"The Word of God"

*** Hebrews 4:12-13**

¹²For the word of God is living and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to diving soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart. ¹³Nothing in all creation is hidden from God's sight. Everything is uncovered and laid bare before the eyes of him to whom we must give account. (NIV)

¹²For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and of spirit, of joints and of marrow, and discerning the thoughts and intentions of the heart. ¹³And no creature is hidden from his sight, but all are naked and exposed to the eyes of him to whom we must give account. (ESV)

- In verse 13, what does it mean that "nothing in all creation is hidden from God's sight"?
- 2. How does knowing that "everything is uncovered and laid bare" before God motivate you in your relationship with God and others?
