"Growing Up"

Hebrews 5:11-6:3

¹¹We have much to say about this, but it is hard to explain because you are slow to learn. ¹²In fact, though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you the elementary truths of God's word all over again. You need milk, not solid food! ¹³Anyone who lives on milk, being still an infant, is not acquainted with the teaching about righteousness. ¹⁴But solid food is for the mature, who by constant use have trained themselves to distinguish good from evil.

¹Therefore let us leave the elementary teachings about Christ and go on to maturity, not laying again the foundation of repentance from acts that lead to death, and of faith in God, ²instruction about baptisms, the laying on of hands, the resurrection of the dead, and eternal judgment. ³And God permitting, we will do so.

Verses 6:1-2

- 1. In 6:1–2, these six elementary truths are listed. Why do you think these are named?
- a) "Repentance from dead works and of faith toward God."
- b) "Instruction about Baptisms (washings) and laying on of hands/"
- c) "The resurrection of the dead and eternal judgment."
- What does the phrase "leave the elementary teachings and go on to maturity" mean?
