Lighting the Way Forward — Volunteers Needed!

Starting around Nov 3, daytime volunteers (4-hour shifts) are needed to help remove old fluorescent bulbs, clean fixtures/lens covers, and move furniture so electricians can install 12-watt LED bulbs. This project will run for several months. Switching from 38-watt fluorescents to LEDs will save an estimated 82%—up to \$40,000/year—and keep the project within our \$10,000 budget. Interested?
