Day 2

READ 1 Samuel 15:24

Saul told Samuel he was afraid of the people, so he did what they wanted instead of obeying God. That's called the fear of man — when we care more about what people think than what God says and it leads us to sin.

READ Proverbs 29:25

What happens when we fear people instead of trusting God?
