

Small Group Discussion Guide

VOL 4: Part 33: Ambassadors of Christ: Called to Proclaim

BIG Idea: Every believer is an ambassador of Christ—empowered by grace, humbled by His glory, and commissioned to proclaim His name where He is not yet known.

Application: Live sent. Represent Christ boldly and faithfully where He is not yet known—whether that’s across the street, across your workplace, or across the world.

Discussion Questions

Icebreaker: Have you ever had to speak on behalf of someone else? How did that feel?

1. Read Romans 15:13. What does it mean for our hope to *overflow*? How does that overflow naturally lead to mission?
2. In Romans 15:14–16, Paul calls his evangelism a “priestly duty.” How can sharing our faith be an act of worship today?
3. What’s the difference between *being able* to share your faith and *being authorized* to share it?
4. Why do you think people often feel unqualified to represent Christ? What truths from this passage challenge that feeling?
5. Read 2 Corinthians 5:20. What does it mean for God to “make His appeal through us”?
6. In Romans 15:17–19, Paul celebrates what Christ has done *through* him. How does that perspective protect us from pride?
7. “Ambassadors measure success by obedience, not applause.” How could this mindset change the way we serve or share the gospel?
8. Read Romans 15:20–24. How does Paul’s holy ambition inspire us to take the gospel where it’s not known—both locally and globally?
9. What does it look like for *you* to step beyond comfort in order to represent Christ more boldly?
10. As a group, discuss ways your LifeGroup can embody this ambassador mindset in your community this month.

Prayer Prompt: Pray that God would renew our hearts with courage, compassion, and conviction to live as ambassadors for Christ—representing Him faithfully wherever He sends us.
