# "What is Man?"

### **Hebrews 2:5-9**

<sup>5</sup>It is not to angels that he has subjected the world to come, about which we are speaking. <sup>6</sup>But there is a place where someone has testified:

"What is man that you are mindful of

him,

the son of man that you care for

him?

<sup>7</sup>You made him a little lower than the

angels;

you crowned him with glory and

honor

<sup>8</sup>and put everything under his feet."

In putting everything under him, God left nothing that is not subject to him. Yet at present we do not see everything subject to him. <sup>9</sup>But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels, now crowned with glory and honor because he suffered death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone.

  - a. What does "you crowned him with glory and honor and put everything under his feet" say about our dignity?
- 3. Verse 8 also says, "Yet at present we do not see everything subject to him." What does it mean? How is human brokenness and lack of authority seen in the present world?
- 4. Why is it important that "we see Jesus" (vs.9)? What does it mean that he was made a little lower than the angels? What did His incarnation accomplish? How does his death and resurrection impact those who identify with him?
