

# Small Group Discussion Guide

Series: What is Needed Part 1: What Must I Do?

**BIG Idea:** The most urgent question a person can ask receives the simplest answer.

**Application:** Respond in faith to Jesus Christ—and publicly identify with Him through baptism as the beginning of a rightly ordered life.

## Discussion Questions

**Icebreaker:** What's a recent situation where you needed an answer *right away*—no time to think, just react?

1. Why do you think moments of crisis often surface deeper spiritual questions?
2. In Acts 16, the jailer asks, “What must I do to be saved?” What stands out to you about when and why he asks this?
3. How does our culture usually answer questions about meaning, purpose, or fulfillment? How is that different from the Bible’s answer?
4. Why do you think people often expect salvation to come with a long list of requirements?
5. What does it mean to you personally to “believe in the Lord Jesus” beyond just agreeing with facts?
6. The sermon emphasized that salvation is received, not achieved. Why is that both freeing and difficult for some people?
7. How does baptism function as a response to faith rather than a requirement for salvation?
8. What might it look like for faith to “move” in everyday life, even beyond baptism?
9. Can you relate to the idea of a quiet unraveling versus a loud crisis? How does God meet us in both?
10. How can our LifeGroup help one another respond faithfully to Jesus, especially during seasons of uncertainty or struggle?

**Prayer Prompt:** Take time to pray that God would help each person in the group trust Christ more fully, respond in obedience where He is prompting, and support one another with grace as we grow together.
