting one another in Christ.

Application: Since Christ alone is Lord and Judge, believers must resist judging one another in disputable matters and instead practice humble acceptance, gratitude, and unity under His authority.

Discussion Questions

Icebreaker: What's a lighthearted "disputable matter" you've argued or laughed about with someone before (like coffee vs. tea, dogs vs. cats, Ford vs. Chevy, or a worship style preference)?

- 1. Read Romans 14:1-3. What makes it difficult to accept believers whose convictions differ from yours?
- 2. Paul says we shouldn't "quarrel over disputable matters." What are some issues today that might fit that category?
- 3. Verse 3 says God has accepted both the weak and the strong. How does that truth challenge our tendency to label others?
- 4. How does viewing others as "God's servants" (v. 4) reshape how we respond when we disagree?
- 5. Romans 14:6-8 repeats the phrase "to the Lord." What does it look like to live to the Lord in daily decisions?
- 6. Why do you think Paul emphasizes that both the weak and the strong give thanks to God? What role does gratitude play in unity?
- 7. How does remembering that "each of us will give an account to God" (v. 12) affect the way we treat others?
- 8. In what situations do you find it hardest to "step down from the judge's seat" and trust God with someone else's heart?
- 9. Read Romans 15:7. What practical steps can we take to "accept one another as Christ accepted us"?
- 10. How can our LifeGroup model unity in diversity showing the world what acceptance in Christ looks like?

Prayer Prompt: Pray for humility and grace to accept one another as Christ has accepted us. Ask God to reveal any area where you've judged a brother or sister and to replace criticism with compassion and understanding.
